This week's reading is from Matthew chapter 5 verses 1 through 11. Now when Jesus saw the crowds, he went up on a mountainside and sat down.

His disciples came to him and he began to teach them. He said, Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.

Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth. Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.

[22:34] Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy. Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.

Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you, and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me.

This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God. Good morning, saints. Good morning, sinners. As Len Sweet would say, it's good to have us all here.

And it's good to have all of you here with us too, gathered for worship. There are four of us in our sanctuary, spread out as we're supposed to be, just so you know. But we wanted to do this from the house of God so you all could feel that you're in church with us this morning.

We're looking at the Beatitudes. Comfort, comfort my people, says the Lord. That's how I started my Bible study Wednesday night from Isaiah 40.

[23:47] And the Beatitudes seem so comforting, don't they? Blessed is this one, and blessed is that one. And everybody feels blessed. We hear that we're blessed.

But who is Jesus really blessing? Are we blessed? Blessed are the poor in spirit. The Greek word is pneuma. Blessed are the people who lack spirit.

Blessed are those who hunger after righteousness. Dilo. They are without as much righteousness as they feel they need.

Blessed are those who mourn, are sad and lonely, blessed are the meek and peaceful, not the bold, not the people who lead.

Blessed are the merciful, for they're the ones who will receive mercy. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us.

[24:55] They know they need it. Blessed are those who know they're sinners. Blessed are those who are persecuted.

For righteousness' sake. You know, everybody nowadays, it seems, feels they're persecuted. I hear this phrase often. It's not fair.

Well, nobody ever said the world would be fair. And we're not persecuted because things aren't fair. It says we're persecuted because we haven't done the right, because we have done the right thing.

How many of us always do the right thing? Good morning, saints. Good morning, sinners. We're all here.

You know, for church people, like us, sometimes the Beatitudes, if you listen to them, can feel like they're actually criticizing us. I've been a Christian for over 45 years.

[25:56] I've been a pastor for 35 years. I have a Master's of Divinity degree. I've been ordained by the United Methodist Church. I built a large church in the ministry that I've held. I should have jewels in my crown in glory.

Kind of feels that way. It should say, blessed are those who study the Bible every day. Blessed are those who sing in the choir and attend worship at least weekly.

Blessed are those who tithe their income and help the poor and are examples of holiness. Blessed are those who work hard at ministry who never sin. I think Pastor Tom is a great pastor.

There's a parable in the book of Luke. And it says to us that there were two men who went in for prayer. And a Pharisee was standing by himself.

And he said, God, I thank you that I'm not like other people, robbers, evils, adulterers, or even this crummy, lousy tax collector over there.

[27:02] Because I do everything right. But the tax collector stood off at a distance. He wouldn't even look up to heaven. But beat his breast and said, God, have mercy on me, a sinner.

And Jesus asked the people, he was telling that parable, who do you think went away forgiven by God? Jesus wants us to strive hard for righteousness and to do the good things and live the way we're supposed to.

But we need to remember who we're doing it for and what we're doing it for. I know we all want to feel we've accomplished something. We all want to feel as if we've gotten somewhere.

We're talking about kingdom living. And one of the differences between kingdom living and American living is in kingdoms, they actually have different ranks of people. So you have the commoners, if you will, and then you have the nobility.

We don't have that. We have poor people and rich people. Similar but not the same. We want to feel somehow we can accomplish something. And in our culture, we've said, you can go from one class to the other.

[28:14] You can accomplish it. You can make it happen. You can do it. You can be a star on America's Got Talent. You could win American Idol. You could be a sports hero. You could build a great business.

> Look at me, Mom. I've arrived. I've done good. Pat me on the back and say, well done. But God actually blesses us, according to the scripture, when we know we're in need of God.

Blessed are those who don't have enough God, and they know it. Those who are poor in spirit, lack righteousness, meek, sad, lonely.

After all these years of trying to do the right thing as a Christian, I like to think I'm okay.

But just as I'm starting to feel that maybe I've arrived somewhere, I do something, I say something, and I realize how desperately broken I still am.

[29:18] I did my best, but I guess my best wasn't good enough. When all is summed up, we're fully dependent on God.

The grace he gives us, and the grace he gives us through others. God saves us from brokenness by grace alone. Blessed are those who know they need God, who don't think that they can do it by the accomplishment of their hands.

One of the Beatitudes I didn't read is, blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God. How do we become pure in heart?

Let's look at Ephesians in chapter 2. It says to us, it is by grace, by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not from yourselves.

It's a gift of God. Not by your actions, because it's not what we can boast about, but only boasting on what God does through us. We need to repent.

[30:28] We need to turn. We need to change. We need to live in a different direction, fully dependent on God. This is a great struggle we're going through. People are really hurting.

People are genuinely lonely, and some people are hungry, and they're watching. We're all watching. Our lives collapse around us. There's a lot of fear. It happens in our day-to-day living.

Even if we didn't have a crisis, some people, I walk through them when they have cancer, or the person that has been their life partner dies, or a fire burns down their house. But 1 John chapter 2 says to us, everything in the world, the lust, the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life comes not from God, but it comes from the world.

The world and its desires, all of them will pass away. But whoever does the will of God lives forever. The Bible says that God will roll up the world like he's rolling up a play mat and start all the way over.

But God, and those whose hearts are with God, will remain forever. Good morning, saints. Good morning, sinners.

[31:45] What is the definition of a sinner? It's someone who's sinned, which is all of us. And what is the definition of a saint, but somebody who is trying, trying to live into what God wants them to be because they know that they're not complete, that they're not full.

And God changes us to be a part of that grace in the world and calls us to something higher. Nobility in the Middle Ages was a higher calling. It wasn't a position of privilege.

It was a position of expectation and obligation. I was looking for a video and I found one with King Arthur talking to Lancelot. You risked your life for another.

There is no greater love. You have deceived me, but now I know the truth.

The truth is, you care nothing for yourself. Well, look at you. No wealth, no home, no goal, just the passionate spirit that drives you on.

[32:54] God uses people like you, Lachie, because your heart is open. You hold nothing back. You're all of yourself.

If you knew me better, you wouldn't say such things. Oh, God. Hey, I take the good with the bad. Together. I can't love people in slices.

People who live in nobility are living to a different cause. No greater love as someone that they lay down their life for their friend.

The Bible said that. That's what he was quoting. Nobility are called to something more. And even nobility are not perfect. It's not a privilege. They have their faults, just like all of we do.

We take them in the hole, not in slices. James in chapter 4 says, draw close to God and he will come near to you. So we have to wash our hands and purify our hearts and our lives so that we will be fully and entirely committed to God.

[34:02] You see, we receive grace. We receive forgiveness. We receive blessings from God, his presence, his mercy. And that should change who we are and cause us to want to live in compassion.

I had a family who attended our church a long time ago. They don't longer attend here. And we had a need and I had lifted it up in the congregation. And they came to me and it was the wife who offered a large check.

I was surprised at the check and she said, I was poor once too. So I know what it's like when somebody has compassion on you.

Now if you would have met this woman, you would never have thought that she was ever poor in any way. But because someone had had mercy on her, now that she had felt that compassion, she wants to share it, which is what God should cause to work and happen in us.

In the Bible, there's another parable. It's a parable of the sheep and the goats. You probably remember this. I won't read the whole story. It's about how God gathers us and the sheep are on his right hand and the goats are on his left hand.

[35:16] And what he says to them is this. He says, Come you who are blessed by my Father. Take your inheritance in the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world.

For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat. I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink. I was a stranger and you invited me in. I needed clothes and you clothed me and I was sick and you looked after me.

I was in prison and you came to visit me. And the righteous, the sheep, said, Lord, when do we see you like that? And he said, When you did this for the least of the people in this world, you did it for me.

And then he said to the goats, essentially the same thing. I was hungry. I was thirsty. I was in need. I was sick. I was in prison. I had difficulties and troubles and you never did anything for me.

And they said, Lord, when did we see you like that? We would have helped you. He said, When you didn't take care of the least of these, you didn't take care of me. It's not that the sheep even knew they were doing this.

[36:17] They didn't do this because they sat down and decided to. They did it because it was part of the nature of who they were because of how God had changed them.

By their fruits, it says in Matthew, you will know them. You don't pick thorns from a grape vine and you don't pick grapes from the thorn bush.

There's two reactions we have to this virus. I've seen it. We've all seen it. Haven't we? There's the people who are storing up thousands of rolls with toilet paper in their basement.

Really. They're hoarding everything they can find. They don't go to the shelves to get what they need in the grocery store. They clear the shelves. And I know we've been told we have to stay home.

We don't know for how long so we're concerned. But at the same time that this is happening, there's other people who are going out there trying to help the other people, giving to other people, taking a meal to their neighbor, sharing what they can.

[37:23] Working at the risk of their own health. Are we sheep? Or are we goats? Goats are kind of selfish creatures.

They think about themselves. They keep their fur for themselves. They're stubborn. Their horns stick out. Sheep are softer.

They're gentler. They care for each other. They follow the good shepherd. They give away their wool.

And their horns curve in. I just want to be a sheep. I just want to be a sheep. I pray the Lord my soul to keep.

I just want to be a sheep. I don't want to be a goat, nope. I don't want to be a goat, nope. Because there's no hope, nope. I don't want to be a goat, nope.

[38:29] It's a kid's song, but it's a real song. Do we want to be sheep? Or even more to the point, are we just filled with God enough so that we are sheep? The nobility were people that were set aside at a time when there was a severe lack of resources.

We think we have a lack of resources now. This was a time when there wasn't enough food for everybody to get a proper meal. There wasn't enough proper shelter. There wasn't enough medicines. There wasn't enough to take care of everybody.

There weren't schools for everyone to go to. They were in a serious, serious, multiple-century depression.

And so they looked among the people and they said, which people have the attributes, the qualities of nobility? They're gentle, patience, kind.

You know the fruits of the Spirit, right? They're living out what God would want them to live out. We will put a few extra resources into them.

[39:33] We will educate them a little bit better. We will give them opportunities others don't have so that they can help us as a people. Remember beauty.

Remember compassion. Remember the noble things of God. And in the midst of our chaos and struggles as just living the common life, these people were saying, we need someone to stretch for us a little bit farther.

See, we're Americans. So we think nobility is about getting rich, like what we kind of think of as our nobility. It's about where we get privileged, but that's not what nobility is about.

It's about expectation that they will live for something beyond themselves, for the people that they're in the midst of. It's hard for me to find a clip on nobility from our movies because all our movies show about nobility is them going out with swords and trying to kill each other.

The purpose of nobility had nothing to do with giving people swords to go kill each other. Sometimes they had to use a sword to defend their brothers and sisters. And even that was a risk.

[40:48] Laying down their life for the people who couldn't defend themselves. But what they were called to is something greater. Just like right now, our doctors and our nurses and our medical people who are literally not just out in this culture risking themselves, they're going right into the midst of the brokenness, the pain, the hurt, the suffering, the struggle.

And so what do we do? Well, we need to give them the masks we're hoarding away. We need to see if we've got rubber gloves somewhere that they can share. We need to make sure they have every possible resource to do what they're supposed to be doing because they have nobility.

Good morning, sinners. Good morning, saints. If we change our hearts, we can change our destiny and we can change this world we live into.

People are really hurting. This coronavirus is real. It's a real danger. People are getting sick. They're dying. And we have all but obliterated our sense of what our economy and our future is going to be.

We don't know what we're facing. People are hungry. People are having loved ones die and they can't even have a proper service for them. They're weak. They're sad.

[42:11] They're isolated. They're broken. I'm not afraid of the virus. I know people don't like me to say that, but I'm not afraid of the virus. I know where I'm going. The virus can't take away eternity from me.

I know my destiny. But I still social distance. I social distance because I love others. It's not about going out and partying together for my fun.

If I have to go somewhere, if they call me to do something because it needs to be done, I'll do it. But if not, I'm going to respect people that are trying to keep me from being a part of the problem, right?

Our God, and we forget this, can make something out of nothing. You've heard me say this before. But when we dream, our dreams are little.

We hope to build a house. We maybe hope to have a career. Put a few dollars away for our older years. Raise some children properly. When God dreams, stars appear in the sky.

[43:26] When God dreams, a world and a universe happens. When God dreams, people's hearts change. And our lives are transformed. We still worship the God who controls the wind and the waves.

He controls all of what is happening. He still loves us. He's still with us. We need to learn not to be afraid. The goats, they didn't know what to do.

They found themselves on the wrong side of judgment. And they didn't even know it. They thought they were okay. They had tons of toilet paper in the basement.

The sheep didn't even know that they were okay. Like we have the blessing of knowing. And God was with them.

Don't be afraid. Go out and live. Knowing your sinners, call to be saints. Be not afraid.

[44:52] Be not afraid. I know before you always. Come, follow me.

And I will give you rest. Blessed are your fools.

For the kingdom shall be best. Blessed are you that weep and mourn.

For one day you shall laugh. And if wicked dogs insult and hate you all because of me.

[50:50] The Lord be with you. And also with you. Lift up your hearts. We lift the love to the Lord. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise. It is always right to thank God, even in the midst of a crisis.

This time in our service, we usually have a response to the Word of God. Our typical response is a prayer of confession, and I am going to invite you now to join me in that.

Dear God in heaven, I have sinned. I have not done what you have called me to do. I have not lived as a noble Christian.

Help me to know what I need. Help me to see the need and hurting people and be your hands and feet in this world.

Forgive me for my sin. Make me pure in heart. Through your grace. In Jesus name we pray.

[52:00] Amen. Jesus said if we confess our sin, and if we believe in our heart, God will remove our sins. In the name of Jesus Christ, your sins are forgiven.

In the name of Jesus Christ, your Lord and your sins are forgiven. Glory to God. Amen. So, then we normally will celebrate at this table communion, but communion is something that is meant just by the very word of it to gather together with the people.

And I know in some ways we're trying to gather remotely so that we're not socially distanced, just physically distanced. But we hold this sacred time as a celebration when we gather together.

So, we will come together again. And we will meet at this table. And we will share in the blessing of God. In the meantime, God calls us to other responses.

There's many things that we can do. I just want to give you an idea of some things that people have done in the last couple of weeks. I know that people have made phone calls to friends, to people in the church.

[53:12] They've just reached out to someone who's lonely. Some people can't even do this. They don't have a computer. They need you to be the church to them. If you want to or can help with an organized effort for that in our church, please contact Pastor Sherry at the email address that you see listed.

I have a woman who sent me a text message and said, I have a whole lot of chicken that I want to donate to the church. Now, everybody's hoarding it and she's trying to give it away. What a wonderful thing.

If you look and see that you have food you don't need, you have resources that you couldn't possibly use. Some woman said that they ordered 48 rolls of toilet paper and ended up with 48 cases.

I think they could share. Maybe you can share. Look in your cupboards, your closets. See if you have a whole package of masks that could be sent to the hospital. What can you do to share?

If you want to help with needs of people out there, contact Gidget Mealen at the email address that's listed. Or just look around your neighborhood. You'll find the people.

[54:22] Another person bought Topps cards and said, Pastor Tom, give them out to anybody who needs them. I had another woman. She was going through the store and she was having trouble opening up one of those bags, you know, for the chickens that they prepare.

And a very nice, kind, older gentleman came along and said, Ma'am, let me help you with it. And took the bag and licked his fingers and then took the bag and pulled it apart. See what you need is you need to put a little spit on it.

Now, the point wasn't that he helped her. It's that after he did this, the woman carefully took the bottom of the plastic bag and said, Thank you so much. And after he left, she threw it in the garbage and got herself a new bag.

And while she was putting some of that sanitizing liquid on, she found that that also was helpful in loosening up the bag and opening it up. We need to be gracious to each other.

Even when people do things that we might find are inappropriate or wrong, because God calls us to be people of compassion and love.

[55:29] Maybe you have medical supplies. Maybe you can send a donation. Our church is going to have to provide for people around us and we have to take care of our employees and we have to figure out how to be the church as we go along.

So if you have the ability to continue to give your donation to the church, it would be greatly appreciated. You can send in a check or however. There's even a giving button on the internet options.

Maybe you can't. Then don't. We don't want anybody to hurt. We want to find the people who need help and help them. And find the people who can help and have them provide the help.

Maybe you could send an old-fashioned letter to those people who don't have internet. You know, a card. You remember those things. You filled out the envelope. You tucked it in and you sent an actual note to somebody.

You can all pray. We can all pray. And if we do, we know that God will bless us and we will come through this to the other side.
