That anything that is in pain, any darkness within them, anything that's broken, that you will bind it up and make it well. We pray that they'll experience your presence in the midst of any suffering, that they'll see you in it and be drawn closer to you through it.

We pray for those who are in the position of caregiving, that you'll lift them up and give them your encouragement. We pray for those who are mourning, those with heavy hearts, that you will give them your comfort and your peace.

We pray for our families, Lord, that you will give us your protection, your guidance, your love. Strengthen our families, Lord.

Help us to walk in the right direction. Help us to always be mindful of you and to put you at the center of our family. Lord, we pray for our church, that you'll set us on the right path, that we'll make decisions, that we'll glorify you, that we'll become disciples more and more closely aligned with what you would have us to be.

[9:46] We pray that we'll have a growth in our faith, that we'll proclaim your name. Lord, we pray for our community and for our nation, that we'll see a transformation happen, that we will be a part of it.

Help us to be a blessing in this world. Lord, we pray for those who are struggling in their hearts, in their minds, that they don't know who to turn to, that they don't know who you are.

Lord, we pray that you will soften hearts, open minds, and surround them with a community of people who will proclaim your name, who will treat them with love and respect.

Lord, we pray for hearts to be changed, lives to be transformed, and we're placing the people we love in your hands. We pray that you'll give us your strength and your trust to continue on, knowing that you are there and you are good.

Lord, we pray for it's in Jesus' name we pray. Amen. Now let's hear from the word of the Lord. Good morning.

[11:23] Today's scripture is from Acts 15, verses 36 through 41. Sometime later, Paul said to Barnabas, Let's go back and visit the believers in all the towns where we preached the word of the Lord and see how they were doing.

Barnabas wanted to take John, also called Mark, with them, but Paul did not think it wise to take him, because he had deserted them in Pamphylia and had not continued with them in the work.

They had such a sharp disagreement that they parted company. Barnabas took Mark and sailed for Cyprus, but Paul chose Silas and left. Commended by the believers to the grace of the Lord, he went through Syria, Cilicia, strengthening the churches.

This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God. Thank you, Carol. This morning, we're continuing our sermon series on finding the great victory with God.

In the book of Corinthians, it says to us, Everyone who competes in the games goes into strict training. They do it to get a crown that will not last, but we do it to get a crown that will last forever.

[12:37] We love to have the Buffalo Bills win the Super Bowl, but it's nothing like winning the Super Bowl of life, the crown of glory that God gives to us. This morning, I want to talk to you about something that comes from Proverbs chapter 27, where it says that, Who are the people in your life that have made the difference, that have been, if you will, mentors to you?

For some people, it's parents or friends or a boss or maybe a teacher or a co-worker, maybe even a pastor or grandparents to be your spouse.

I want to talk to you first about number 12. Anybody know who number 12 is on the Buffalo Bills? Daryl LaMonica. You didn't know that?

Daryl LaMonica. Absolutely. And Daryl LaMonica got a nickname that he was the Mad Bomber because he was throwing bombs all the time at that time for the Oakland Raiders.

But he learned that from number 15. Does anybody know who number 15 was? Jack Kemp. Yes. Jack Kemp. Now, I watched Jack Kemp play football in the old rock pile.

[13:56] And he would fade back. And he would fade back. And he would even sometimes run around back there. And he would go back about 35 yards and he'd throw a bomb 40 yards to make a three-yard gain.

Never saw anything like Jack Kemp. Forget about this. Get rid of the ball in three seconds. He's never going to let that ball go. He's going to throw it 60 yards down the field.

Even if he's going to lose two yards. Daryl LaMonica, the Mad Bomber, learned how to play football from Jack Kemp. It's interesting how we pick up things from each other.

People make us who we are. In this passage, we have Barnabas who takes John with him on a missionary journey. John was his cousin.

But John, more than anything, was a young, impressionable man. Probably no more than a teenager who needed somebody to look after him. Somebody to be a mentor. Who do we mentor?

[15:01] And who mentors? Us. Proverbs 27 says that iron sharpens iron just like a person sharpens another person.

Paul even said in 1 Corinthians chapter 4, which I always thought was kind of a little strange. Just look at me, man. If you want to know what to be, how comfortable would you be saying to other people, you want an example to follow for God?

Look at me. Wow. Are we an example? Are we the kind of person that others look to for teaching, for nurturing, to help them to be the best?

This is a large ministry. I have no idea how many people we really have. Maybe 2,000. Maybe more people. As a pastor of the church, I try to mentor some folks.

But mentoring is something that requires such close attention that there's no way that I could personally possibly mentor everyone in this congregation. In fact, very few in the end.

[16:13] But you can. Each one reaches one. Each one teaches one. Last Friday night, we had a fish fry.

We had a couple guys there. One was brand new and cooking the fish. And one was new to the position he was working in. The other guys didn't just throw him in and say, do it.

They showed him how to do it. They worked with him. They nurtured and helped him. On the fellowship hall, I saw the same thing happening. We had people come in. They're very smart people.

They know how to do life. But they didn't know what the system is. They need somebody to guide them along the way. And if we can do that in fish fries, we certainly should be able to do that in every aspect of the church's life.

Mentoring is what makes us a success. Mentoring isn't all about success. We also teach people how to deal with failure. I want to show you probably what many of us would consider the most epic failure in football history.

[17:19] Second down and five. Here's Thurman Thomas swinging to the outside. Has the first down. Thurman Thomas takes it to the 30. Well, they are in Norwood field goal range.

Collins makes the stop. The Bills are going to have to ground the ball and stop the clock. At the 29-yard line. Kelly throws it into the ground. Eight seconds. It'd be 47 yards.

Come right here. And they have to send them in here. They can't take a chance to run another play. Norwood is right on the tip of the field range. Well, the Giants saw what it's like to lift it from the other end.

Last week, it's Barnes. This week, it's Norwood against them. Some of them refusing to look. In the brain, Barnes was good.

Now, Norwood tries to catch his longest ever on ground. 47 yards. Eight seconds left. Adam Winger will snap it.

[18:37] No, no. Wide line. Wide. Right. I know what you're saying. Did you really have to show us that whole thing? Did you have to put us through the agony of such a defeat?

The only Super Bowl lost by one point. Wide right. It's hard when you fail.

In this passage, it says that John deserted them in Pamphylia. He didn't continue in the work.

He left. He ditched them. The thing was getting hard. It was getting difficult. There were challenges. There were even threats to their lives. And John said, I'm just not up for this.

And he sailed back home. He was a failure. He let Paul down. And Paul let him know it. Like I said, he's probably no more than a teenager.

You know, I've got to tell you, if you're a teenager, you're at the toughest point in your life. Amen? Most of your parents don't ever want to be teenagers again. It's not easy to be a teenager.

Your body's changing. Your mind's changing. Your soul's changing. You relationships are changing. You could look to your parents, but they don't know anything. So what do you do?

Where do you go? How do you survive? You look for somebody, somewhere, to take you and guide you through this whole thing.

We need that. We all need that somewhere. We have some young people right now going through confirmation. It's not a big class. Probably about a dozen young people.

And Pastor Sherry's going to challenge them to find somebody to be their mentor. Imagine out of a couple thousand people, they may pick you. They're saying, out of all the people I know, you're the one that I think could help guide me closer to God.

[ 20:45 ] Are we up to it? Are we able to be a mentor to somebody, especially people who are at a formulative point in life like John was, where they're trying to figure everything out, and they're looking.

And they're saying, I think they might know. What do we do with them? See, failing is a part of life. We all know that. It's difficult.

And it's true even in a faith life. Sometimes we slip up. You can look around right now and see all the friends that aren't here because it's a beautiful Sunday.

So, you know. Pastor Gene was praying for sun this weekend because we had a race yesterday. I was praying for rain. Lord, send us nasty weather on a weekend just once.

Thank you, fair weather Christians, for being here with us. But people will say to me, well, why don't you give them a call, Pastor? Well, why don't you give them a call?

[21:48] There's more of you than me. They might actually appreciate it more from a friend saying, hey, missed you at church. Just want to make sure everything's okay.

We need each one to reach one. Because that's how life works. We all need someone to be there for us when we fail.

Barnabas is called the son of encouragement. That's what his name means. The son of encouragement. And he decided he wanted to give John another chance.

Paul, let's just give the boy another opportunity. Let him try it one more time. When Scott Norwood missed that kick, he had to go into the locker room.

Imagine that feeling. And he's sitting down in the locker room on a bench, and Marv Levy came over and said, you know, son, you didn't lose the game. It takes a whole team to lose a game.

[ 22:49 ] Darryl Talley came up. Anybody remember Darryl? Put his arm around Scott, and he said, you remember that tackle I missed in the third quarter? It wasn't you.

You shouldn't even have been out there kicking that ball. If I would have made that tackle, Andre Reid came up and said, didn't you see the catches I missed? Dude, it's not you. It's all of us.

Somewhere when we're broken, somewhere where we're feeling like our entire life is a failure, or we've messed up in some huge way. What we really need is somebody to turn around and say, hey, you still have a future.

You still have a life. See, the problem is we can get so caught up in the task that we forget the person in it. Sometimes we have to remember that the person is more important than the task.

Now, sometimes it's not that way. Paul had an idea. He was going to go back to the other churches that he had visited and see how they're doing so he could encourage them. These are the same churches that saw Mark fail.

[23:52] Does he really want to take along the guy that they saw as a failure? And what if he lets him down again? I mean, think about it.

You know, in this case, there's some situations where it's life and death. And if John's not going to be up to the task, maybe he's not the right guy. I've got to tell you the truth. On the battlefield, it's not time for second chances.

We need people to be there the first time. So sometimes maybe we need to make those decisions, and we need to recognize that. Sometimes we have to make decisions that aren't easy.

Scott Norwood, rather, played for the Buffalo Bills for one more season, but the Buffalo Bills decided to draft a kicker and brought in Steve Christie. Right?

You remember him? Scored more points than anybody else in Bill's history. And Scott kind of got retired. Sometimes we have to make a decision, and Paul went with Silas.

[24:56] And maybe Paul made the right decision. We really don't know. We weren't there. We weren't present to understand what happened. But even if he made the right decision, I'm going to suggest you do. Maybe he did it in the wrong way.

I know it's not fair to criticize people from long ago who can't defend themselves, but I expect that when I get the glory, Paul will be working me over a little bit. Sometimes we have to learn by what people do right, and sometimes by what I don't think they do so well.

He didn't consult the Holy Spirit. It doesn't say in here that he prayed about it. It doesn't even say in here he talked to anybody except Barnabas about it. He didn't check with all the other folks to see whether or not it would be a good idea, and he got in a fight with Barnabas.

Now, you know Barnabas. Maybe you're not aware of it, but Barnabas was Paul's hero. In Acts chapter 9 and verse 27, it says that when Paul came from Damascus, Do you remember that?

He was the guy who was trying to destroy the church, and he came to Jerusalem after Damascus in front of all the apostles, and they all said, No way are we giving this guy a chance.

[26:11] Not happening. He's too dangerous. And it was Barnabas, the son of encouragement, that recommended Paul to the apostles. Give him a chance.

And now he gets in a fight with him. It's such a harsh fight that they separated and went different ways.

Sticks and stones will break my bones, but names will hurt me forever. You know, we think words don't mean anything, but they mean everything.

Forgive us our sins. As we forgive those who sin against us.

Or Ephesians, which in chapter 4 says, Don't let the sun go down on your anger. You know, the Bible really doesn't show Barnabas and Paul together much after this.

[27:12] They were tight. And now, we hardly see them at all anymore. It's hard.

I think Paul did it the wrong way. I think sometimes we need somebody who will at least give it a consideration. One of my epic failures that some of you have heard about is, I went before the United Methodist Church to be ordained, and they said no.

It's kind of a weird thing. You know, you feel called by God to be a pastor. I was actually the pastor of two churches, and I had to go back and tell them, No, they said I couldn't be ordained, but I'm still your pastor.

Now, I don't know what that means. I didn't know what it meant. Now, really, all they wanted me to do was come back the next year. But in the process of this, there's different levels of committees.

So there's a committee called the district committee that has to recommend me to go back. They were so embarrassed by my failure that they refused to let me go back the second time.

[28:18] The interesting part is the guy who chaired that committee is now one of my closest friends. Life's interesting, isn't it? So there was a man by the name of David Luba.

He was the person in charge of the whole thing, and he was serving a church in East Aurora, and he called that whole committee down to East Aurora, and he told them, Send them back. We didn't tell you to stop them.

Send them back. And I've always said, David Luba saved my career. And there's no doubt about that. I probably would have failed if not. But there was another guy by the name of Norm Parsons.

And right after I got turned down, Norm, who I only knew a little bit, really. He had been our missionary when we were little kids, but I really didn't know him very well. I'd only met him a few times.

Right after I was turned down, he sent me this book in the mail, Seasons of Life by Charles Swindoll, and says, Dear Tom, God is good and gives victory over all things.

[29:19] Hope this book will be helpful to you on your faith journey. Love in Christ, Norm Parsons. Now, you know, I didn't even know this guy, really. But he took the time to pick out a book, write an inscription, send it to me in the mail, and Dave Luba probably saved my career, but Norm Parsons saved my soul.

Because I was going into a very dark place. I read that book, and I used that book. And I became very good friends with Norm and Alice.

It's a fascinating thing, because it's important for us to have a mentor that helps us to thrive, but we also need one that helps us survive.

Amen? In Luke chapter 6, verse 37, it says to us, Do not judge, and you won't be judged. Do not condemn, and you won't be condemned.

Forgive, and you will be forgiven. Give, and it will be given to you. A measure, a good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be poured into your lap. Read this last line with me.

[30:28] For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you. If you're loving, you'll get love. If you're compassionate, you'll get compassion. If you're hateful, you'll get hate.

If you're hurtful, you'll get hurt. If you're angry, you'll get anger. If you offer peace, you'll get peace. Now, it doesn't happen all the time. But it's a guarantee that if all you do is put brokenness and anger and hurt and condemnation into this world, that's what you'll get out of it, too.

It's not an easy world, but we need to invest in people and invest in each other. John was also named Mark. You might have heard of him, Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.

Yeah, he wrote one of the Gospels later in life. He started the church in Alexandria, the first church in Africa. Peter referred to him as his son.

And Paul, in Colossians chapter 4, Paul referred to him as one of the few people that was there to comfort him in prison. In 2 Timothy chapter 4, he said, Mark is so helpful to me.

[31:42] Isn't that an amazing thing? The very person that broke him is the person that now looks to him for comfort.

A great mentor is not a hero who never fails. A great mentor is one who knows how to thrive in spite of failure. Who is the other number 12 on the Buffalo Bills?

Jim Kelly, of course. Jim Kelly, loser of four Super Bowls. Scott Norwood lost one. Come on. Jim Kelly blew it four times.

Really, this dude lost four times. Have you thought about this? This is the biggest loser quarterback in the history of the NFL. Nobody has lost the Super Bowl as many times as Jim Kelly.

Oh, that's blasphemy, isn't it? Yeah. Well, why? Because what we saw in Jim Kelly is that he was never crushed. Didn't matter if his team was down 28-0.

[ 32:44 ] He's still fighting. Didn't matter if he lost four Super Bowls. He's still playing the game. Didn't matter if he got cancer. He's still proclaiming, God will give the victory.

It's not a mentor who's really as much of a hero as we sometimes think of number 12 as it's a mentor that shows us how to get through the struggles, the pains, the difficulties.

And that's what actually makes Jim such an amazing man. not as victories, but as overcoming the losses.

I read something about reverse mentoring recently. Do you know what that is? That's when young people tell us old people how to do things. Because we are like from a whole different world.

You know, people over 60 say amen. We really don't know what's going on. We're not kidding when we say we can't make these things work.

Because we can't. We don't understand your world. We don't get how it works. We don't know what you're talking about. Half the time. We need you to help us.

Believe it or not. To understand the parts of our life we don't understand, which doesn't mean, by the way, teenagers, that your parents don't know anything because they do. But it means that sometimes we can learn from each other.

And Paul found someone in Mark who showed him how to love and forgive and accept even in the midst of pain. In 1 John chapter 2 it says to us, anyone who loves their brother and sister lives in the light.

There's nothing in them to make them stumble. What we give out is what we get back. If we find somebody to love, if we find someone to care for, if we find someone to lift up, it can change not only their lives but our own as well.

You know what Scott Norwood said to the press after he missed that kick for the Super Bowl? He said, the Lord doesn't give crosses to people who can't bear them.

[35:08] Wow. That wouldn't have been my quote. I can't say my quote in church. I'm impressed. Scott Norwood.

Holy cow. He came back to Buffalo. Do you know what happened to the champion New York Giants? You know what the city of New York did for them after that Super Bowl win?

You know what they did in terms of parades or celebrations? They did nothing! Nothing! Nothing at all! Nothing. Not even a little gathering.

Buffalo, on the other hand, had 30,000 fans waiting when the Bills came home. And all the heroes got up to the microphone. Marv Levy was there. Jim Kelly was there. You know, Bruce Smith was there.

They were all standing up at the microphone. And the crowd is going, Scott! We want Scott! Until 30,000 people are chanting, Scott Norwood!

[36:11] Scott Norwood! Scott Norwood! A failure to America. A hero in Buffalo. Do you know what he did afterwards?

He started selling real estate. Think about this. He'd hand people a card and it would say Scott Norwood. And they would, he said this, and they would look at it and they'd go, oh, you're the guy who lost the Super Bowl, right? Isn't that what you want to be known for?

For the rest of your life! You're the loser! Lost the Super Bowl, right, dude? Well, Scott Norwood has made a life for himself.

He found himself a really nice wife. They were told that they couldn't have children, but she didn't believe it and she prayed to God. And they now have three beautiful children.

He's got a good life. He has more money than I'll ever have. He's not a failure. He's a success and he shares his story with teenagers and churches all over the area he lives in.

[37:17] Mentoring them. Teaching them. Passing on. Guiding them. mentoring. Because mentoring is not just about what we teach and how we guide, but it's about putting our lives into the lives of someone else.

Just like Jesus did for us. It says in the book of John in chapter 17, May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me.

I have given them glory that you gave me that they may be one as we are one. The truth is this. God has put his faith in us.

God has put his love in us. God has invested in us so that we can invest in each other so that we can all have the victory of glory. Amen? So that everyone makes the train to glory land.

So that everyone is a success. Because it doesn't matter if you win the Super Bowl. It matters if you win the crown of life. And not just you, but everybody around you.

[38:25] My dad was one of my mentors, without a doubt. For most of our marriage in the beginning, we were really, really poor. We thought a great time going out was to get in the car and drive around the block a couple times and see something new.

The only way we went out to dinner is because my parents paid for us. You know what I'm talking about, those cheap buffalo fish fries. We'd go out for a cheap buffalo fish fry and my father would pull out his wallet and I'd say, Dad, you shouldn't be paying for me all the time.

And he'd say, Tommy, one of these days you'll be paying for me. I remembered that for years. Hundreds and hundreds of fish fries that they would take us out to over the course of those years.

Finally, he got to be about 80 and I started paying him back. Few here, few there. Half the time he wouldn't let us, but we got a few in there and then he died. Really? Seriously?

How am I ever going to pay him back? Ah, by paying it forward to somebody else. Every time I buy dinner for someone else, it's for my dad.

[39:37] It's to remind me of whose I am and someone who invested in me so I could invest in someone else. And if we, as a people of God, invest in each other, there is nothing we cannot have victory about.

Change your heart. Change our church and we'll change the world. We won't just survive this place. We won't just get a little better at what we do. We'll have the victory forever and forever and we will thrive.
