There were new, different people going, and old friends weren't going to be able to make it. So I was afraid I wasn't going to be as fun as last year. I'm glad I was wrong. After even just the first day of driving and going to do free Slurpees at 7-Eleven, I saw myself getting along with people who I hadn't thought I would even talk to.

As everyone began to open up to each other, I saw God at work. We all bonded over the smallest things, corny jokes, taking breaks to eat chocolate when a log to the cabin didn't fit, and singing along to Jade playing her guitar at bonfires.

[24:06] I'm also thankful for the adults who went on the mission trip, especially Pastor Sherry. There were times when building those log cabins that everyone was frustrated and just wanted to get it done. But she kept us smiling, laughing, and I think I can speak for all of us when I say how proud we were that the cabins were flush and lovely.

So thank you, Pastor Sherry. Finally, at the end of each day when we were all sitting around the bonfire, we would share God moments, which were times when we saw him that day in whatever we were doing. I think I can say without a doubt in my mind that I saw God every day on that week in Boyne Falls, Michigan.

So imagine heavy logs over your head on scaffolding with sledgehammers, and it was heavy, heavy work. We also had a group that went to the Bergman Center, which was, it's a facility for the mentally handicapped, and they tore apart a roof and rebuilt the roof.

[25:20] They built a shed from scratch. They painted with two coats, two bathrooms, and a huge office. And they also there were able to just really connect and spend time with the people that go to the Bergman Center.

They sang with them. They prayed with them. They had a good time with them, and they made a huge impact. The other place that we went to was Gail's house, and Gail was a mom who was, her grandma actually, trying to raise two granddaughters on her own and way, way, way, way behind.

And we helped starting from the outside going in, and we took apart her yard, at least 15 to 20 big truckloads full of just garbage, and then another 15 to 20 trailer loads full of yard debris.

And so we mowed, we created gardens, we fixed part of her roof, we fixed the windowsill and the soffit and the fascia, and we painted everything, and we made the new door, and we fixed the one entryway that was literally floor-to-ceiling garbage and hauled it all out for her.

And she prayed with us, and she was in tears, and she was praising God because of our teenagers, and you would be so proud. They made such an impact on everyone who was around them.

[26:37] They kept coming up and telling us just how wonderful these kids are. They assumed they were college students, and they said they've never seen teenagers this hardworking, this respectful, this kind.

And again, you would be so proud. So thank you for your continued support with the mission trip, and thank you to kids for participating in this. Thank you. Our teenagers are awesome.

[29:24] Amen. And now let us turn to the scriptures. Good morning.

Please excuse me. Another said, I have just bought five yoke of oxen and I'm on my way to try them out. Please excuse me. Still another said, I just got married, so I can't come.

[30:45] The servant came back and reported this to his master. Then the owner of the house became angry and ordered his servant, Go out quickly into the streets and alleys of the town and bring in the poor, the crippled, the blind, and the lame.

Sir, the servant said, What you ordered has been done, but there is still room. Then the master told his servant, Go out to the roads and country lanes and make them come in so that my house will be full.

I tell you, not one of those men who were invited will get a taste of my banquet. This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God. Thank you, Jeff.

The past few weeks, we've been talking about the things that block people from coming to the church of God, that we have this incredible garden of God behind a wall and we do things to keep them out.

But for the next few weeks, I want to talk about the things that we actually do as Christians that aren't quite right. Our garden is a little bit broken. So I want to talk about how we can fix our lives, fix our church, so that this fall, we can speak about how God can work his miracle power in our lives.

[31:59] This particular parable, historically, has been understood as being about the Jewish people who refused God's grace when Jesus came. And so God opened up his grace to the whole world, to the people that were called Gentiles, those who weren't Jewish at the time.

The Jews were rich and revealed truth. They had the scriptures. They were blessed by God. The Gentiles were spiritually bankrupt. They were blind. They were poor in their opportunities for revelation.

They were crippled in their relationship with God. And so they talk about this as if this is the purpose of the parable, but if that were the case, then its whole meaning would have ended a couple thousand years ago because at this point in time, we're the church.

We're the people of God. So what is God trying to say to us? Especially what is God trying to say to the church? I grew up going to church.

I grew up in a church in Snyder, New York. I was from Cheektowaga. Everyone in our church seemed like they were better dressed. They all seemed to have more money.

[33:05] They all seemed to have different kind of jobs that weren't quite the type of jobs we had. It seemed like we somehow were from the wrong place, the wrong school, the wrong location in life.

Sometimes I'd go out into our fellowship hall and we'd just look around to see if there's anybody who would talk to us, anybody who wanted to say hello to us. It was a large church.

It was easy to get lost in a church like that. Sometimes I felt like I didn't belong, like I didn't measure up, like I didn't belong there at the church.

And I would have loved to have somebody invite me to visit with them. Maybe go to dinner together. Maybe talk. Maybe just have an opportunity. It doesn't have to be a banquet like this.

Just something somewhere. My wife has a bird feeder in our backyard. I don't know how many of you have birds, but they attract these little tiny birds, finches and such, just sparrows, and they cluster around and they eat the food.

[34:13] Sometimes they pick at each other a little bit, but let one of the blue jays or a crow or something show up, and all those little birds will go after the big one, chasing them out of the yard.

It's kind of an odd sight to see this huge bird chased away by these little ones, but if you've ever been the awkward, odd bird owl, it's an uncomfortable feeling.

And they hold up like this.

It's creepy that he's also living his PKiczon. Oh. Oh.

[35:43] Oh. Oh. Oh. I sometimes thought we should show this video at the beginning of every church worship service.

We're invited to a banquet by God himself, a great banquet where we'll be blessed for all eternity. Many are invited, it says, because God wants really everybody there.

The problem with this banquet is it doesn't have a set time. So imagine you're invited to a party and they say, we'll let you know when it is. And you say, well, yeah, yeah, I want to come.

And then you don't hear about it for a while. And you get busy. This last week I was invited to have a meal with three different people that I had to tell no.

One of them was a 10 year old boy who was making dinner for me. And I had to say, I'm sorry, I wish I knew, but I've got dinner plans, I was like, I'm going to go back to this at home.

[36:54] How do you tell a 10 year old boy who was making dinner for you? No. Sometimes it just comes at the most inconvenient time. They were all trying to do me a favor.

Each one of them was trying to provide me with some sort of a meal or a time of fellowship or a time to get together. It's the kind of thing I really wanted to do. But I had to say no.

God wants to do us a favor. He's invited us to a party for all eternity. One that we don't even deserve to go to. Eternal joy.

Eternal joy. It's not a right. It's not something everybody gets just for existing. It's a gift from God. It's what we call grace. See, really, none of us are good enough to be in God's presence.

In Romans chapter 3 it says, Everyone has sinned and fallen short of the glory of God. There's nobody who's perfect. Not one who measures up. Not you, not me, not anyone.

[37:57] And further in Romans it says that the penalty of sin is death. The penalty of sin is death. And yet God has given a gift of eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

> It's a gift that God gives to us. That's what grace is. Most people don't understand grace. Most people don't even understand life. They don't understand God. This man stands up and says, Blessed are those who feast at the banquet in the kingdom of heaven.

> What does it mean to live a blessed life? For most people in our culture, we think living a blessed life is to win good fortune, a good job, and a good family.

If you've got those three men, we'd say you are blessed. Things are good for you. You've got a good life. These people told them they couldn't come to the banquet.

And the reason was because of work, family, and prosperity. I just bought a new piece of property. I've got to go see what it looks like. If you're the kind of person, by the way, who buys things without seeing them, we could make a deal.

[39:16] I've got a new pair of oxen. You have no idea what this will mean to my business. I have to go try them out. Same thing. I just found the love of my life.

I'd rather spend time with her than partying with you, God. They're excuses, obviously. Nobody goes out and buys something like a pair of oxen.

This would be like buying a new car without driving it. We're not coming. Many won't come to the banquet. They'll be invited, but they're going to miss it. And they're not just going to miss it for a little while. They're going to miss it for all eternity. That's a shame. The truth of the matter is, God doesn't send anybody away from eternal life.

They just choose not to go. That's the sad part. Because, you see, they think they're already at the banquet. They think they're already finding the purpose of life.

They're successful. They're successful. They're successful. They're going to miss it. They're not just going to miss it for a little while. They're not just going to miss it for a little while. They're going to miss it for all eternity. That's a shame.

[40:15] The truth of the matter is, God doesn't send anybody away from eternal life. Finding the purpose of life, they're successful. They're prosperous. They've got a good job.

They've got a good family. Things are good. 1 Corinthians 13, verse 1, starts out by saying, If I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, but I don't have love, I'm nothing but a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal.

We can have all the gifts, all the abilities that make people go, Wow, we could be so good we'd get on America's Got Talent and make it through the third round. But if we don't have love, agape love, the love of God, the love of people, what's the point?

There's nothing wrong with success. Don't hear me criticizing that. There's nothing wrong with being wealthy. There's nothing wrong with having a good job. There's nothing wrong with having a good family.

Those are blessings. But they're not the blessing. They're just something we do here until we get to the real experience.

[41:25] Success in life is to experience joy, to experience acceptance, to experience love, or in other words, to have grace.

Nehemiah talked about banqueting together. In chapter 8 he said, Go and enjoy choice food and sweet drinks. Send some to those who have nothing prepared.

This day is sacred to our Lord. Don't grieve, for the joy of the Lord is our strength. Being with God, celebrating with God, is supposed to be a time of joy.

This is the day that the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad in it. Say rejoice. Rejoice. Yeah, some of you look like you're ready to go to sleep. See, that's the problem.

Too often church feels like, ah, let's go take a nap. Boring. You know, why is it boring to be with God, to be with people we love, to celebrate about God?

[42:23] The joy of the Lord is our strength. Not the misery. Not the criticism. Not the judging of people. Not getting everything perfect, standing up just when you're supposed to, sitting down when you're not.

Don't move the wrong way. That's not joy. That's a chore. And no wonder people aren't interested in that. I wouldn't want to go to that banquet either. Have you ever been to a boring party?

I have. I shouldn't say that, but I have. The best banquets aren't the ones that come off perfect, by the way. The best banquets aren't the ones where they have all these special things and special attractions and gadgets and widgets and things for you to do.

The best parties of all are the ones where you get to spend some time with the person who invited you. I've gone to parties where they've had spectacular opportunities for you to do something to have fun.

But if the host or hostess, the people that invited me, didn't come around, my wife will say, Boy, why didn't they come around? I felt like there was no reason to even go.

[43:30] And I've gone to parties that have nothing, just people sitting in a room. And I've had a wonderful time visiting and talking with people and spending the time. It's about being with the people we love.

That creates joy. Church is supposed to be a place of joy, of love, of celebrating God. Say, rejoice again.

Rejoice. It's good for you. It makes you feel better. And when you go to church, you're supposed to feel better. Not worse. This is only a taste of the banquet feast. Don't misunderstand.

This isn't as good as it gets. Pastor Tom sharing some story is not as good as it gets. Let me tell you, God is better. We've given the wrong image. We've also given the image that churches somehow says to us that we need to be a better.

God says to us that we have to be perfect. We have to impress other people. We have to be dressed just so. We have to stand just so. We have to act just so. We have to have certain behaviors.

[44:35] Behind the wall was a garden. This isn't the garden, by the way. The garden is back here. I don't know if you can see it. It's kind of messed up. The problem with a real garden is real gardens have problems.

They have difficulties. They have weeds. They have bugs. They have things that don't work right. If you want to have a perfect garden, you just get fake flowers. It's the truth. They'll be perfect.

Always. Out at Silver Lake, we have some real flowers in the garden down below. But up above in our flower boxes, we have fake flowers.

Those babies bloom in December. But I've got to tell you, nobody goes by and says, look at those incredible fake flowers. They look at the real flowers that Jackie grows down below.

They have problems. There's something wrong with them. They're not perfect. But they're alive. They're full of vitality. They smell. They feel. You have a sense that there's something important about this.

[45:33] And it's the same thing with churches. It's the same thing with God's kingdom. It's about having all sorts of different types of people. We have to have people in our world who think that they're good.

I've had people say that to me. Well, I'm a good person. No, you're not. You're not. You're not. I hate to really burst your bubble. You're not good. None of you are. Neither am I. Don't hear me criticizing you.

All have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God. And that's the problem. When we think we're good, we start to look at other people.

We start to compare to them. We start to believe that somehow we're good enough to make a claim on God for eternity. That we can say to God, you've got to give me eternal life because I'm good.

But you're not good. You see the problem? You're really not. None of us are. We're broken. And so he said, go out and find the marginalized people.

[46:39] The lame, the weak, the broken. The ones that people cast aside. Invite them and they're real people. Christianity isn't about perfection. It's about forgiveness.

That's what grace is. Grace is God saying, I know you're not good enough, but guess what? I'll take you anyway. Do you follow?

That's such a relief. See, unlike some people who think they're good, I know I'm not. I know I'm broken. I know I'm messed up. I know that whatever I put out here is just a facade for what's really bad here.

And by the way, that's the way it is with most people who are Christians. So we confess our brokenness. We do it every week in church, but we should do it every day in our lives.

God, I'm broken. I need your grace. God, the greatest host ever, the greatest being ever, accepts us and says, it's okay.

[47:53] Come on in to my party. Don't care what you dress like. Don't care what you look like. Don't care what you've done. Let's have a good time.

In Mark chapter eight, verse 35, it said, if you try to save your life, you'll lose it. But if you give up your life for Christ's sake, you'll save it.

When we try to win, we lose. But when we stop trying to win and let go and let God do what he wants to do for us, that's when we really win.

So here's what happens. We receive that grace. And grace tells us also that we're not supposed to keep on sinning. In fact, in the Bible, Jesus said, go and sin no more. We're supposed to try to do better.

So we were to try and do better. But then we start to think. So the key is to get rid of the sin in our lives and get rid of the sinners in our churches. You see how that all kind of gets messed up?

[48:56] And we forget who we are. And we start living like the like the plastic people. All we got to do is get rid of the weirdos, the problem people, the gawky people.

The big birds that are sitting on the wire. And that will be fine. Okay. There we go. We go to the little three. That's how our souls are dying!

See, grace is God's gift given to us. But so that we can offer grace to others. 1 Corinthians chapter 1, Paul says to us, God chose the foolish things of the world to shame the wise.

He chose the weak things of the world to shame the strong. He chose the lowly things of this world and the despised things and the things that are not to nullify the things that are so that no one may boast before him.

[51:04] So all the little birds who thought they were so special and so perfect find themselves having to hide behind the big, gawky, strange bird. Paul was concerned about the Jewish people.

He knew that they had rejected the grace of God, but he felt that somewhere in their hearts, they must, because they were seeking God, have the possibility of regaining grace.

So he writes about it in the 11th chapter of Romans, where he says this, Just as you Gentiles who were at one time disobedient to God have now received mercy as a result of their disobedience, so now they too, the Jews, have now become disobedient in order that they may now receive mercy as a result of God's mercy to you.

Or in other words, it's been turned around. The very people that thought they were perfect, that thought that they had the grace of God, all sewed up, now need to recognize their need for God and what grace really is.

Sometimes we can get so full of ourselves and so certain that everybody else is broken that we don't really see that the problem can be right in our own lives and hearts. We went on this mission trip to Michigan.

[52:21] It was sort of a punt. We kind of picked it at the last minute because the people in Tennessee couldn't take us. So Sherry called up some people there, and they said that we could come to the camp.

We had to work on these log cabins that they've reduced the rate because we couldn't afford their camp. And Sherry kept saying, we want to work in the community too. And basically the guy who ran it was more or less saying, no, I'm giving you a deal to work at our camp, you know, and giving her a lot of trouble.

In fact, he wasn't even very nice. And when we got there, he wasn't nice either. It was pretty rough, kind of short, almost like he didn't want us there.

He introduced us to the guy in charge of maintenance who was supposed to arrange all the projects, a guy named Mike. And Mike didn't seem very happy to have us either. You can imagine why.

Who needs a bunch of teenagers hanging around that are supposed to do work, and we all know that they'll spend three hours working, and then they'll take off to go swimming, and I'm going to spend more time and invest more money and effort in these kids than I'm going to get out of them.

[53:27] But they lined up the work. The first day, they hovered over Sherry's crew at the camp, watched every single thing they did, wouldn't let them hardly do any work because they had to make sure they would do it perfect.

They sent a guy out to watch us, too, on our site. They had given us a whole week's worth of work. By the second day, they left Sherry alone. They realized she could do it better than the guys they had assigned to her.

And they found out that we were done with our week's work by Tuesday afternoon, and they didn't know what to do with that. All of a sudden, we found ourselves with a lot more work, and we did the work, but that wasn't what really changed.

These two guys changed. They want to hang around with our kids. One came down to our campfire to hang out with us, talk to us, tell us stories, just be with us.

The other one took the kids out for ice cream, smiled and laughed. Changed. Because of the way they were treated. In fact, one fellow in charge said to me, you need to tell the kids how lucky they are to have some kids to grow up with that they've known all their lives to be so close to.

[54:37] And I said, these kids don't know each other. They don't even all come from the same church. Most of them have no idea who all these people are that they're with. They just decided to forget all these rules that the world has put in place and just live the way God calls us to live.

And accept everybody. Even the ones that everybody else may not. See, the truth is, when we act like Christians, when we give love, when we offer the grace we've received from God, it comes back our way.

And people change. The goal is to build a banquet of acceptance. Of love, of forgiveness, and of joy. Success is great.

I'm all for it. It's sort of like the icing on the cake. But the real heart of it all is in God's love and acceptance and joy. Back at that church I grew up in, there was this older couple.

We were probably all of about 20, 21 years old. Poor as church mice. That's an interesting statement, isn't it? Yeah, and we had nothing.

[55:58] And this couple who seemed to have everything, they were old people. I bet you they were in their 50s. And they came up to us and invited us to their house.

Carolyn Clarence, I remember them to this day. And you have no idea how excited we were to be invited just to dinner. They just thought they were just having this young couple over for dinner.

We were like, we have arrived. Somebody in church knows us, realizes we exist. You need to understand, I was baptized in that church.

I grew up in that church. I was confirmed in that church. I was married. But until I was in my 20s, I never felt like anybody said we were okay.

Until one couple decided to invite us and offer us grace. Didn't take everyone. And it won't take this little church to change somebody's lives.

[56:59] It just takes one of them to make something special happen. Now here's the real concern. Time is running out. Time is running out.

You know, it says it got kind of angry. The guy who was running the bank got kind of angry because people didn't show up. They ignored him. They dissed him. Have you ever had that happen? Have you ever given a party and the people don't come? I've done that.

Jackie and I have had those parties. And we get all the preparations. We do all the work. We send out the invitations. People say they're coming. And then they don't come. It's devastating. It's hurtful.

It says we don't really think you matter. So I try to go to every party again. I don't want to see the disappointment.

You know how hard it was to tell a 10-year-old boy, I won't come to your house for dinner? He knows I care about him. I gave him up yesterday. I don't care about him. It's hard.

[58:04] So God says, go out and find some other people that will come. Go out and get a lot of people. And people started responding. And he says, how are we doing?

And the guy said, well, the house isn't full yet. He says, go and wait some more. My house will be full. You know what that tells me? There's a number. I don't know what the number is. It's a big number.

But there's a number. Something else you might need to know about banquet. If you have a banquet, there's only so many you can invite. And when it's full, it's full. You can't invite anymore. I'm worried.

Because I think the banquet hall is getting full. Remember, this was written a couple thousand years ago. Since that time, we've had a whole lot of people being born. And we've got billions in this world today.

And I'm a little worried that the banquet hall is getting full and the people I care about, people that are out there doing their thing, worrying about their jobs, worrying about their success, worrying about everything but God, are going to be on the outside when that day comes.

[59:08] So it might feel awkward. It might even make you feel like that strange bird. But sometimes we just need to be the one that stands out, the one that shows up, the one that takes a moment to send the invitation.

We got some invitations, by the way, by the door. Handed them out last week, church. You know it says that if you invite somebody to church, 80% of them will come. That's how much they think of you.

And you can make the difference in what they think about God. You stood before creation Eternally in your hand You spoke the earth into motion My soul bound to stand You stood before my failure And carried the cross for my shame My sick weight upon your shoulders My soul bound to stand

What can I say? What can I do?
