Good morning. It's good to see you this morning, and I wish for you the peace of Christ be with you. It is a morning in this area of Buffalo when many people have some very heavy hearts.

And we decided, or I decided, to light the candles that we had for Mother's Day, rather than take them down, to light them as a sign, a beacon, that the only peace we have in Christ is the peace of knowing, of the light in the world that cannot be extinguished no matter what happens.

And so we are so very grateful for the healing and hopeful presence of Christ in the face of death and destruction and fear.

[ 2 : 3 6 ]     We come on this beautiful morning to celebrate life and baptism. We come on this beautiful morning to celebrate the presence of Christ among us.

And so we will begin our worship. One announcement that I have is that you may or may not know that the church has what's called a parsonage.

The parsonage is the house next door on that side. And the parsonage is a home, typically on church property, but not always for one of the pastors to live in.

And our parsonage fund was used up in 2020 when it was renovated. And now it's been used up again because we've had appliances who have just, poof, done what appliances do.

[ 28 : 32 ] That we join our hearts with the people and the churches in Buffalo. And we take a moment of silence. To remember those that were lost yesterday.

God, we live in a troubled world.

Where sometimes it feels like hate has taken over. We ask that you help us to spread your joy and your love.

We ask that you look over those who have lost loved ones this week. And whose hearts are heavy and full of sorrow.

May you be the comforter. May you help us offer them words of assurance. And love and caring.

[ 29 : 35 ] In our troubled world, God. We ask that you help us be that shining light to those who need it.

No matter what they're struggling with at this time. Those that are fighting in Ukraine and our military. We ask that you watch out for each one of them.

And oh God, we have so many things on our hearts. Whether it's our children or the fear that they're facing. Or the families of the people or in the neighborhood yesterday.

May you offer comfort because you are our comforter. Help us bring your love and your light into this world.

In your name we pray. Amen. Amen. Amen. Good morning.

[ 31 : 03 ] The scripture today is from the Gospel of John. Chapter 11, verses 17 through 44. Excuse me. On his arrival, Jesus found that Lazarus had been in the tomb for four days.

Now Bethany was less than two miles from Jerusalem. And many Jews had come to Martha and Mary to comfort them in the loss of their brother. When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went out to meet him.

But Mary stayed home. Lord, Martha said to Jesus, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But I know that even now, God will give you whatever you ask.

Jesus said to her, your brother will rise again. Martha answered, I know he will rise again in the resurrection on the last day. Jesus said to her, I am the resurrection and the life.

The one who believes in me will live even though they die. And whoever lives by believing in me will never die. Do you believe this? Yes, Lord, she replied.

[ 32 : 10 ] I believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, who has come into this world. After she had said this, she went back and called her sister Mary aside.

The teacher is here, she said, and is asking for you. When Mary heard this, she got up quickly and went to him. Now Jesus had not yet entered the village, but was still at the place where Martha had met him.

When the Jews who had been with Mary in the house comforting her noticed how quickly she got up and went out, they followed her, supposing she was going to the tomb to mourn there.

When Mary reached the place where Jesus was and saw him, she fell at his feet and said, Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died.

When Jesus saw her weeping and the Jews who had come along with her also weeping, he was deeply moved in spirit and troubled. Where have you laid him, he asked.

[ 33 : 10 ] Come and see, Lord, they replied. Jesus wept. Then the Jews said, see how he loved him. But some of them said, could he not who opened the eyes of a blind man have kept this man from dying?

Jesus once more, deeply moved, came to the tomb. It was a cave with a stone laid across the entrance. Take away the stone, he said. But Lord, said Martha, the sister of the dead man, by this time there is a bad odor, and he has been there for four days.

Then Jesus said, did I not tell you that if you believe you will see the glory of God? So they took away the stone. Then Jesus looked up and said, Father, I thank you that you have heard me.

I knew that you always hear me, but I said this for the benefit of the people standing here, that they may believe that you sent me. When he had said this, Jesus called in a loud voice, Lazarus, come out.

The dead man came out, his hands and feet wrapped with strips of linen and a cloth around his face. Jesus said to them, take off the grave clothes and let him go.

[ 34 : 25 ] This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God. Would you join me for a moment of prayer?

Loving and gracious God, we are grateful for this morning. Grateful that we are able to find joy in the midst of so many other emotions.

And as we come this day, Lord, we thank you for your presence. Open our hearts, Lord. Open our hearts to what you are doing. Plant that seed in us that will grow and bear fruit for the honor and the glory of your name.

Through Jesus Christ, our Lord, we pray. Amen. So I was having a conversation with my mom once. And she said something that almost insulted me.

And she accused me of being a morning person. Now, if anybody knows what I'm like in the morning, it would have been her.

[ 35 : 50 ] And of course, my wife would testify to what I'm like in the morning, although she usually sleeps later than me. Now, this thing about the conversation I was having with my mom comes to the fact that I think there's a very real difference between waking up early and being a morning person.

Now, I've always had to wake up early because that was just the nature of my schedule. I don't think that makes me a morning person. Because I have an Aunt Yvonne.

Now, Aunt Yvonne is a morning person. She's one of those people who rolls out of bed and her energy is good. She's smiling. She's humming. She's just ready to attack the day.

To me, that's what it means to be a morning person. That ain't me. It takes me a little while to get going in the morning. Usually, and it takes a lot of caffeinated help, too, before I feel I'm present in the day.

I don't know about you, how many of you see yourselves as morning people? Yeah, you wake up well, right? You wake up good.

[ 37 : 01 ] I don't know what mystery of life God has working in you, but more power, too. This thing about waking up well is, as I said, it's kind of a mystery to me.

But when you wake up, no matter whether you wake up with good energy or whether it takes you a little bit to get going, everybody has that period, whether it's just a couple of seconds or whatever it is, where you've got to sort of reorient yourself, right?

You just come out of that place of deep slumber and you're not exactly sure where you are yet, and you kind of wake up and you realize it's a new day and it's time to get started.

And like I said, for some, that is a process. For others, it takes a while. I want you to think about this waking up moment in the context of the story we read today.

Because waking up, as I said, is difficult sometimes. But can you imagine waking up like Lazarus?

[ 38 : 17 ] Lazarus's perspective on this is one that I find pretty interesting. We don't really try and talk, we don't really talk much about Lazarus's point of view. There's reasons for that.

One, because Lazarus doesn't actually have a voice in the story. We talk a lot about Lazarus, but Lazarus doesn't talk. The other piece is that the point of the story is about what God is doing.

And so we don't really talk so much about what did Lazarus think or feel, etc. But if you think it's hard to get out of bed in the morning, I want you to consider what it would have been like to see a strange light and not be sure where that light was coming from.

To wake up and be surrounded by a smell. A smell you probably would recognize, but a smell you don't want to be anywhere near. To be on a concrete or stone slab.

Not exactly sure where you're at. And who knows what his last memory would have been. He was probably in his bed.

[ 39 : 41 ] He was probably surrounded by those he loved. And he was probably hanging on to hope that Jesus might come.

But then, the illness took over. And from his point of view, the lights went out.

I want you to think about that moment. That Lazarus moment, we'll call it today. And I want you to hang on to that for a minute.

As we consider this idea of our sermon series called Emerge. As we talk about waking up. Now, to understand this story, we've got to spend a little moment.

And to understand this moment, we've got to walk through the story a little bit. Now, for those of us who've been in the church for a while, this is a pretty familiar story. We've probably heard it multiple times.

[ 40 : 46 ] We've probably learned it in Sunday school. And it's a big deal. This story is a huge deal. Because nobody can do what Jesus can do. And to really unpack the story a bit, remember we enter into verse 17.

And to appreciate how verse 17 starts, you've got to know a little bit about what happens before this. Jesus is teaching somewhere else.

And word reaches him that Lazarus is ill. Now, John, the gospel writer, tells us that Jesus had a special friendship with Lazarus, Mary, and Martha.

That he had love for them. Jesus loves us all, of course. But John makes a point of saying there was something special about their friendship. And after Jesus gets this news, Jesus says something, then Jesus does something that makes people a little weird.

He says, first, this illness has not come for death. It has come so that God will be glorified in it. Which the disciples are kind of like, cool, we've seen that before.

[ 42 : 02 ] Because Jesus has healed lots of people. But then, Jesus stays where he is for two days. Which is kind of, what?

Because if you would think that we're going to go and help our friend, everybody starts grabbing their stuff. But Jesus stays where he is another two days.

And that's why, when we come to this point of entry, into where we read today. When Jesus arrived, he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days. That's an important point.

Because during the time period, Jewish people believed that the spirit of a body hung around for a couple of days before it went off to the next level.

And so, for Jesus to get there and find that Lazarus had been entombed for four days, one of the things that John is trying to tell us is that by every measure that everybody at the time understood, Lazarus was dead.

[ 43 : 12 ] There were really no questions about it. It wasn't some sort of medical mistake and he might wake up on his own. That there was no chance that something might just kind of fix itself.

He was dead. And everybody understood him to be dead. So Jesus arrives. And he has this conversation with Martha.

And this conversation with the sisters is one that we would probably have too. I would be in this place as well.

Especially if you know Jesus. And you have counted on him. And you know that he does these miraculous things.

That God is at work in him. You get that. You understand that. And you send for help. And so you presume, like Martha, that if he didn't get here, there must have been a reason.

[ 44 : 16 ] But you still kind of have these feelings. Which is why she greets him with that sentence. Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died.

It's understandable. But here's the thing. What we see in this conversation is very telling.

Because as much as they love Jesus. And as much as they have faith in Jesus. They still don't get Jesus.

They still don't really get Jesus. And that is a really important point that we need to hang on to today.

So let's hear this dialogue real quick. And I want you to pay attention to two things that happen in it. So we're starting at verse 21. Martha said to Jesus, Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died.

[ 45 : 15 ] Even now I know that whatever you ask God, God will give you. Jesus told her, your brother will rise again. Martha replied, I know that he will rise in the resurrection at the last day.

Jesus said to her, I am the resurrection and the light. Whoever believes in me will live even though they die. Everyone who lives and believes in me will never die.

Do you believe this? She replied, yes, Lord. I believe that you are the Christ. God's son who is coming into the world. After this, she went and spoke privately to her sister, Mary.

The teacher is here and he is calling for you. When Mary heard this, she got up quickly and went to Jesus. He hadn't entered the village. He was still at the place where Martha had met him.

When the Jews who were comforting Mary in the house saw her get up quickly and leave, they followed her. They assumed she was going to mourn at the tomb.

[ 46 : 19 ] When Mary arrived where Jesus was and saw him, she fell at his feet and said, Lord, if you had been here, my brother wouldn't have died. Here's what I want you to see in this.

When he's having this conversation with Martha, and Jesus talks about your brother will rise again. Martha is looking forward to judgment day.

She's looking forward to the time when all will be resurrected. She's believing in her faith. She says there is a time coming when all will rise.

But here's what Jesus wants us to hear. Here's what Jesus wants her to hear. Because his response to her is, I am the resurrection and the life.

Me, here, now, this flesh and blood being standing in front of you. I am the resurrection and the life. See, Martha's thinking way off somewhere, someday.

[ 47 : 39 ] And the grace, the love, the power of God is in front of her in this man right here, right now. And the question that Martha and all of us have to grapple with is when we think of who God is, when we think of who Jesus is to us, do we believe in someone who is way over there, way off somewhere else?

Or do we believe in a God who is here, now, and capable of more than we can ever imagine? Because if your God is a way over there God, if your God is a someday God, then it's really hard to get through these times when it feels like the world is winning.

Because you have a pie in the sky over there, faith. As opposed to a right here, right now, almighty God. That makes a huge difference.

And that's what Jesus is trying to communicate. I am right here, right now. Do you believe that?

Because if you lose that, then it's really hard to walk in faith in the world. We're not just talking about abracadabra magic.

[ 49 : 16 ] We're talking about the grace and the power of a living Lord. And you can see it as the dialogue unfolds.

Because Jesus becomes more troubled, is the word that we read. Because he loves them. And they love him.

But they don't understand. And as we see, Mary and Martha don't get it. He has this dialogue with the disciples before he leaves.



And they don't get it. And of course, those who don't understand, those who have come to comfort the sisters, don't get it.

And that's why we see Jesus do this. In verse 33, John tells us, When Jesus saw her crying, and the Jews who had come with her crying also, he was deeply disturbed and troubled.

[ 50 : 21 ] Different translations will say he groaned in his spirit. But that groan, if you look at the word, goes deeper than just he's sad.

Sometimes people read the story, and they think he's grieving Lazarus. That's not really where Jesus' head is at. What Jesus is saying, he's looking at us.

He's looking at these people, even those who love him, and they still don't understand. Even after all he's done. Even after all he said.

That people still don't quite get what he's doing. What he's doing. And who he is. He goes with the sisters to the tomb.

And we get to that verse that many of us know, where it says, Jesus wept. It's a very powerful moment to think of Jesus being moved to tears.

[ 51 : 28 ] We know that he was moved to tears at the death of his cousin. And we see him move to tears here again. Some of you are aware that one of the ministries of our church is a ministry called Grief Share.

It's a program, a 13-week curriculum we do for those who have lost someone to help them as they take their walk through that hard, hard time. I've facilitated that program myself, but right now Leslie and Sue lead that for us.

There's a session in Grief Share that talks about believing in the resurrection. And in that session, one of the participants says the following.

He points to this story and talks about what it means not only to believe in resurrection, but he talks about the idea of Jesus wept.

And he says something very powerful. He says, it's hard to put into words what it means to have a Savior who will weep with me.

[ 52 : 43 ] I want you to sit with that for a minute. What it means to have a Savior that will cry with me.

Jesus not only cries with us, Jesus Christ for us because he understands that there's this thing about us that can't quite grasp that everything is possible with God.

We say it. And our hearts go there. But we are still trapped in our earthly and human minds. That we go, science works this way.

And so, when you present this problem, then there has to be an answer that fits in what I understand. But when God says, I can do more than you understand, we can't quite process it.

And so, when Jesus cries, when Jesus weeps, he understands our broken hearts and he understands how we are trapped.

[ 53 : 54 ] but then, he shows us who he is. Because even though there are clearly doubters around, could not the one who opened the eyes of the blind man kept this man from dying?

There are doubters in the space. And so, he shows us who he is. This is where I'd like us to go back to that Lazarus moment.

Because as I said, waking up is hard. But when you move to this place where you can wake up, and not only wake up from a good night's sleep, but wake up from a place of death, things are really changing.

Because some of us don't even capture how we might be caught in a place of death.  
Because we may have bought into some thinking that has us caught in a place of death.

We may be limited in our bodies in a way that have us ready to give up. And we may have bought into some ideas that have us thinking in a place of death.

[ 55 : 30 ] Our hearts may be twisted into something that says that the world works a particular way. And in a time like today, in a time where we know that there is hate that is moving and active in the world and is willing to work its will and take human life.

We have known this throughout human history, but to have it hit this close to home should scare and alarm and motivate all of us on a different level. but we could give up and stay in a place of death.

We could be bound and we could surrender and stay there. But that is not what it means to be believers in a God of resurrection.

because death doesn't have the final word. And so if you may be in a place today where some of that thinking has you trapped in a place of death, hear this moment because you may be bound.

You may be surrounded by that smell you may be in that place not sure what's happening or what's going on around you, but there is a light.

[ 57 : 04 ] The light comes into that place. The light comes into that room. In other words, Jesus says take the stone away. And the light is present.

And then not only do you see the light light, but Jesus calls you by name. This is not an accident.

This is not random. Jesus calls you by name. Lazarus, come forth. He calls you by name. He knows who you are. He knows where you are. and he does not want you to stay there. Lazarus, come forth.

Will you wake up? Will you respond when he calls? Because when Lazarus goes out, Jesus is clear.
