Adopted into the family of God. You know what happens when you're adopted? I have my sister adopted two children.

Her husband's children. Their mother had died. This was many, many years ago. And when my sister and the two children and my brother-in-law stood before the judge and the decision was made and all the papers were signed and everything was complete, my sister became their mother.

Those children became her children. As if they had been born from her body, they became hers.

When we choose Christ, we are adopted into the family of God. Signed, sealed, and delivered.

[66:12] Isn't it amazing? We become God's children so we can have the hope of God's salvation, so we can have the peace that is beyond anything anyone can understand, so we can have the inner joy that is beyond the best happiness we could possibly imagine, that can only come from God and God's everlasting love.

Completely faithful love. Always with us. Love. As we continue into the time of celebrating Holy Communion, take a moment to consider a relationship with God.
