Before we even knew what sin was or that we had need of being forgiven for it, he sent Jesus so that we could be delivered from our sin.

[19:23] This is proof of God's love for us, and we can say with confidence, in the name of Jesus Christ, your sins are forgiven. In the name of Jesus Christ, your sins are forgiven.

Glory to God. Amen. Amen. Shall we hear from the word of the Lord? Today's reading is from the book of Mark, chapter 2, verses 1 through 12.

A few days later, when Jesus again entered Capernaum, the people heard that he had come home. They gathered in such large numbers that there was no room left, not even outside the door, and he preached the word to them.

Some men came, bringing to him a paralyzed man, carried by four of them. Since they could not get him to Jesus because of the crowd, they made an opening in the roof above Jesus by digging through it and then lowering the mat the man was lying on.

When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralyzed man, Son, your sins are forgiven. Now some teachers of the law who were sitting there thinking to themselves, why does this fellow talk like that?

[20:33] He's blaspheming. Who can forgive sins but God alone? Immediately, Jesus knew in his spirit that this is what they were thinking in their hearts, and he said to them, Why are you thinking these things?

Which is easier, to say to this paralyzed man, Your sins are forgiven, or to say, Get up, take your mat, and walk? But I want you to know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins.

So he said to the man, I tell you, Get up, take your mat, and go home. He got up, took his mat, and walked out in full view of them all. This amazed everyone, and they praised God, saying, We have never seen anything like this.

This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God. Thank you, Terry.

So we're in the middle of a sermon series about redemption, and redemption is an act of restoring, and today's focus is going to be on redemption of our body and our soul.

And so the story starts out with Jesus returning to Capernaum. Now Capernaum is where Simon Peter lived, and his mother-in-law was there. There's a story that we're told about Jesus healing Peter's mother-in-law, and the first time he was there, it tells about how Jesus was teaching, he was preaching, he was casting out demons, he was healing, and people thought, Jesus is amazing.

And so when he came back, they're like, Whoa! I need to see this guy again. And so they start flocking right away, and the people are really, really excited, and the place is packed, and Jesus is teaching them all about God.

It's like a revival is happening, and I've seen revivals in Cuba, you know, when everybody's packed in, and they're coming in through the windows because they just can't wait to hear about God, and what God is doing.

And so it's a crowd, and everybody wanted to be with Jesus. And here's this group of people, four friends and a paralyzed man.

Now, it says that the friends brought him on a mat, and when I think about this, I think, you know, a lot of times in scriptures, they'll say things very concisely, and you've got to really think about what's going on there.

[22:58] I mean, men are pretty strong, and when I think about the mat, I think of it much like a stretcher, kind of like what Susan said up there. You know, it's kind of a stretcher, but for them to have four doing this, I kind of think about it being maybe a really large man and heavy man, and then you've got the bumpy, bumpy ride of four people.

Can you imagine? Four people trying to walk with this guy together, and the poor guy's like this the whole time trying to get down there. And so they get there, and the place is packed.

They're like, we're going to get to Jesus. We've got to get over to Jesus. And they're not able to get to Jesus. And so my first thought in looking at this was, well, what on earth is wrong with these people?

I mean, really, what is going on with them? I mean, clearly, these people are bringing a man who wants to see Jesus, who needs to see Jesus. Why on earth would they not have moved out of the way and let that happen?

Why were they so selfish as to block the door? And so, you know, this actually happens in church, and we always have to be really aware, watching, you know, who's trying to reach Jesus, who needs to see Jesus, and make really sure that we are not in any way blocking the door.

By our actions, by our judgments, by anything we're saying or doing, we just need to make sure that we're mindful about what's going on around us, and making sure that we never push people away that need to see Jesus.

So these four friends are there, and I imagine they're struggling. You know, they've been carrying him for how long? I don't know. And they hit a roadblock. They're not being let in.

And the thing is, they didn't do what a lot of us would be tempted to do. They didn't say, oh, this is harder than I thought. You know, we ran into some issues, and this is going to be way more difficult, and so it just must be not God's will, so we're just going to give up.

Instead, they did the bold thing. They did the courageous thing, and they said, we're not defeated. We're never going to give up. Instead, we came here for a breakthrough, and we are going to break through.

And they got creative about it, and it says they went up on the roof. Now, again, it's very concise in its writing, so imagine this, that the houses in that day, and still in Israel, many houses are like this.

[25:25] They've got a flat roof, because in the Middle East, it's hot, and when it's hot, you know, they would go up there, and they would sleep up there and such. It was much like a balcony, and so it was created with wooden slats, and then with dirt, and thatch, and then tiles and stuff on top of that, right?

So they just went on the roof. Start with, have you ever tried to carry something up a flight of stairs? Imagine if it was a ladder instead. They're trying to get this man up there, first of all, and then when they get up there, finally, then they've got to figure out how they're going to get in.

And that's a lot of work. They've got to dig and dig. And so it made me think about a mission trip a few years ago. This one house we worked on, we endearingly called it the Hobbit House because they had a root cellar, and it was built into a hill, and the top had wooden slats, and then it was packed full of dirt and then grass on top, and we had to completely take that apart to be able to fix it.

And here's the thing. These big, strong teenagers, their experience was, we're digging, digging, digging, digging, digging, digging, digging, digging, l mean, it was a lot of work.

They're working their tails off. I mean, one youth even went and got a chair. They're like, oh my goodness, is it over yet? We can't get through. So imagine that these four friends are not just, oh, it's just an easy thing we haul up this man up to the roof, and oh, it's an easy thing we break through this roof.

[27:00] This took perseverance. This took time. This took effort. And they were not going to give up. And then we think about what's going on on the inside.

The commotion. They would have heard from the inside as Jesus is teaching all the commotion upstairs, and then at some point, debris would have started falling on their heads.

And they keep going. And the debris is falling on their heads enough so the hole is getting bigger and bigger and bigger, big enough for a whole body to go through. Because, I mean, you've got to go through this way, right?

You can't just sort of slide them down. That's huge. And so you just have to picture the amount of time, the amount of effort, the amount of perseverance that these friends had. Can you imagine if we're here and somebody is so anxious to get into our church that they start digging holes in the roof?

Oh! That's awesome. And so you think about what Jesus' reaction was to that. What do you think it was? Jesus says, it says that Jesus saw their faith.

[28:04] Saw their faith. I imagine Jesus had a big old smile on his face. You know, who was their faith? Well, did it include the man on the mat?

I kind of assume so. But it was definitely those four friends. You see, faith is a response. Faith is an action. And you can see faith.

Faith is something that's not just a head thing. Faith is a whole body, whole life thing. And so Jesus saw their faith. They decided that this man's life would be better if he met Jesus and they were willing to do whatever it takes, believing that Jesus would heal their friend.

But then Jesus turns to the paralyzed man and he says, son, your sins are forgiven. Well, son, I mean, just start with that.

Son, that's a familial term. It means that parent, child, son. It's like the identity of love and acceptance.

[29:09] And the same thing happens with us. You know, when we accept Christ, it changes our identity too. We end up going from being a sinner in need of God's grace to redeemed, made righteous in the sight of God, justified.

And what justified means is that when we accept Christ in our life, we are in restored relationship. All of our sins are wiped away. Past, present, future.

We are seen with the glory of God. That relationship that was broken by sin is restored, redeemed, re-justified. And then we become sanctified through the power of the Holy Spirit so that we become more and more in the likeness of God.

So when we come to confession, it's not because we have somehow lost our relationship with God because of sin, but we come to confession because we're already forgiven.

And we've become aware through the Holy Spirit and accepting through the Holy Spirit of what needs to change in us. It's like a parental type of thing where we come to our heavenly parent and say, oh, I need your help.

[30:22] I need forgiveness. Please be with me as I grow into who you want me to be. This new identity we have as a child of God and we get a new heart when that happens.

Our heart becomes completely changed. You know, we're talking about superheroes in this sermon series and God is the ultimate superhero and through God we too can become a superhero.

and we have a very strange clip about a superhero named Iron Man and him getting a new heart. I just need your help for a sec.

Oh my God, is that the thing that's keeping you alive? It was. It is now an antique. This is what will be keeping me alive for the foreseeable future. I'm swapping it out for an upgraded unit and I just ran into a little speed bump.

A speed bump? What does that mean? Nothing, it's just a little snag. There's an exposed wire under this device and it's contacting the socket wall and it's causing a little bit of a short. It's...

[31:25] What? Fine. What do you want me to do? Put that on the table over there. That is irrelevant. Oh my God. I just want you to reach in and you're just going to gently lift the wire out. Is it safe?

Yeah, it should be fine. It's like operation. You just don't let it touch the socket wall and it goes beep. What do you mean operation? It's just a game. Never mind. Just gently lift the wire. Okay? Great.

You know, I... I don't think that I'm qualified to do this. No, you're fine. You are the most capable, qualified, trustworthy person I've ever met. You can do great. Is it too much for a problem to ask?

Because I'm... Okay, okay. I really need your help here. Okay. Oh, there's pus.

It's not pus. It's an... You know, a plasmic discharge. It's from the device, not from my body. It smells. Yeah, it does. The copper wire. The copper wire.

You got it? I got it. Okay, you got it. Now, don't let it touch... Ah! It's when you're coming out. That's what I was trying to say before. Okay, now, make sure that when you pull it out, you don't pull it out. There's an magic. At the end of it.

That was it. You just pulled out. Okay. I was not expecting... Don't put it back in. Don't put it back in. What's wrong? Nothing. I'm just going into cardiac arrest because you yanked... I thought you said this was safe.

We got to hurry. Take this. Take this. We got to switch it really quick. Okay. Tony. What? It's going to be okay. Okay? It's going to be okay. I am going to make this okay. Let's hope. Okay, you're going to attach that to the base plate and make sure you...

Ow! Was that so hard? That was fine, right? Oh, I got it. I got it. Nice. Are you okay?

Yeah, I feel great. So for those of you who are not Iron Man fans, that man is Tony Stark and he was smart and he was wealthy but he had a heart that didn't work and he needed it to be replaced.

[33:23] He needed a new heart. And what's interesting if you watch the Iron Man movies is as the movies go on, he actually begins to evolve because at first he wasn't a really very nice man.

He wasn't a very good man but then after time, his character evolves as he received that new heart and began to live into who that new heart made him to be. And so we too are also born in need of a new heart.

We're born with original sin, with hearts that don't work the way they should and they need to be exchanged for a new heart but one that can only come through Jesus Christ. So Jesus, when he forgives our sins, reaches into our hearts, reaches into our lives and scoops out all the bad stuff, all the faulty wiring, all the faulty believing and replaces it with a new heart that shines and transforms every part of our life.

So Tony Stark became Iron Man and he started living with power, power that came from his new heart and the people that knew him said, don't tell anyone you're Iron Man. You can't say that.

You got to keep it a secret. And he was bold and said, no way, I know who I am and he confidently said, I am Iron Man. Well, through the forgiveness of Jesus Christ, we have a new identity too.

[34 : 40] With our new heart, that new identity says, I am redeemed. I am a child of Almighty God. Jesus said to the paralytic, son.

But then he also said, your sins are forgiven. So what do you think the reactions of the people were? I mean, let's start with the crowd. I mean, the crowd, I suspect they were on the one hand kind of excited because this is like a heading towards some drama.

All right? They know the drama that's going to happen. But then at the same time, sort of confusion and shock because, you see, back then, people would believe that if you had anything wrong with you physically, that it meant that it was due to sin, that God had actually sent this as a punishment for you or as a test for you in some way.

And so, they would have looked at this poor man on the mat and they would have proclaimed him a sinner and looked down on him. But this is not the truth. Luke actually addresses this in 13, one through five.

And Jesus says in those passages, it's not true. And today, I run into the same thing. You know, I go to hospitals or visit people who are sick and I'll hear people say, well, you know, God has sent this to me.

[36:05] God is testing me. And I just want to say, no, no, no, no, this is not true. God does not send you pain. God does not send you disease.

See, you look at who Jesus is. Jesus is God incarnate. And who is Jesus? Jesus was compassionate. Jesus was love. Jesus was healing.

We're in a broken world. And when sin was unleashed, there's pain, there's brokenness, there's disease, there's death. But God doesn't send that.

Instead, God is with us through it. Can it make us stronger? Yes, absolutely. But that's because God is there holding you up, carrying you through, wrapping his loving arms around you and weeping alongside of you.

This is not the world we're supposed to be staying in. Well, what was the reaction of the paralyzed man? doesn't say.

[37:08] When I preached this the first time, one of the people said, well, his reaction would have been, wow. I hope it was wow. I hope it was relief. I hope it was joy. But, you know, it may also have been frustration because Jesus didn't do what he wanted.

Right? And don't we go through that today too? You know, we come to Jesus asking and Jesus does something other than what we asked for. And we get frustrated.

It's like, no, that's not what I wanted. No. But the thing is, Jesus was addressing his greatest need. Jesus was reaching him where he needed to be reached.

And so, the paralyzed man was getting what he needed. The friends, after all that, what do you think the friend's reaction was? They say, really?

Jesus? Really? We did all this and that's it? Did you notice he's on the ground? Did you notice he's not walking? Did you notice he's not walking? It's kind of like the point we came here for.

[38:15] Forgiveness? Really? Is that it? And yet, forgiveness is everything, isn't it? It's everything.

You know, it's so hard for us to imagine this because our physical circumstances are the priority to us oftentimes. And so, the state of our soul, we have to recognize is instead more important than anything.

Jesus is our great physician and he knows what really needs healing. And so, we have to trust that Jesus is taking care of that.

The religious leaders, well, they were reasoning in their hearts that Jesus is proclaiming to be God because by saying he's forgiving sins, that's exactly what he was doing. He was saying, I am God and only God can forgive sins.

And they were thinking he was blaspheming and if he wasn't God, he was. So, Jesus responds to all of this.

[39:18] I want you to know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins. Power and authority. Jesus is telling everyone, I am God.

And in doing so then, he commands, commands, I tell you, get up, take your mat, and go home. Now, that's in verse 11 and then in verse 12 he gets up.

So, there's stuff that happens in between those two verses. You've got to think again of the response of everyone there. Jesus, I expect at peace, confident, smiling, the crowd sitting there waiting in anticipation.

Oh, we're going to get a show. The religious leaders are challenged and unsure. The friends are like, yes, this is what we came for. And the paralyzed man, well, the paralyzed man, he had to make a choice.

He had to listen and in faith respond to the call, respond to the command. He could have chosen to stay on the mat. You know, for some of us, and I'm going to be preaching mainly to myself right now, so y'all can just listen in.

[40:30] For some of us, we need to get up off of our mats and start to walk. You know, we know, really, what it takes to be healthy.

All right? We know that we're not supposed to be eating all the junk food. We know we're not, you know, and yet when Halloween came, there was candy, there was donuts, there was stuff. And we know we're supposed to be exercising, and I know that I have a treadmill and a weight machine in my basement just one flight down.

I don't need to finish the rest of that, do I? Okay. I know that we're supposed to get enough sleep. We all know that we're supposed to not have stress, and we all know these things, and yet, for some reason, we choose, choose to stay on our mat and not to do the things that would keep us healthy, that would make us healthy.

We have the body that was given to us by God, the body that is the temple of God within us, and we have a responsibility to choose to do what is good and healthy for us.

God is going to honor whatever choices we make, even if those choices are bad. And so we have to choose wisely in this, and we choose to participate with God in healing of our bodies, but in this case, in this case, it's even more than that.

[42:01] In this case, the paralyzed man, I mean, he's paralyzed. He has to choose to believe Jesus himself saying, you're going to get up and you're going to walk, and he has to believe it.

He has to choose to believe it, and not only choose to believe it, but get up and participate in that, because he could have chosen not to. He could have chosen to say, you know, I'm comfortable on my mat.

I've been here a long time. I kind of get to know it, because, you know, I kind of decided there's no need. I'm a little afraid of this. I don't know. What if it doesn't work? He could have done a lot of different things, but he had to choose.

You see, the thing is, it's not as if Jesus just zapped him and he got up like a puppet. Jesus said, get up, and he had to make the choice to actually go and do it, and he did.

He did. He displayed faith. He participated in the miracle of God, and it was a miracle, because not only did he walk, and think of it, muscles atrophied, and he's able to walk and move.

[43:08] That is a miracle. Jesus redeemed him, not only in his soul, but in his body. See, the redemption of our soul brings redemption to every area of our lives, even to our bodies, and in this case, it was a miracle.

I mean, someone who was paralyzed was immediately able to walk, and for some, there is physical healing that occurs in the body. I have seen people healed in the name of Jesus, so I ask for it.

I pray for it. I believe for it, but then, we also need to note that this is a broken world, and this is not where we're supposed to stay, and so for all of us, for everyone, with the redemption of our souls, it leads to the redemption of our body, the redemption of our body eternally in the new creation, because someday, believers, all the faithful saints, will cross over the threshold into glory with God, because Jesus defeated death on the cross, complete, eternal redemption, with no more sorrow, no more pain, no more disease, and one day, God will bring the new creation, and we will receive a new body with no exercise needed.

I am so thankful, glorified, whole, in the image of God, the way God intended. But see, the point of this story is not the miraculous healing of his body.

the point of this story is that Jesus had the authority to forgive sins, to bring redemption to the soul, and this is an incredibly important message, because at the same time, a lot of Christians don't really respond to it that way.

You know, if I were to just say to you, okay, it's about forgiveness, and there'd be all sorts of different reactions. You know, there are some people who are in church, and maybe they've been in church their whole lives, but they've never actually sought out the forgiveness of Jesus Christ.

I mean, they just didn't believe they needed it. You know, I'm better than that guy. What's the big deal? But the big deal is for eternity and forgiveness. That's where healing needs to occur.

Redemption of the soul justified through Christ. That's what the Christian faith is all about. So if you haven't already, come to Jesus and accept that redemption of your soul.

But then there's also people, often in the church, who have heard that Jesus forgives them, but they haven't moved. They're still on the map. They've been justified, but then they're not working towards sanctification.

And Jesus is saying, get up, pick up your mat, and walk. Walk spiritually. Walk, grow, run, soar. But instead, choosing to stay on a mat for whatever reason, living a life of guilt or defeat or fear or sin, focusing on the disease paralysis, the troubles, the afflictions, Christians need to instead focus on Jesus.

[46:10] Focus on Jesus. I know there are problems. I know there are. But as a Christian, our priority is focusing on the redemption of Jesus and the promise that comes through Jesus Christ.

We live into eternity as the superheroes God made us to be. as God says in Isaiah 43, 90, see, I'm doing a new thing, a new creation, a new identity.

So we have a picture of Iron Man. This was Tony Stark's new identity with a new heart and he was a superhero. He had the armor of protection.

He could battle the enemy on the offensive. He even had Jarvis, who was a voice who would speak to him and guide him and he could soar. But we too, if we accept the love and forgiveness of Jesus Christ, who is the ultimate superhero, we can live into that new identity.

As a superhero made in the image of God, we are powered by faith with his armor of protection. We can battle the enemy on the offensive. We have the Holy Spirit that speaks to us and guides us and we too can soar.

[47:21] However, Jesus says that those of you who have accepted my forgiveness are redeemed. So we need to respond to it.

We need to soar, live into it, the eternity that's available here and now. We need to pick up our mats and walk, walk in that redemption, knowing that God has set you free. Walk in that victory, knowing God has saved you and walk knowing that Jesus has overcome the power of sin and death.

But then there are some, some of us who have been forgiven, who are redeemed, who are living into eternity, who are seeking sanctification, but we're like the four friends where someone we know and we love needs Jesus.

And we are believing God for a miracle, trying to bring them to Jesus, and we just keep hitting roadblocks. Everything's blocking the way. And I want to say to you, don't give up.

Never give up. Never give up. Pray for a way to break through. Keep up the faith because Jesus sees your faith. And so we never give up.

[48:37] Just like Jesus never, ever gave up on us. Jesus asked, which is easier, to say to this paralyzed man, your sins are forgiven, or to say, get up, take your mat, and walk?

And you know, we start to think, well, obviously, this forgiveness of sins is easier because you can't see it. But, for a holy God, forgiveness of sins meant that Jesus would take the sins of the world upon himself and die on a cross for us.

As Christians, we recognize what Jesus did for us, the sacrifice that was made for us, and rising again so that we could be free.

That's the harder one. As we remember the cross on Redemption's Hill, Jesus' blood being spilled for all of us, we witness Jesus' heart, his love that was poured out for you, for me, sons and daughters, for the redemption of our soul.

And so we ask that we be led to the cross. Let's pray.
