Hear our hearts and prayer for those we desperately love. for those who are dealing with and struggling with COVID.

For those who find themselves watching over loved ones in the night. For those who are recovering from surgery.

For those who are traveling and gathering for Thanksgiving. Lord, we ask you wrap us in your safety and your comfort so that we may love you and love the world as you have called us.

[27:30] In Jesus' name we pray. Amen. You know, this is a lot of boxes.

I thought maybe when I was sitting here I could figure out how many there were. I can't. It's a lot. And I want us to imagine that in any one of these boxes will be very likely the only Christmas gifts that a child somewhere will receive. So let us send them in prayer. Oh Lord, we ask you to carry these boxes with your spirit. All the servants that lift and pack and crate and ship may they touch them with love.

This morning's scripture is from the book of Hebrews. It's chapter 3, verses 1 through 6, then 12 through 14. Therefore, brothers and sisters who are partners in the heavenly calling, think about Jesus, the apostle and high priest of our confession.

Jesus was faithful to the one who appointed him, just like Moses was faithful in God's house. But he deserves greater glory than Moses in the same way that the builder of the house deserves more honor than the house itself.

Every house is built by someone, but God is the builder of everything. Moses was faithful in all God's house as a servant in order to affirm the things that would be spoken later.

But Jesus was faithful over God's house as a son. We are his house if we hold on to the confidence and the pride that our hope gives us.

[30:20] Watch out, brothers and sisters, so that none of you have an evil, unfaithful heart that abandons the living God. Instead, encourage each other every day as long as it is called today so that none of you become insensitive to God because of sin's deception.

We are partners with Christ, but only if we hold on to the confidence we had in the beginning until the end. This is the word of our Lord.

Thanks be to God. The question I've been asked to speak to today is my relationship with Pendleton Center Church and my faith.

Why is it so important that I am a part of this congregation and how has this congregation helped me keep my confidence and faith in Christ, keep moving forward?

There's parts of my life many of you don't know. I walked in the doors of this church, a broken woman. A loss, family, wandering, and asking, why God?

[31:45] Why me? And the most beautiful part was Dorothy Getty, Ollie Burbage, Dorothy.

They all stepped forward. They didn't ask why you're here. They didn't ask about my past. They said, welcome.

The first time for me to have that happen. and my heart goes, what have these people got? They've got something I don't have a handle on.

Yes, I was a Christian, but I certainly didn't know how important and how much Christ could give to a person. So the years went by and the same people said, we love you, we care about you, and more of the congregation continued to say the same.

They helped me grow in my faith with Christ. And as I grew, my confidence that all things are possible through Jesus Christ began to take a firm hold on my heart.

[33:03] It is because of you in this church, the people, the pastors, the missions, the missions, that I have become a stronger Christian and I have learned give over to Christ.

Give over to God your worries and all the issues that you think change who you are. They mean nothing to Christ or God.

You are loved for who you are. And I grew in that confidence. I grew as a Christian and am the woman that you see today.

That I find to be the most powerful for this church. You as the congregation are so impressive and strong in your faith.

Some might be early in it, some might be late, but we've all learned, close the door, don't look back.

[34:10] Christ is with you. And yes, I cry. It's a beautiful cry because the joy, the joy of knowing Christ and that he walks with me is so awesome.

Becky. So until yesterday, I didn't know what I was going to say to you.

I really struggled and I didn't know what to say. I read scripture and I read commentary and I tried to figure out how I was going to tie in the scripture reading with standing on the promises of God and talking to you about stewardship.

And I decided to pick up a different Bible and I picked up the message and our scripture reading in the message says, my dear Christian friends, companions in following this call to the heights, take a good hard look at Jesus.

He's the centerpiece of everything we believe. Faithful in everything God gave him to do. Moses was also faithful but Jesus gets more honor.

[35:38] A builder is more valuable than a building any day. Every house has a builder but the builder behind them all is God. Moses did a good job in God's house but it was all servant work getting things ready to what was to come.

Christ his son is in charge of the house. And I thought about that, the fact that every house has a builder but God made everything. And I know that pastors have talked a lot during the pandemic and especially when we couldn't be together that the church is not the house of God.

Right? The world is the house of God. And so we are God's servants and we're entrusted with certain responsibilities and we can choose to be faithful in our responsibility or we can choose to ignore it.

So think about when you are given something precious to hold on to. There's an expectation from that person of how that item should be handled and how it should be cared for.

So I know when people get up here to talk about stewardship in church, we tune out, we think all they're going to talk to me about is giving money. But stewardship is about so much more from money.

[36:56] It has a much broader definition and if we really understood it, we could give more glory to God. So what exactly is that stewardship?

And the stewardship definition given by Kenneth Boa in his book Conformed to His Image is one of my favorites. He says, we own nothing and we're not here on our own business.

As stewards, we manage the possessions of another. As ambassadors, we manage the affairs of another. The king owns everything and we are in his business to serve and represent him in the world.

So a steward is someone who's been entrusted with something and everything we have comes from God and we're expected to properly utilize, manage, and multiply what he's given us.

Stewardship is a criteria used to establish that effectiveness of God's servants. God simply asks, are you faithful or faithless with your gifts and talents?

[38:07] The ultimate goal of stewardship is to hear what we hear in Matthews 25 verse 21. His master replied, well done, good and faithful servant.

You have been faithful with a few things and I will put you in charge of many things. Come and share your master's happiness. The goal of stewardship is to act in a way that's consistent with how God would act if he was the one that was in possession of those items, of those gifts.

God gives us opportunities. He gives us relationships, gifts, jobs, families, the environment, resources, and even money to glorify God.

But how we choose to use those items is completely up to us. God's promise to us, if we have been good stewards, if we have been good with the few things that God has given us, God will give us so much more not only in heaven, but here on earth.

The Bible is full of stories of people who are good at stewardship. Moses is described as one who oversaw the affairs of God's house. The house obviously wasn't the temple, as the temple had not been built.

[39:27] The house is that metaphor that tells us about the relationship between God and man. And the world is in fact that house of God.

We hear that this is not true of my servant Moses. He is faithful in all my house. And in our scripture reading today, even Jesus was evaluated based on his successful stewardship in the house of God.

These were both powerful men, strong in their faith, and willing to cross the lines that were acceptable to use their gifts, to use their talents to help others.

One of my favorite movies is the Ten Commandments with Charlton Heston. And I never forget the image of him as Moses parting the sea, saying, behold the mighty hand of God.

And this is a powerful image in the belief of the gifts given by God and what we can do. Recently, I've been reading a book called Mothers in Israel.

[40:30] And this book talks about how the Methodist church started. But it's through the eyes of women. So think about where we might be now if Susanna Wesley wasn't such a good steward of the gifts she was given.

She was the spiritual director, the educator, the preacher, the worship leader of her family, and her husband Samuel's congregations. She modeled Christian leadership and love so much that the core of our Methodist movement is that love that she showed to others.

Her son, John Wesley, appreciated and recognized the many roles of women in the church. He appointed women like Margaret Burnside and Mary Vanderplank to visit the sick and to teach other women.

Sarah Ryan became a Methodist class leader and preacher in addition to her role of housekeeper, offering her hospitality to anyone who needed it. And Sarah Crosby, one of the first Methodist preachers, was encouraged to build friendships and watch over her sheep.

They were encouraged by both John and Charles Wesley to look outside the box and beyond what was seen as normal behavior, to use their gifts and talents to serve God and to be good stewards of what they have been given.

[41:55] So growing up in the method of church, there have been so many people who have taught me not only what my gifts are, but how to use them and how to develop them.

And even in my short time here at Pendleton, we have such wonderful examples in our congregation. And our videos these couple weeks have shown what difference saying hello, writing cards can make.

We have Nancy and Tom who do such a wonderful job with the music every week. And that music uplifts our hearts and helps us enjoy God.

Sandy and DJ do a wonderful job with dinners and outreach and helping people using their gifts to reach those in need. Anna has a passion and a gift for ministry.

And look at the wonderful Operation Christmas Child work she did. There are going to be so many children blessed this year. And Becky and so many other people who help with angel wings and find ways to find gifts that they've received and offer that blessings out to others.

[43:09] The Adrians working with the youth and the Putneys and Carl organizing the fish fries, using his talents to glorify God and help build up this church.

So after the past, over the past few weeks we have heard from several people about why they're involved here in Pendleton and who made a difference in their lives.

And during the youth service we heard from Madison about how the youth serve the church and show stewardship. And you were challenged by her to get involved.

The most valuable thing that we have is our time. We can always make more money, but time is precious and we can't make more of it. Living your life as a steward of God's grace means recognizing that everything comes from God and all that we have is God's.

And I know that sometimes it can feel overwhelming to consider adding one more thing to the busy schedules that we have. Making that commitment to serve, sing, or maybe teach Sunday school might feel overwhelming, but you don't have to make a long term commitment.

[44:26] Think about what you have fun doing. Start small. With Becky it started with someone saying hello, welcome, we love you. We heard from the Putneys, Ollie's smiles and her welcoming when they came in.

Start small and maybe your involvement will be able to grow one day. The scriptures invite us to see that by the grace of God we have more than enough in our lives to overflow into a new way of living.

It connects the faith we profess to the ordinary ways that we use our time and our talents to live our lives. Think about how you interact with the people in your life every day.

Whether it's at work, at school, at home, in your community. How can you mirror Christ's generous, abundant, joy-filled, hopeful love?

How can your lives reflect love, justice, mercy, and faithfulness? It's important that everything that we do with our time and our talents reflect our walk with Christ.

[45:39] We could also reflect on how we give time and talents back to God just as we do with our money. Stewardship isn't just a time in the church, it's a way of living.

God is the giver, but we learned that when we give to God, there's no guarantee that life will suddenly be wonderful and without pain. When we give, we're still tested.

We have this building, this congregation, and this world that we're required to be good stewards of. And we need to be reminded that God doesn't need our money.

But when we do give, Jesus bends our hearts towards greater generosity. And generous people are the ones who are able to go out and change the world.

You haven't lived until you've done something for someone who can never repay you. In 2 Corinthians, we hear, each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give.

[46:42] Not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things, all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work.

Many of the parables that Jesus speaks to us about are about money or material possessions. Jesus talks about money because he knows how personal it is to us.

Stewardship of treasure is not about giving to a need, but rather it's about the need of each of us to give. Stewardship is living out a commitment to be Christ-centered rather than self-centered.

And it's important for us to share our money and our gifts and our material possessions because all the good things God has made are meant to be shared. And we need to return thanks to a loving God for the many blessings that each of us have received.

And often during this time of year, people say, how much am I expected to give? But the question that stewardship asks you is, how much are you expected to give?

[48:10] But how much do you want to give? It means giving from the heart as a response to our faith. We should give personally. No other person can tell you how to give, how to use your talents.

But as we seek God in prayer, God will direct us. If we have a sincere desire to be a steward, and if we're giving out of worship, gratitude, and trust, we need to simply listen to God.

If giving's an issue between us and God, then it's also crucial that we give willingly. At times, we will need to pray for a willing and eager spirit, just as we do about any ministry or any other area in our life.

Part of giving willingly as worship to God is the fact that God is some very personal sense. God loves a cheerful giver. So there's a story about a dad and his son.

And the dad gives his son two coins, a dime and a quarter. And he tells his son that he should give one in the Sunday school offering and that he can keep the other coin.

[49:23] But the father reminded him, remember, God loves a cheerful giver. And later that day, the dad asks his son which coin the child had given.

And he replied, well, dad, you said God loves a cheerful giver. And I decided that I'd be more cheerful if I kept the quarter. We naturally think we would indeed be more cheerful keeping or spending as much as possible on ourselves or using our talents to benefit our family or ourselves.

But if we've already lived that way, keeping and spending, how cheerful has it truly made you? If God is working in our heart to produce a new attitude giving based on stewardship, contentment, trust and worship, what God wants us to know very clearly is that we will never regret it.

They tell us that the general principle is exactly what Jesus taught. God blesses givers. Whoever sows generously will also reap generously.

God blesses givers. And God has promised that we will always have enough to live on, that you will abound in every good work and will enlarge the harvest of your righteousness.

[50:48] God will also supply and increase the store of your seed and you will be made rich in every way so that you can be generous on every occasion. People will praise God for your obedience to God and generosity.

generosity. And in their prayers for you, their hearts will go out to you because of the grace that God has given you. We're promised that eternal rewards are placed on our accounts, that those are rewards waiting for us in heaven.

And we have the privilege of pleasing God. And God promises that all of our needs, including money, will be supplied by him. God will meet all of your needs according to his glorious riches in Christ Jesus.

All means all. God is promising not only material blessings, but this is a much better promise than even the Old Testament promise of those material blessings.

It's a promise of incredible blessings throughout our life, whether it's the friendship that we've made or the people that we've reached or the joy that comes from giving to another.

[52:04] Will our life still be hard at times? Yes. Will it actually be hard for us to give at times? Yes. Will we have doubts and fears about giving?

Yes. But God will bless us and we can just leave that part up to God. If we're privileged to live the kind of life that's described above, we will be so richly blessed.

To appreciate God's rewards, sometimes we need to adjust our expectations. And we often hear those that teach about God's will that Christians should be wealthy to appeal the selfishness of their hearts.

They suppose that godliness means financial gain. But the problem with thinking that way is that if we were meant to give in order to live selfishly, we forfeit the real rewards that God has promised.

There's a quote attributed to Winston Churchill. We make a living by what we get, but we make a life by what we give. I think all of us are making a living, but how much of us are making a true life in Christ.

[53:21] Please pray with me. Generous and loving God, we come to you in thanksgiving, knowing all that we are and all that we have is a gift from you.

In faith and love, help us to do your will. We are listening. Speak your words into the depth of our souls that we can hear you clearly.

We offer to you this day all the times of our lives, whether it be at home, at work, or school. We seek to be patient, to be merciful, to be generous, to live holy.

Give us the wisdom and insight to understand your will for us and the passion to carry out our good intentions. we offer our gifts of time, talent, and possessions to you as a true act of faith to reflect our love for you and our neighbors.

Help us to reach out to others as you have reached out to us. Amen. As we consider the promises that God has made to us, let us open our hearts as we prepare to receive one of God's great gifts, and it reminds us of all of God's promises as we come to the Lord's table.
