Good evening, and Merry Christmas.

Our second scripture reading tonight is taken from the book of Isaiah, chapter 9, verses 2 to 6. Hear these words of the Lord. The people walking in darkness have seen a great light.

On those living in the land of deep darkness, a light has dawned. You have enlarged the nations and increased their joy. They rejoice before you as people rejoice at the harvest, as warriors rejoice when dividing the plunder.

[26:00] For as in the day of Midian's defeat, you have shattered the yoke that burdens them, the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor. Every warrior's boot used in battle and every garment rolled in blood will be destined for burning, will be fuel for the fire.

For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God. I'll be home for Christmas. You can count on me.

Please have snow and mistletoe and presents on the tree. Christmas Eve will find me. Where the love light be.

I'll be home for Christmas. If only in my dreams. And you guys can dream about that white Christmas because it ain't happening.

[27:15] I'm good with that. I'm good with that. Have you ever listened to those songs? I watched a couple of old movies this week. And you ever feel like, man, I wish I was born in that time.

I wish I lived in those simple kind of times when everything seemed to be so, so easy. Or at least they seemed to be about family and values and friendships that lasted a lifetime.

And work that made a difference. And a nation that seemed to be on the right track. And the church. The church was everywhere. And was full every week.

Sometimes I feel like a person born in the wrong time. This passage from Isaiah written so many years ago is written just before the collapse of the nation of Israel.

And in the chapter right before here, it describes for us what it felt like. Consult God's instruction and the testimony of warning. If anyone does not speak according to this word, they have no light of dawn.

[28:28] Distressed and hungry, they'll roam through the land. When they are famished, they'll become enraged. And looking upward will curse their king and their God. The people.

They will look toward the earth and see only distress and darkness and fearful gloom. And they'll be thrust into utter darkness. Darkness.

There's a darkness. In some ways it feels like it's come across our land. A feeling like things just aren't right. It's a time of absolute marvels.

Technology that's beyond our wildest imagination. There are things that we can do today we wouldn't even have thought possible when we were young.

I just got a new vehicle. And if I drive five miles over the speed limit, it tells me the speed limit is 45 miles an hour. People riding with me think it's hilarious.

[ 29:27 ] I think it's wonderful. I mean, you can program where you want to go. And it tells you when to turn and what to do. I understand some of you have cars that park themselves. I'm still not ready for that.

But we have wealth beyond imagination. Comfort we never would have considered normative. We live in houses twice the size of what we grew up in.

And yet there's this feeling of distress and anxiety and fear. Like in Israel when they were carried into Babylon or Egypt when the people of Israel had gone down in blessing and found themselves in slavery.

In those days, the great empire seemed to be all about technology and prosperity and power. It talks about the increase of joy.

They will rejoice before you as people rejoice at a harvest. Do we have an increase of joy? I don't mean an increase of entertainment.

[ 30 : 42 ] A soul-filling joy that sustains us every day. How many of you have seen Star Wars? Come on, fess up. They tell me you have to actually buy tickets in advance.

That's not happening. I'll get it when it comes out in the cheap seats. It'll be the same movie. They said that the difference about this Star Wars movie is that they've gone back to the old philosophy of movies where instead of counting just on special effects, they're actually going to have a story.

Wow! A story! They said movies today don't have stories. They're just special effect after special effect. Imposter films.

And we have an imposter joy. Something that makes us feel happy or good for a little while and then somehow leaves us almost feeling as low as when we began.

Darkness. Darkness. As in when the people went into Egypt and blessed and ended up slaves. In fact, it says that in that Exodus passage, they had, it seems to have forgotten God.

[31:53] Forgot there was a God. Have you noticed it's getting darker? My gosh, it was dark when church started tonight.

That is so depressing. I don't know about you. It creeps up on you. You feel like, okay, it can't be getting this dark so fast. And then all of a sudden, it's dark all day long.

Well, not all day long, but it feels like it's all day long. The life we knew seems to be disappearing into darkness.

The churches we knew seem to be fading away. Have you heard that they seem to be closing? We're a very fortunate church, and I've told you that before. There are many churches would love to have the young people and the activities and programs and such that we have.

But if you look around at the church in general, they're turning the buildings into condominiums and apartments and theaters. Some are just rotting away because nobody wants them anymore.

[33:06] Magnificent houses of worship turning into dust slowly, little by little. The deep darkness starts to cover the ground.

No Jesus. No church. No God. No hope. 1 Corinthians chapter 15 says, If only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied.

It was a time of great technological advancement. In communication, transportation, people of different cultures mixing together everywhere. Wealth.

And the people lived in the most powerful nation on the face of the earth. And yet there was an uncertainty, a feeling like things weren't right. And a child was born in a stable.

A child was born in the midst of the empire, Rome. And changed the world. The angel said, don't be afraid.

[34:16] I bring you good news. For to you this day, a child is born. Talks in the fourth verse of this about shattering the oppression.

And taking the yoke off our shoulders. Sometimes it feels like the day-to-day drudgery and worry and anxiety is like a slavery that holds us.

Like in the times of Egypt. And only God can set us free. The truth is there are people out to get you.

That's not just paranoia. Now some of you are a little weirded out paranoia. Okay? But truthfully, there are people out to get you.

God has a different plan. Did you know that God affects the destiny of nations? It says that God enlarged the nation.

[ 35 : 25 ] Just like he decided what would happen with Babylon in the ancient days. He decided what would happen with Egypt. He decided what would happen with the nation of Israel. Don't you think that the God who controlled the nations then still controls the nations now?

We used to say God bless America. And God did. We are the largest Christian nation in the world. We still are. And the most powerful nation in the world.

And we still are. But have you noticed that where Christianity used to be strong, like Europe, it's no longer there.

But the nations are also weak. Have you noticed that as we turn away from our God, it seems as if our country slips a little more. And do you know where in the world Christianity is growing the fastest?

You'd be surprised. Places like Russia. The largest Christian nation in the world, they assume, within about 10 or 15 years will be China.

[ 36:29 ] Africa. Africa. Africa. And where you see nations on the ascendancy. Do you think that there's no correlation between a people who turn from God and a people that turn to God and who God blesses?

Africa. It was a callous time. A government that had no moral compass. Concerned about power.

About security. Peace. Had soldiers stationed in far off lands. Their prisons were full. There was the semblance of religion everywhere but faith nowhere.

And money and power were the gods of the day. And into that setting, a little child was born in a stable. Does it sound familiar?

And the angel says today, a Savior is born to you. To you. God is born into our world and a light has dawned.

[ 37:40 ] The people living in darkness have seen a great light. Now the question is, will the people live to that light?

John speaks of the light and he says this. This is the verdict. Light came into the world. But people loved the darkness instead of the light because their deeds were evil. Everyone who does evil hates the light.

Will not come into the light for fear their deeds will be exposed. But whoever lives by the truth comes into the light so that it might be seen plainly that what they have done has been done in the sight of God.

To you, a child is born. To you, a son is given. Is he alive? Is he born into your world, into your life?

Does he really hold that centerpiece? Do we live for the kingdom of God? Or do we live for America? Or do we live for our jobs? Or do we live for our money?

[38:39] Or do we live for our entertainment? And do we watch as our world changes slowly? It goes away.

There's a new movie out. I don't know much about it. It's called Concussion. I saw this little piece of movie from it. And I got to tell you, it shocked me.

What do they want? The NFL wants you to say you made it all up. I made it out. They're accusing you of fraud. If you retract, you'll be fine.

This all goes away. Why are they doing this? They're terrified of you. Bennett Amalu is going to war with a corporation that has 20 million people on a weekly basis craving their product.

The same way they crave food. The NFL owns a day of the week. The same day the church used to own. Now it's theirs.

[39:44] They're very big. The same day of the week, the church. And now it belongs to the NFL.

Not quite. We haven't given it to them yet. They don't play their games at 9.30 in the morning and go head-to-head with us unless it's in London. And we beat them on that one.

But they got the junior leagues. They got the farm teams coming up. How many of you have to make a choice if your children are going to be in sports that they have to miss church?

Because that's the only time that they'll let them play is on Sunday morning. They're teaching the kids early on. They're getting the next group coming up. Put Sunday aside for someone else.

I'm not blaming the NFL. They're a business. They're just going for what they can get. The question is, is what are we doing?

[40:45] What are we doing? As we watch the world we live in slowly fade away, the people living in darkness have seen a great light.

It's dawned on us. It's here. God gives us a life worth living filled with joy, with peace, with purpose, with hope, with light. And I want to suggest to you that it's time that we take it back.

Amen? It's time that we stop living and letting the darkness decide what we'll be, and we start living as the children of the light, the children of God, with the power, with the wonder, with the strength of God.

I have to tell you, somebody messed it all up. Unfortunately, it's probably people like me and my generation.

You can blame us. It's got to be our fault because there's nobody else to blame. Our parents who lived in the golden age of Christianity, the golden age of America somehow didn't set things up right.

[41:59] And somehow we didn't live it out right. And somehow we're not living it out right still to this day. But I believe that God is raising up a different generation.

I believe God has raised up a different generation that will take back what belongs to God. The Bible actually talks about it as being like a battle.

We're afraid to say that because we're people of peace, but we're battling the darkness. This isn't about taking on even other people, just the forces of evil that want to destroy our life.

Are we committed? Are we committed? Are we committed like a soldier on a battlefield? Imagine if you were in a war, and there's a million soldiers fighting in that war.

Wouldn't you be tempted to say, it doesn't matter what I do. It won't make any difference what I give. I could run away, and it won't make any difference. There'll still be 999,999 more people to fight the war.

[43:05] What I do doesn't matter at all. Imagine if all the soldiers did the same thing. We lose the

Because the problem is, is we keep saying, this isn't my fight. Pastor, we're behind you. Yeah, go do it. Send somebody.

We'll applaud you. But I've got other things to do. It's interesting in this passage, it mentions Midian.

And I've studied this passage a lot of times, and never really thought much about that. You know what Midian is? Midian is the country, when the Israelites went to war, where Gideon came with something like 30,000, 40,000 soldiers.

And God said, dude, you have too many. This isn't going to look like a miracle if you show up with 30,000, 40,000 soldiers and win the war. And so he starts winnowing it down until he's got 300 soldiers to go up against like 50,000 people.

[44:10] And they won. I've got to be honest with you. We don't need everybody. We just need people that are serious, who believe in God, who believe what God can do.

A God that's amazing. I read just this week about the places where Christianity is growing. And they said, do you know why it's growing in these other places?

Because miracles are happening. And you know why miracles are happening? Because the people believe miracles are happening. We talked about miracles this whole last fall. I believe in miracles.

I've seen them. I know some of you believe in miracles. Most of us don't see miracles because we've decided to just not believe anymore. A little baby's born.

A deceptive king. A little child. How could that possibly conquer Rome? And yet it changed the whole world. The shepherds went and saw. They spread the word. They glorified God.

[45:11] Tomorrow. Tomorrow's going to be a fun day. I know it is.

You're going to get up. You're going to have some good food. You're going to have some good presents. It'll be exciting. You might even talk a little bit about the Jesus story. That would be good to do.

Remind the kids. My worry is that a lot of people then forget about God. They often do. Settle into the darkness.

Strive after something that doesn't satisfy. It only leads to depression. Or we can change. Or we can change who we are.

And live to that inner light. To guide us. To warm us. To give us hope. The true meaning of Christmas. I see about it on TV.

[46:09] And all these Christmas specials. It's not about presents. It really isn't. It isn't about frosting. It's not about parties. Or food. Or even family. Or peace.

Or love. No, that's all bad. It's just not what it's about. Unto you. A child is born. To you.

And that God can change everything about you. And about your lives. When the people went into Egypt.

It took them about three, four hundred years to forget about God. Takes a while. They forgot God. They didn't even know how to be people of God. So God sent them out into the desert.

Out into the desert where there weren't too many distractions. So that they could relearn what it meant to be to follow God. So I'm going to give you a challenge. Over the next couple of months.

[47:08] For the months of January and February. I'm going to preach to you about lessons from the desert. We're going to talk about those together. And we're going to use our desert as an illustration.

Winter. That's our desert, isn't it? I think so. And we're going to talk about what do we need to do to restore our own faith in God. To become the people of God.

So that then we can talk about after that. What are we going to do as a people to transform this entire community for Jesus Christ. Because it's time to stop being sit around people.

It's time to stop being the people who let the darkness claim the world. It's time to let the God of the universe transform our lives. God changes our life.

Our world. Our destiny. Our eternity. In the last verse we heard read from this. It says that he will be called a wonderful counselor.

[48:06] Mighty God. Everlasting Father. And a Prince of Peace. Now I got stuck on that everlasting father thing. I've told you before that I miss my father.

I miss talking to him. I miss his counsel. I miss my relationship with him. I miss the feeling that I had somebody watching my dad back. Providing for me.

But that's what God promises. A wonderful counselor. Somebody to give you the advice that is always right. If you just turn to the Holy Spirit and let God fill your heart with it.

He will guide you. And not just guide you with plain ordinary stuff. But with wonderful advice. Meaning wonder fill. Meaning miraculous. Meaning miraculous. Power filled.

Advice that can change. Darkness and pain. Loneliness. And a victory. He's a mighty God.

[49:04] Who can overcome all of these things. And even death itself. And love us forever. And he's the Prince of Peace.

Who through the power of the Holy Spirit gives us a peace which passes all understanding. As Philippians tells us in chapter 4. The peace of God will transcend all understanding.

It will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. So you don't have to be anxious. You don't have to worry. You don't have to be troubled. You don't have to really have all this stress.

God is in control of the universe. In control of the nations.

And is willing. And is willing. To be your counselor. Your father. Your protector. Your Prince of Peace.

[50:04] And by the way. I was thinking about it the other day. If God is the King. And God is our Heavenly Father. That makes us a bunch of Prince and Princesses. Right? Isn't that cool?

Prince time here man. Just saying. We are Prince and Princesses for God. We are meant to go and lead the world. And change the world.
