Good morning. Today's reading is from John, chapter 4, verses 7 through 24. When a Samaritan woman came to draw water, Jesus said to her, Will you give me a drink?

His disciples had gone into the town to buy food. The Samaritan woman said to him, You are a Jew, and I am a Samaritan woman. How can you ask me for a drink? For Jews do not associate with Samaritans.

[26:51] Jesus answered her, If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asked you for a drink, you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water. Sir, the woman said, You have nothing to draw with, and the well is deep.

Where can you get this living water? Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us the well and drank from it himself, as did also his sons and his flocks and his herds? Jesus answered, Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the water I give him will never thirst.

Indeed, the water I give him will become in him a spring of water, welling up to eternal life. The woman said to him, Sir, give me this water so that I won't get thirsty and have to keep coming here to draw water.

He told her, Go, call your husband, and come back. I have no husband, she replied. Jesus said to her, You are right when you say you have no husband. The fact is, you have had five husbands, and the man you now have is not your husband.

What you have just said is quite true. Sir, the woman said, I can see that you are a prophet. Our fathers worshipped on this mountain, but you Jews claim that the place where we must worship is in Jerusalem.

[28:06] Jesus declared, Believe me, woman, a time is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. You Samaritans worship what you do not know.

We worship what we do know, for salvation is from the Jews. Yet a time is coming, and has now come, when the true worshippers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for they are the kind of worshippers the Father sees.

God is spirit, and his worshippers must worship in spirit and in truth. This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God. Thank you, Christy.

I keep going to the river to pray, because I need something that can wash out the pain. I know.

I don't do those songs too well, do I? But I heard that on the radio, and I've heard it several times, and I think, isn't that an interesting idea? That somebody on regular radio is talking about going and having their problems washed away with prayer.

[29:13] God wants to wash us clean, cleanse us, bless us with living water. Jesus says, if you knew the gift of God, and who it is that asks you if we're a drink, you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water.

And the woman says, where can we get that stuff? Where can we come across this blessing? John chapter 8, Jesus says, if you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples.

Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free. Most of us have heard that verse. In fact, a lot of us have probably quoted that verse. People want to know the truth, but people also like to win.

They like to win. And winning sometimes pushes people, keeps people away from Jesus. We're talking about the walls we build up as Christians that keep people from Jesus.

The things that we do, and the attitudes we have, and the directions that we take that can actually block people from the grace of God. Sometimes it's our customs.

[30 : 30] The things that we've always done that can become a barrier to Christ. Things that can change, but we don't want them to. If you read a little further in this passage, in verse 27, it says that Jesus' disciples showed up, and they were astonished.

They were shocked that Jesus was talking to a Samaritan woman. First of all, the fact that he was talking to a woman, because it's scandalous for a man to be seen talking to a woman at a watering hole.

It's scandalous for a man to have any association with a woman back in those days. And even now, it creates whispers and concerns and worries.

We have all kinds of gender issues going on. Stuff that keeps us from being what we should be. The other night, I was talking with a group of guys from the church, actually, and there were some women there, and I said that someone looked and acted like a regular housewife.

And there was a woman there that said, what's a regular housewife look like? And I didn't know how to answer that anymore. I could answer that 40 years ago, but it completely doesn't make any sense today in the way in which it used to it.

[31:49] I've decided, I think that word is wrong. I think somehow that's not the right word to use. Even though all our lives we've thought it was a normal word, it's somehow inappropriate these days.

And we have the same kind of things going on in this story. They were astonished that Jesus would talk to a woman and that he would talk to a Samaritan woman. We use the word Samaritan like it's a good thing, you know?

We call things Samaritan stuff because it's about people that are kind and loving because of the story in the Bible of the good Samaritan. But in that day and age, the Jews thought Samaritans were the biggest problem there was near them.

They wouldn't even talk to them. They would go 50 miles out of their way walking on a journey to avoid being near Samaritans. They didn't like Samaritans.

Samaritans were the people who were left in the land when the children of Israel were taken to captivity in Babylon. And some of them actually had the audacity to marry people from other tribes and other races.

[32:56] So they messed up their bloodlines. And then on top of that, they actually thought you could worship God on a mountain when everybody knew you could only worship God in Jerusalem.

What a bunch of bums. For that, we should disassociate with them. Now, you know I'm being sarcastic, right? It's silly to us.

It seems ridiculous that these people would decide that somehow they couldn't associate with people because they worshiped in the wrong place in the wrong way. The same God.

But I gotta tell you, when I grew up, we weren't allowed to go in other people's churches. We didn't know what went on in there. We wondered if they were really Christians.

Nowadays, we mix it all together as if it's always been that way. These are their cousins. And you and I both know that it's harder sometimes to accept differences in our own family than it is in strangers.

[33:58] And so they didn't associate with the Samaritans. But Jesus is talking to them, talking to this woman, because he's not gonna let the people's prejudices and their customs keep this woman from Jesus.

That's hard for us. Because you see, if we give up what we've always thought, these things we've always done, the way we've always done things, we also have to give up a little bit of our pride.

So one of the blocks we put on our wall is pride. This idea that somehow it's about winning, even at the cost of being right.

People want to know the truth, but people worry sometimes more about being right. And so we develop self-righteousness, even if we know we're doing wrong.

This last week, they made a decision in South Carolina that it's time to take down the Confederate flag. Now, for those of you who grew up in this area like I did, it's like, dude, the war was over like 150 years ago.

[35:07] Seriously, what's the big deal? I know somebody from the South is right now starting to boil. You know, they actually said we should take a flag down.

That didn't mean much to me. I thought, yeah, if it offends somebody, take down that full flag. But what if it offended somebody that we have an American flag in our sanctuary? Because I know for some people it does.

Should we take it out? Oh, now. Now if I did that, I'd start getting the emails and the comments. Because these things, they actually mean something to us.

But we can take these matters of custom and pride to the point to which it breaks people and hurts people and keeps them from God's truth. People want to know the truth, but people want to win.

This was kind of a week of winners and losers in lots of places. Did you notice this? Supreme Court made decisions. ISIS killed a bunch of people on three different continents.

[36:13] And then we had a guy who's been running around in the woods up in northern New York in the Adirondacks for a few weeks. You all know about this, right? And it came on the TV where I was sitting and they said that they shot the guy.

And I looked at the TV and I said, good. I thought, oh, I'm not supposed to say that. I'm a pastor. I'm not supposed to say it's good they shot him. I didn't really mean good. I should have said that. That was wrong.

Oh, man, it's tough, isn't it? What's right? What's wrong? What's the truth? And what if our side loses somehow? There are things that the church needs to defend no matter what the cost that are the truth of God.

But some things we defend are just not worth the effort. we have religion and we have customs and we have prejudices and they can get in the way of the truth.

The Bible says, spare the rod and spoil the child. When I grew up in school, what that meant was that my school teachers could take a yardstick and I don't mean those thin, skinny little things they make now.

[37:25] I mean those quarter-inch, heavy-duty yardsticks and they could whack us with them any time they wanted to. Hitting us, that was nothing. Throwing books at us, whacking us in the head.

Whatever they wanted to do, it was okay. You know what happened if we went home and complained? We got hit again. Okay? My dad was a compassionate kind of father because he only hit me with his hand for the most part.

My friends, most of them got beat with belts and sticks, brooms, brushes. all sorts of stuff. Then the parents would say, this is going to hurt me more than it's going to hurt you.

We all think, no, nah, you're whacking me with something. Today, today, if people did what loving people did back then, we'd have them arrested.

things change. This wasn't parents trying to be abusive. They didn't know any better. They didn't realize it.

[38:34] It didn't take those measures to help a child learn. Small little swat is one thing, but you don't need to hit somebody with a shovel to get the point across.

But they did back then, and they thought it was normal. And some people still defend things that are really, truly, we know are wrong.

Some things change. Some things are the same. We have to decide which are which and why, and that's what Christians really need to struggle with. This woman says to Jesus, are you greater than our ancestor Jacob, who dug this well?

And we're all going, yes, seriously, you have no idea who you're talking to. Right? She has no idea who she's talking to. But sometimes it's not even looking at Jesus, it's just looking at the past and customs that are from the past, when we need to be looking at the future.

We're Methodists, and so we follow the teachings of a fellow named John Wesley, who lived about 200 and some years ago. And a lot of our faith principles are based on the teachings of John Wesley.

[39:48] And every once in a while I disagree with him, and one of my colleagues will say to me, well, who do you think you are, smarter than Wesley? Yes! Seriously, dude, I'm a lot smarter than a man that lived 200 and some years ago.

Are you kidding? Try to do your kid's sixth grade homework, and you'll realize they're smarter than we are. you don't think we've changed, that we've grown, that we've learned some stuff in 200 years?

I think so. The man was brilliant, wonderful. Jacob dug a well, good for him. But we change. We don't live back there anymore. I drive a car.

I don't ride around on a horse. That's just nuts. And I know you like the look of those classic cars. We're riding one once. They're no dream, let me tell you. things change, and we need to learn how to change with them when things need to change, and not keep people from God, because we never did it that way before.

I can guarantee you that the day that I stop being a pastor here, a few years later, there's going to be somebody who's going to quote that very line to somebody and say, we never did it like that before.

[40:56] Pastor Tom said, he's not here anymore. He's gone. Doesn't matter what he said. I'm not Jesus. For goodness sakes, we have to learn how to move forward, especially if we're keeping people from Jesus.

Where do we find God? On a mountain top. Does it matter if we worship in Jerusalem? Does it matter if we're in this room? Does it matter if we're out in the field? Does it matter if we're this denomination or that denomination or some other crazy thing?

We're worshiping God. In spirit and in truth, he says. That's what matters. Things are going to change, he says. And they do change. The other night I was out at Silver Lake with a couple ladies from Florida.

We happened to be here last night as I was preaching. And they asked me if I liked hummus. How many of you have ever eaten hummus? Seriously, how many of you ate hummus when you were five years old? Young people, maybe.

Nobody else will tell you that. We never even heard of hummus. Doesn't even sound right. And it looks like something that came from the wrong place, let me tell you. And we're supposed to eat this stuff?

[42:07] Seriously? I saw it before most of you because my brother's from the West Bank of Palestine. So we ate Mediterranean food early on. We were putting that slop on all kinds of things before you even knew what it was.

Yeah, hummus. It's the new condiment, isn't it? Yeah, just like salsa. How many of you eat salsa? Really?

We never heard of salsa back in the day. I like the way it's salsa. I'll have a little salsa with that. Yeah, that sounds good. Or, what is that doing? Serrata? You know what I'm saying.

Yeah, see, you know what I'm talking about. Never heard of it before. We're using spices and foods and things we never even thought. Let's get out for Thai food tonight. Thai? What? Thai food?

Who eats Thai food? We do! Right? Why do you think McDonald's is going like this? Because we don't eat regular food anymore. We eat all kinds of cool stuff.

[43:06] Because some things change. If things are alive and they'll grow, they'll change, they'll transform. The things that stay the same forever are dead.

and the only thing they can do is deteriorate and fall apart. We tend to think about what we know as being possible and focus only on that.

This woman says to Jesus, you don't even have a cup to reach down in the well to get the water out. How are you going to get this living water? And you can almost picture her going, like, really, seriously, I'm the son of God.

I'm not talking about this. And Jesus wants us to open our eyes to possibilities that otherwise we wouldn't see. We need to have vision.

We need to be able to see possibilities and dream dreams that other people don't even know are there. And we might be able to see healing that can happen that otherwise wouldn't occur.

[44:10] These disciples couldn't imagine Jesus talking to a Samaritan woman, and yet he was doing it. God refreshes us. Everyone who drinks of this water will thirst again.

He said, but whoever drinks from the water that I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water, welling up to eternal life, living, moving, alive water that transforms us, living water.

water that's alive, living water is moving water.

It changes and transforms. Would you want to drink water from a stream that's flowing clearly, or would you want to drink water from a stagnant pond?

And you see, God gives us living water, where we're supposed to be alive and change and transform and understand the power and wonder of God.

[45:22] Stagnant water, you've heard water all morning already, haven't you? Stagnant water sounds like this. It's dead. Stagnant worship sounds like this.

It's dead. Stagnant lives sound like this. We cling with pride to customs and we're not going to change.

We're certain of our truth and sometimes we're just stagnant and dead and hurtful and hateful. People want to win, but people need to know the truth.

John says to us, I think he does. I think it's over here. If you hold by teaching, you are really my disciples, then you'll know the truth and the truth will set you free.

down in the river to pray, studying about that good old way, and who shall wear a starry crown, good Lord, show me the way.

[46:33] Oh, sisters, let's go down, let's go down, come on down. Oh, sisters, let's go down, down in the river to pray.

This is what they call a shift. Because you see, sometimes we also need to hold on to something old, because it's true. There are some old truths, the teachings of Jesus.

Some things change, and some things are always true. They always remain the same. They're not up for debate, they're not up for discussion. It doesn't matter what the vote is, it doesn't matter what anybody decides or says anywhere, God has said it, God has spoken it, it is true, it always will be.

We live in a world where postmodern thought has become the norm. Postmodern thought says nothing is ever true. Quantum physics and wacky math where four plus four sometimes equals nine.

Where the truth is not always true, you have your truth, I have my truth, you have your truth. Whatever you believe, whatever truth, it's okay. Everybody believes whatever they want. We have scientists who are going nuts with postmodern thought trying to figure it out, because scientists believe that there's got to be a truth somewhere.

[47:53] There's got to be something that's always right. But everybody's saying there is no truth anymore. Did you know people think that science and religion are fighting with each other? We're seeking the same thing.

We both want the truth, right? And if one happens to show that the other one's wrong, then guess what? You find the truth, you find the truth. It doesn't matter how you got there. But there is a truth.

There is a truth, a living water that's always the same. If water goes up, it also comes back.

Right? You can't throw water up and it stays up there. I've never seen it. It's never happened. I don't think it ever will. Even if it stays up there for a little while in the cloud.

Even if we're having a church picnic. Even if we want to do a car wash. If the water's up there, it's going to come down. But that's how it works. Truth is truth is truth.

[48:55] Not all ideas that people call truth are truth. This woman says, we've got our way thinking about it. You've got your way. Which is right? And Jesus says, we're right.

You're wrong. Did you hear that? He says, we've got the truth. You don't, lady. You're wrong. And we're all going, oh, Jesus, how could you say that? That's offensive. How can you tell somebody their religion is wrong?

Because sometimes it's wrong. That's the way it is. The reason we have churches, the reason why we even have the Bible, the reason why we talk about this stuff is because sometimes there's things that are right.

And if people are wrong, it doesn't help to tell them it's okay to think whatever they want. Nowadays, everybody's spiritual. Oh, we're all spiritual. We're all seeking after God. And we take many roads in many different ways, but we all get to the same place.

That's wrong. That's just something somebody made up because it sounds nice. But just because it sounds nice doesn't mean it's real. Jesus was offensive to this woman.

[49:53] Lady, I'm sorry, but you're wrong. We're right. Somebody's asked me sometimes, what would I do with a person of a different faith? I would say very clearly, I hope your faith has some possibilities of gaining you eternal life, but I can tell you the way, the truth, and the life, and the way to get there.

So if you want a sure thing, follow Christianity. Everything else is a roll of the dice. It's not up to me to decide whether it works. That's up to God.

But I preach what I know is true, and it's okay to say that some things are true. Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength. It's true. Love your neighbor as yourself.

It's true. Do unto others as you would have others do unto you. We're saved by the grace of God, His forgiving alone. Jesus Christ is our Lord and our Savior.

These are classic, absolute truths. We can't throw them out the window because somebody doesn't like it. Jesus says, the time will come when you will worship God in spirit and in truth, with the Holy Spirit empowering you to find the truth.

You see, if you don't have the Spirit of God in you, if you don't have God working in you, all this stuff is just philosophy. It's just stuff we talk about. It's stuff we study, but it doesn't have any life. The power of God only comes when we receive Christ.

This Bible doesn't do anything but help those of us who already have God living in our lives. The first place is to receive the power of Jesus Christ in your life.

Open up your heart and let Him in. When you do that, then God will lead you to the truth. God will lead you to the right direction. God will help you to understand because that's how we come to know God in spirit and in truth.

People want to know the truth, but pride makes us want to win. Oh, too many times. I was in the South when I was a teenager one time.

We were in West Virginia doing mission work and we had these young guys from the community coming around harassing us and they would call us Yankees.

[52:09] I can't say the word in church. It's not appropriate, but just assume that, you know, some people who don't have Jesus are damned to hell. Oh, I guess I just did say it, right? They would call us darn Yankees, but you know what I'm trying to say, right?

Okay? I know the things you can get in trouble with as a pastor, really, okay? And I looked at them and I said, seriously, guys, you're upset with us.

You do understand how West Virginia came into being. Yeah, we know. We know. No, you don't. Because West Virginia split off of Virginia because it fought with the North.

You fools. You're a bunch of Yankees. You don't know the truth. You're arguing to fight for something you didn't fight for.

But we hold on to it because somebody taught it to us. Somebody showed it to us. Somebody said it to us. Somebody we like. Somebody we respect. But it's just not true. I know the South doesn't like it that they lost.

[53:13] How? How? I hear him saying the South is going to rise again. Well, maybe, but, you know, they're Americans, we're Americans. Let's end the war.

Amen? I think it's over. I think it's over. Christianity is about seeking the truth, not winning. Some of you are going to find that very hard to accept.

Christianity is about seeking the truth and not at all about winning. Actually, Mark said this. If anyone would come after me, they must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me.

For whoever wants to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me and for the gospel will save it. What good is it for someone to gain the whole world and lose their soul? We gain eternal life by giving up who we are.

We take up a cross, not to carry around some burden like some kind of strange thing, but because that cross means we're dying. We're dying to who we are. We're dying to our winning. We're dying to our pride.

[54:22] We're dying to the walls. We're opening our lives up to God because sometimes even in losing, you can win.

But sometimes it takes time to realize it and let it truly sink in. Learning the truth of God is giving God the power and letting God wash over us with living water.

Like waves of motion just flowing over the top of us and washing us new and clean. That's what God wants us to do.

We win when we give up. We succeed when we surrender. We have victory when we lay down ourselves and give ourselves over to God.

You know, one of the odd parts about this story is that Jesus is alone. If you read the Bible, Jesus is never alone. A couple times he tries to get alone and the crowds chase after him.

[55:33] They'll chase him around the lake, they'll chase him up a mountain, they'll chase him everywhere. Jesus is almost never alone in the Bible. That would drive me crazy. I like people, I like you, but you know, give me space, right?

He's alone. He's alone. What do you think would have happened if his disciples were there? What do you think would have happened with this woman? Do you think Jesus and this woman would have had this conversation?

I think they would have said, you don't belong here. Hit the bricks. You're a Samaritan, you're a woman, you have no business with Jesus. Jesus' disciples would have pushed her away from Jesus.

Jesus tells the woman, I know all about you. I know the five guys you've lived with and I know the one you're living with now. And we're still talking. I know you got problems.

I know you got confusion in your life. I know you make mistakes. We're still talking. You might have faults. You might have problems. You might have deficiencies in your life.

But Jesus is still talking to you. He accepts us right where we are. Meets us where we are. Respects us. So that the walls can come down and grace can start happening.

In Psalm 118, we read this. The Lord has chastened me severely, but he's not given me over to death. He opened for me the gates of righteousness. I will enter and give thanks to the Lord.

This is the gate of the Lord through which the righteous may enter. I will give you thanks for you answered me. You became my salvation.

Knocking down the walls, going through the gates, opening up the walls so that we and others can come to Christ. Christ died so we could live. He was brought low so that we could be lifted up.

He was counted as a criminal so we could be made righteous. He lost so that we could win. Living water of God's grace, that's what baptism's about, remembering that God himself took it away.
