This is how the birth of Jesus the Messiah came about. His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together she was found to be pregnant through the Holy Spirit.

Because Joseph, her husband, was faithful to the law and yet did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly. But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit.

She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins. All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet, the virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Emmanuel, which means God with us.

[1:18] When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him, and took Mary home as his wife. But he did not consummate their marriage until she gave birth to a son, and he gave him the name Jesus.

But God appeared to him in a dream and said, it's okay, Joseph. It's my son that Mary's going to give birth to. So take her to be your wife and have a good life with her. So that's what he did.

So they got married. And they had a baby named Jesus. And they had a boy named Jude. And another one named James. And they also had some daughters, but we don't know their names.

[20:27] Today's scripture reading is from Matthew chapter 13, verses 24 through 30. Jesus told them another parable. The kingdom of heaven is like a man who sowed good seed in his field.

But while everyone was sleeping, his enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat and went away. When the wheat sprouted and formed heads, then the weeds also appeared.

The owner's servants came to him and said, Sir, didn't you sow good seed in your field? Where then did the weeds come from? An enemy did this, he replied.

The servants asked him, Do you want us to go and pull them up? No, he answered, because while you are pulling the weeds, you may uproot the wheat with them. Let both grow together until the harvest.

At that time, I will tell the harvesters, First collect the weeds and tie them in bundles to be burned. Then gather the wheat and bring it into my barn.

[21:29] This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God. Thank you, Elizabeth. Advent season.

We've been looking at the coming of Jesus. The coming of Jesus in Bethlehem. The coming of Jesus in our hearts. The coming of Jesus in glory to reclaim all of creation.

And each of these little stories or parables that Jesus told tells us a little something about the end times. And typically there is a division. The good go to glory.

The bad go to destruction. The wheat and the weeds. The good go to the Lord. Lately, I've noticed a lot of people have a lot of fears.

It seems to be coming pervasive in our culture. We read about it in the paper. We see it on TV. We experience it as we have discussions with one another.

[ 22:30 ] And it takes on all forms. This morning I was reading in the newspaper about how young Muslim women are feeling insecure about going out shopping. They make sure they go with two or three at a time because they're afraid that they'll be assaulted.

And at the same time as they're walking through the mall, I know we have people who are wondering what they're doing and concerned about them. Back when I worked for Chemlon, we used to go to this little tavern across the street.

And they would say to us that it was a biker bar. It was kind of a dangerous place. And I wondered why. They never gave us any trouble. And they said, well, because you're truck drivers. It's all a matter of impression, right?

Scary truck drivers can frighten those bikers. And the bikers kind of had us a little apprehensive. Joseph was afraid. He was afraid. His wife became pregnant.

I don't know what to do with that. They weren't even married yet, actually. They were just engaged. What would people say? He's a righteous man. He's a good fellow. He's religious.

[ 23:44 ] And not only that, there's this idea that this is God's son. Who wants to raise God's son? Really, you know? Little Jesus is getting out of line. You say, Jesus, straighten that out right.

Okay, whatever Jesus, whatever you want to do. Right? You want to be the stepchild to the son of God? He was afraid. And fear can cause us to have all sorts of emotions.

Sometimes we get angry. You know what they did to me? That anger can cause us maybe to react in ways in which we wouldn't otherwise.

Joseph was a righteous man. He thought, I'll put her away quietly. That's a merciful thing to do. We do that. We put away people who hurt us or cause us trouble.

My father and his brothers got into an argument about mistake. And so they didn't talk to each other for 20 years. They just disappeared from our lives. We had no idea where they went to.

[ 24:47 ] Sometimes people unfriend you. Is that what it's called? On Facebook. I've had people unfriend me. They just disappeared. Where did they go?

We put them away quietly so we don't have to face it. We don't have to think about it. We treat them like they're weeds in our garden. There were a bunch of seeds planted in a good field.

And all of a sudden the servants said they found a bunch of weeds there. And the servants came to God and said, how did they get there? Now we know, because this is one of the few parables that's interpreted.

It's in verse 36 through 43 of Matthew. It's interpreted. We know the servants are angels. They say, didn't you plant good seed, God? How did these bad people get there?

And there are evil people and evil thoughts and evil things in this world we live in. In the kingdom of God, there's evil.

[25:50] In fact, even in the church, we have this in our own lives. And just like the angels, we say, God, we want to wipe this out.

Take it away. Take it away. We can't stand to have this evil and the fear it produces in our midst. A young man was raised in Pendleton, New York.

Went to Star Point School. Graduated, went off and joined the military. Fought in Desert Storm. Received the Bronze Star. He was a hero. Came home and put 5,000 pounds of explosives in front of an Oklahoma building.

He killed 168 people. 15 of them children. 680 people wounded. Next to 9-11, the largest single act of terrorism in this country's history.

Take care of that place where he came from. People that would raise somebody like that. Everybody who lives in that Pendleton place should have something on their license. Saying that they should be feared.

[26:58] We should worry about them. What do we do? What do we do? Because the difficulty is we've got the good and the bad alike all mixed together.

And if we wipe it all out, what will we have? Proverbs chapter 15 says, God does not call us to stir up anger.

And yet fear can cause us to become angry. Fear can cause us to doubt. To doubt our relationship. To doubt what we believe. To doubt what we think about other people.

To doubt our God himself. Joseph was a righteous man. I can imagine him saying to himself, Why is this happening to me? God is good.

God is all powerful. How can there be this kind of evil in our world? The angels ask, How did this happen? And the answer that they get from the master is, The devil did it.

But don't you want to say, Yeah, but we read in the book, God, that you created everything. Which means you even created the devil, right? So it's your fault.

Hard. And then we have this passage where it says that he created everything and went away.

Like God's on vacation. Hello? I don't want a God on vacation. I don't know about you. I want a God on the job every minute, every day, 24-7. Amen?

I don't need some God off taking a nap or getting some time off here. Why is this evil? Mark goes back to the very beginning.

And it's really about what we let grow in our hearts and our lives. Seeds. Seeds can't grow unless you nurture them. You give them the nutrition. You give them water.

[29:13] You give them sunshine. And you give them an environment to live in. Without that, seeds would just sit there and do nothing. That's the nature of seeds. If we don't nurture them, they don't do anything.

So the problem is that somehow the seeds of evil have been nurtured. You see, these seeds were sown both for good and for evil before anything grew, before there was a plant in the earth.

God created the possibility for good. God created the possibility for good. God created us in his image.

God ultimately can do whatever God wants. That's what makes him God. God, so he has a choice. He has freedom to choose. And if he's going to make creatures in his image, he has to give them the ability to choose too, which means a real choice is not you can have that table or you can have that table.

You can have good or you can choose evil. It's only the possibility. It is only the possibility. People nurtured. People planted.

People gave birth to evil in this world. And to tell you the truth, the Bible says it caused the angels in heaven to fall. The devil himself. We gave it life.

We nurture evil along with the good and then wonder why there's bad in the world. And we blame everyone. Everyone else. Including God.

Seeds are the direction we choose our lives to go. What values we choose. To tell. My grandfather grew up in Germany.

He worked on the U-boats. Submarines. Submarines that probably during World War sunk American ships. And killed American soldiers.

My grandfather came over as a merchant marine. And when he was in New York City, he saw the gleaming city and he jumped off the boat and swam to the shore. He was an illegal alien.

[31:34] He worked hard. Tried to make a life for himself. Had a family. Became a U.S. citizen. And when our nation went to war, he sent four of his sons across on those boats that were in danger of the submarines that he had built.

To fight against his own country. It's very hard sometimes to figure out which are the good seed and which are the bad seed.

How do we know? How can we tell them apart? How can we tell them? The book of Matthew in chapter 5, Jesus says, You have heard that it was said, Love your neighbor and hate your enemy.

But somebody hearing this said, Well, who is my neighbor anyways? When I was in college, I used to attend an annual conference in downtown Pittsburgh.

One year, the keynote speaker ran an inner city ministry in Pittsburgh. And he was trying to communicate to us, 2000 white-collared college kids, the motivation behind his ministry.

[ 32:53 ] So he began to sing, he's got the whole world in his hands. And we all laughed, because the speaker was making an absolute fool of himself. But as he kept singing, he began to change the lyrics.

And rather than the whole world in his hands, he began to sing, he's got the pimps and the prostitutes in his hands.

And then, he's got the drug dealers and gangbangers in his hands. And you could feel the air go out of their room. Because just like that, 2000 college kids had their little church bubbles burst.

I mean, for 18 years, most of us had been taught that God cared about wearing the right church clothes, singing the right church songs, and saying the right church answers.

Never could we conceive that God loved the unlovable. At least, not in the way the speaker was suggesting. Our God is a great God.

[ 33:58] And he loves us in ways we'll never be able to imagine. He is great and mighty and just. Our God is a righteous God. But our God is also compassionate and merciful and gracious.

He loves us, but not so we can keep that love for ourselves. He loves us and empowers us to love the world around us. The world in which we live. To love the church goers, as well as those who curse God.

To love the pure of heart, as well as those who are anything but. It isn't a love reserved for any one group or any one kind of person. God loves the CEO just as much as he loves the unemployed.

God loves the teacher and the doctor and the lawyer just as much as he loves the addict and the gambler. God gave his son to the world that we might believe in him and live according to his word and be covered in his blood.

God loves the Lord. To what end? That we might go out into the world to love and to serve, to share his name and his glory with our neighbor.

[35:13] Who is our neighbor? Open your eyes and look around. Open your eyes and look around.

God says to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you. It goes on to say that God causes the rain to fall in the sun and to shine on the good and the bad alike.

If we want to be sons of the kingdom, children of the kingdom, we need to love like God does. It's hard. It's hard when we have weeds in the world.

How do we define them? How do we even know which one is a sinner and which one is a weed? I can tell the difference in your lawn between a piece of ryegrass, bluegrass, quackgrass, crabgrass, tall fescue, red fescue, poanna, St. Augustine, zoysiagrass, all sorts of grass.

I can tell the difference on them. When it gets to the garden, you can ask my wife. Because I like the weed that's rounded up. And there have been many, many times that I couldn't tell which was a weed and which was a flower.

[ 36:57 ] And so the wrong ones went to destruction. Only the angels seem to know who the weeds are. We don't know.

And even they're told to keep their hands off them. Because after all, 1 Corinthians says, Who knows the mind of someone else, their thoughts, except their own spirit within them?

Just like we don't really know fully the heart of God. I know someone would say, but Matthew says, You don't pick fruit from a thorn bush or figs from thistles.

Likewise, every good tree bears good fruit, but bad tree bears bad fruit. A good tree can't bear bad fruit, and a bad tree can't bear good fruit. Every tree that does not bear good fruit is cut down, thrown in the fire.

So by their fruits, you'll know them. I've had people in my life, and I imagine you have too, who have lied to me, talked behind their backs about me, stolen from me, slandered me, betrayed me.

[38:08] And a lot of them are in this congregation. In my family. In the group of people I call my friends.

It makes it so hard, doesn't it? That's what makes it so hard. I'm afraid that if I start whittling down the list of people that are weeds from wheat, I'll end up with just me.

And you all know that I'm not perfect. Here to make us blind. Joseph was told that the child was from the Holy Spirit.

But he didn't want to believe it. He's still afraid. The master says the weeds and the wheat are all intertwined.

Their roots are growing together. If you rip up one, you're going to rip up the other. If we attack one person, we're going to hurt another. How do we know which ones to weed out of our lives?

[39:20] My brother-in-law came to this country about 30 years ago. He was from the West Bank of Palestine. His father was, or uncle rather, was a high official in the Palestinian Liberation Organization, which at the time was considered a terrorist organization.

They followed him around and every time he went to an airport, he was stopped and was taken off to the side. Back then they did this thing called profiling. Not a bad idea in some ways.

He'd never done anything wrong. Not over there, not over here. He married my sister. Raised a family in this country.

And now he has top secret clearance with the government. He buys stuff. You know? So he's the guy they call and they say, the hammer's going to cost \$100.

The difference is, he doesn't say, okay. He says, I don't think so. I can get them at Helm Depot for like two and a half bucks, pal. You get your price down to \$3 or this isn't going to happen.

[ 40 : 26 ] He alone has probably saved this country a billion dollars just because he won't take the contracts. He tells them there's some other place to go. And they say, you can't do that. He says, no signature, no sale.

Simple as that. But he's from the West Bank. Doesn't look like the rest of my family in a lot of ways.

It's so hard. Our coworkers, our neighbors. Can we really trust them? Do we really know the people in our church?

Are you convinced that your family members have it all together? Who can you trust? If we get down to the righteous people, who will be left?

They did that once, you know. God decided he was going to get down to just the righteous people. There were eight people left that got on that boat. Are you convinced that out of the whole world's population, you're going to be one of the eight?

[41:23] I'm not. Heck, if it's 8,000, I'm not sure if I'd make the cut. It's hard. It's a real hard thing.

Do we even know ourselves what our hearts are about? Especially when in the book of Mark, Jesus says, no one is good except God alone.

And in the book of Romans, it says, all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God. I don't know if you're understanding this. You know who the weeds are. We're all weeds.

Every last one of us. You and me alike are weeds. The problem is we read this passage, and we think we're the good seed, and the weeds are over there.

We just got to get rid of them. But we're the weeds. There's a story Jesus told in another parable where he says a guy came in, and he owed his boss like \$5 million.

[42:24] There's no way he could pay it. So he got down on this. He says, I'm so sorry. I'm so sorry. Please, please don't throw me in jail. I've got a family. Please have mercy on me. And so his master said, okay, I'll forgive the debt.

I'll forgive the debt. Go ahead. Go away in peace. And it says he was walking out the door of his master's office, and he saw a guy owe him \$100, and he grabbed him out of the neck and said, you owe me \$100?

The guy said, please, please. I don't have it right now, but I've got a family and kids, so please just have mercy on me. The guy said, mercy on you? You are going to go to jail until you pay the last penny.

Oh, it's so easy. It's so easy to see how somebody else is a weed. But when we become a weed, we say to God, have mercy on me.

God. God. God looks down at this world.

[43:23] John 3.16. Anybody know what it says? Have you ever heard? Anybody ever hear that verse, John 3.16? I think it says something like, God was so disappointed with the world that he sent his son to destroy it, wipe it out, and start all over again, right?

God so loved the world that he gave his only son, his one and only son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life.

For God did not send his son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through it. I'm not naive.

I understand that there's times when nations will rise up against nations, and even the Bible has times when God has said it has to be so. I know that we need to have armies and police officers.

My wife is in the military. I know we need to have jails and prisons because when people cause so much harm that they're dangerous to the whole community, we need to do something about that.

[44:25] Keep people safe. Or we don't love our neighbors. I know sometimes parents need to look out for their children and see who they're going to hang with and who they're going to be around. I know that sometimes we find ourselves in court.

If something isn't right, if somebody has to make a decision and do something about this, I get that. I understand. I understand. sometimes we need to do what needs to be done.

Proverbs chapter 13 says, whoever spares the rod hates their children, but the one who loves their children is careful to discipline them.

But here's the point. discipline is meted out to change behaviors, to correct inappropriate behaviors. If you discipline a child or anyone with the intention of correcting their behaviors, that's a loving action.

But when you attack, assault, or hurt someone because you're angry and you're upset and full of fear and concern and it makes you feel better, that's abuse.

[45:42] That's abuse. Whether that abuse is done by a parent or by a friend, even by a nation, what God calls us to do is to share love, not fear.

I'm worried about the condition of the world too. I'm more concerned as a pastor about the condition of your soul and my soul and that we don't turn into darkness and become part of the problem ourselves.

God said, I'll do the weeding. Not us. Not even the angels. Some will go to fire.

Some will go to glory. That's the problem. And our goal is to make sure we go to glory. Not to worry about the ones going to the fire.

Romans chapter 12 tells us, Do not take revenge, my dear friends, but leave room for God's wrath. For it's written, It is mine to avenge. I will repay, says the Lord. Vengeance is expensive in time, in money, in mental anguish.

[ 46:56] Vengeance is something that uses religion like a tool to be hateful and hurtful and harmful to try and figure out the good from the bad.

That's what religion does. The good ones are here. The bad ones are there as if we know how to tell the difference. An angel appeared to Joseph and said, Don't be afraid.

I don't know how much you know about angels, but in the Bible there were two angels that appeared one time and they toasted entire cities, wiped them off the face of the earth. Two angels. If an angel appears to you, I would be shaken in my boots if it happened to me and hope that that angel says, Don't be afraid.

Don't be afraid. Don't be afraid of the one that can destroy your body, Jesus says. Be afraid of the one that can destroy your body and your soul in hell.

1 John chapter 4 tells us there's no fear in love. Perfect love drives out fear because fear has to do with going to the fire.

[48:09] We are not people of the fire. God says he allows the bad seed and the good seed to grow until the end.

You know, that really bothered me, though, because I thought, now, if the seeds are people, then that means people are bad from the beginning or good from the beginning, which means you were predestined to go to heaven or predestined to go to hell before you even started your journey on this earth.

And there's some Christians that believe that. That bothered me because I know seeds can't change, right? You can't change a plant once it's been planted. It's what it is. You can't make one plant become another plant.

Can you? Has anybody ever seen this tree outside our church door? I don't know if you can really tell, but that thing down below, it's not a bush. That's part of the tree.

Go look at it sometime. It is one of the weirdest looking trees on the face of the earth. I've had people say to me, we've got to get rid of that weird tree. It doesn't know what it is. It doesn't know which kind it's supposed to be.

But I've got to tell you, I love this tree. I love this tree because this tree says to me, there is always hope. There is always the possibility that when I'm broken and when I'm dark and when I'm going the wrong way, God could turn me around.

He could change me. The way he describes it in the Bible is called grafting. You take another good plant and you graft it into the bad one. Now you notice they're both growing, right?

So we have to decide which we're going to nurture. Which are we going to give life to? Are we going to be people who give life to fear and anger and darkness and pain?

Are we going to listen to that? To the angel? He said, don't be afraid. Don't be afraid to let love drive out fear.

Don't be afraid to live the way Jesus lived. Don't be afraid because God can take you through the storm and God will decide in the end who needs to go to one or the other.
