I'm so excited to hear about that because the Bible tells us to always give thanks. In Psalm 107, and I'll bet some of you remember this verse, the Bible says, Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good.

His love endures forever. That's Psalm 107, verse 1. I have a picture that shows what I'm thankful for.

[20:21] See, and it says, Thank you, Jesus. And there's a cross that looks like the cross that we have in the church. And there are people who look kind of like a family.

We pray for your love, the love of God to be shed abroad in all of our hearts, and that it would not return to us empty, but that it would be filled, that we would be filled with your love, and that we could be vessels that help others to see how to be filled with your love too.

We pray for mercy, Lord God, for all of us as we have all caused hurt to someone at some point in time.

Today's reading is from Ecclesiastes, chapter 4, verses 4 through 12. And I saw that all toil and all achievement spring from one person's envy of another.

This too is meaningless, a chasing after the wind. Fools fold their hands and ruin themselves. Better one handful with tranquility than two handfuls with toil and chasing after the wind.

[39:33] Again I saw something meaningless under the sun. There was a man all alone. He had neither son nor brother. There was no end to his toil, yet his eyes were not content with his wealth.

For whom am I toiling, he asked. And why am I depriving myself of enjoyment? This too is meaningless, a miserable business. Two are better than one because they have good return for their labor.

If either of them falls down, one can help the other up. But pity anyone who falls and has no one to help them up. Also, if two lie down together, they will keep warm.

But how can one keep warm alone? Though one may be overpowered, two can defend themselves. A cord of three strands is not quickly broken. This is the word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God. People ask me, what are you going to do when you retire? Well, I thought I'm going to work on the house. I'm going to work on my family.

[40:34] I'm going to work on friendships. All those things I didn't have time for. Out at the lake, I need to fix my porch. I need to gut my kitchen. I need to put a vapor barrier underneath the cottage.

Finish off closets and guest rooms. And oh, there's so much work. And work can bring joy. Or work can feel like miserable toil.

Verse 4 said, I saw all the toil and all the achievement spring from one person's envy of another. This too is meaningless. A chasing after the wind.

How much of the work we do is caused by what other people think of us? It could be people we love and care about or people we don't even know. It's kind of meaningless to worry about what strangers think.

I understand worrying about what God thinks, about what our friends, our family think. There's going to be people in your life that five years from now, 20 years from now, are going to be essential to your life.

[41:37] But then there's going to be people that are just going to pass through your life. And you'll never see again. Why do we spend so much time worrying about them? And yet we do. In verse 6, it talks about tranquility.

Better one handful with tranquility than two handfuls with toil and a chasing after the wind. Tranquility comes when we're content, when we're comfortable with what we have, or probably just as important, probably more important, who we have in our lives.

During this sermon series, we're going to talk about loving the Lord our God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength. How do we love God and fulfill that greatest commandment?

How do we love God with all our heart? Verse 8, it says, There was a man who was all alone. He didn't have a son or a brother. There was no end to his toil, yet his eyes were not content from all his wealth.

For whom am I toiling? He asked. And why am I depriving myself enjoyment? This, too, is meaningless. A miserable business.

[43:00] It's not good to be alone. It says that right in the beginning of the Bible in Genesis. It's not good for people to be alone. What we do, and who we are, in many ways, is wrapped up in loving God with all our heart and doing likewise with other people.

Remember the second command? And love your neighbor as yourself. How do we love God? God is wrapped up in how we love our neighbor, how we treat the people around us.

I like it when people go by our house and say, Oh, we love your house. It's so beautiful. Makes me happy. But that's only a house.

There's a difference between a house and a home. There's a difference between a structure we work on, maybe that others might admire, and a home we create so people can enjoy and live and love there.

And the same thing happens in this passage. He says, I saw that all toil and all achievement spring from one person's envy of another person.

[44:15] When we live in envy, we live in brokenness. In verse 9, it says, Two are better than one because they have a good return from their labor. It's good that we have someone in our lives, a partner.

The Bible refers to it as a helpmate. A helpmate. We have a lot of things going on right now in our world. We have a lot of people who are feeling brokenness and pain and hurt.

We see it in the nightly news. We see it in the relationships with one another when we talk about all this protest and riots.

The protests are designed to give our concern for what we think is wrong. Riots are designed to hurt somebody that we feel has something we don't think they deserve.

One is based in trying to make a better partnership. And the other is based in envy and brokenness.

[45:27] I know that there's a lot of difficulty. And I also know that most people don't wake up in the morning and say they're going to do something bad. No one says it's all right for me to go this morning and kneel on somebody's neck and kill them.

But it happened. I'm sure that police officer in Buffalo who pushed that 75-year-old man didn't wake up in the morning and say, I'm going to get some old person today.

But it happened. Brokenness is a part of our lives. And loving one another is figuring out a way to break through the brokenness.

The brokenness that either we cause intentionally or the brokenness that we cause unintentionally. Genesis chapter 2 verse 18 said that God saw that people were alone and said, I will make a suitable helpmate for them.

A suitable helpmate. A partner for their life. Someone to walk beside them so that they're stronger and healthier. In verse 10 it says, Two are better, this is verse 9, it says, Two are better than one because they have a good return for their labor.

[46:55] If either of them falls down, one can help the other up. But pity anyone who falls and has no one to help them up. Life has its struggles.

I think what troubled us the most about seeing that elderly man laying on the pavement was that no one right away went to help them up.

I know. I saw the one police officer started to. But he was pulled back. He was told, No, that's not your job. There's an EMT coming. They'll take care of that.

It's hard. It's hard. When I was a young pastor, I was told, If you want to be the pastor of a large church, you have to learn that your job is to be a general, which means that your job is to lead the troops and not worry about the people that are broken along the way.

That's for the medics to take care of. I'm sure that that's what those police officers were thinking that day. There's someone coming to take care of that. But it's hard when somebody's left alone.

[47:59] And it feels like there's no one to help them up. Sometimes life is a struggle. But it says in verse 12, The one may be overpowered.

Two can defend themselves. And a cord of three strands is not quickly broken. Standing together makes us stronger. But we need to start with love.

We need to start with looking for the best motives and the best intentions and the best possibilities in each other instead of seeing each other with suspicion.

Instead of seeing the other person as somehow being someone who's likely to hurt you. And that's hard. Because we were raised to be suspicious.

Don't talk to strangers. Be careful around those people. If you hang with bad apples, you're going to be one. We were told to learn how to discriminate in our culture and look for people that might be harmful to us.

[49:05] So we start with suspicion. We're caught in a trap. I can't walk out Because I love you too much, baby Why can't you see What you're doing to me When you don't believe a word I'm saying We can't go on together With suspicious minds We need to learn How to see the best in each other How to love first You know Jesus even said Love your enemy And pray for those who persecute you So we need to find a way Through the brokenness In verse 8 It says to us A man was all alone Had no one to work with We work with each other

And we tend to do it for each other But when we work separately And for our own designs Envy builds up and tears us down As compared to appreciation Which builds us up I remember years ago My wife and I In the early spring We would work like crazy And really The only reason we were doing it Is because my parents Were going to come up from the south And we could say See what we did And they said Good job Appreciation Seeing the best in people Looking Looking for what's right about people Before we Start looking for what's broken If you have a person In your life That you have a problem with If you start out With something good And then tell the criticism And then end with something good They call it the sandwich approach

Usually you'll have people Listen to you more But when we start out On the attack And on the assault That's not starting with love That's not loving our neighbor As ourselves That's not treating each other The way we'd want to be treated And remember how we treat The people made in God's images The way we treat God So it's not really even loving God In verse 7 Solomon who wrote this book Says Again I saw something meaningless Under the sun You know The entire book of Ecclesiastes He keeps saying Everything's meaningless Work and toil are meaningless Going out and having fun Is meaningless All our efforts Everything we learn Is meaningless In the end He points to a lot Of meaningless things So as we read The book of Ecclesiastes We're looking for something Where Solomon Will give us some hope Some possibility And he gives it to us In chapter 3 In chapter 3 Verse 12 We read A gift from God

There's a difference Between a job And a vocation I've worked both A job is what we do Because we get money And that's the only reason We do it And if somebody Stopped giving us money We'd stop doing the job And in fact If we had enough money We'd stop doing the job Probably a lot of you Have worked that Maybe some of you Are still in that situation A vocation Is something that Touches our soul Touches our heart It's what God Created us to be And there's a difference Because if we find Our vocation Then we find something Where we can enjoy Enjoy the work Of our hands Enjoy what we do Have a good meal Have something to drink I went out And ate on a patio Yesterday It was new It was great I enjoyed it It's amazing How much we've missed The idea of just being Able to sit And have a normal meal Eat and drink And enjoy the work you do Because you spend A lot of time In your work In verse 9

It talks about synergy It says that Two are better than one Because they get A good return For their labor Partly because They get appreciation Which we talked about earlier But also because There's a synergy One plus one Equals three Sometimes when we Work together We can accomplish Far more than we Can accomplish By working two people Separate Because we take The gifts of one person And we multiply Our efforts When I used to work With my father Or even my brother-in-law At the cottage I'm left-handed So I would I would hammer Along a ladder Like this And I'd get to A certain point Where I'd hand the hammer To my father Who would then take it And keep going If I had to do it myself I would have to Keep down And go up the ladder And climb the ladder And it would have Taken me twice as long Because I couldn't Reach what he could reach I couldn't do What he could do We were made For each other We were made To complete each other

If either of them Falls down One can help The other up But pity anyone Who falls And has no one To help them up We need helpmates And we need to be Helpmates To people of this world And not just the people That we know Or we live with But everyone in this world The reason why We're upset about These scenes That we see In our nightly news Is because When we see someone Who is helpless And falling down We want someone To help them up That's all Now that doesn't mean That therefore We should get so angry That we go ahead And destroy somebody else Synergy is not Based on Destruction Destruction But we have a lot Of people Who are feeling Right now As if Things around them Are not working Highest unemployment I've ever seen In my life And I saw High unemployment In the 1970s

Especially amongst Young people Young people Who were just Getting their life started Just starting to feel Like maybe they had A future And a possibility And somebody pulled it out From under them People at the lowest Levels of our culture People who are At the poorest point In life Who don't have jobs Where they can work From home Who can't work safely And either they are In a situation Where they have to go out And work in some Dangerous place Or they're told You can't work at all Of course They're feeling angry They're feeling upset And they're feeling envy For those who are comfortable And I understand that But part of the problem is Is we're caught In that trap Suspicious minds A lie That the culture tells us That if we could get A fancy house If we could get Enough money Then we would be successful But no amount of money No nice house Nothing like that

Gives us contentment The purpose of life The purpose of life Goes beyond that It has so much more to do With the people in our world And of course God I see why Solomon Can say that life feels Like you're chasing After the wind Like it's meaningless Like it has no purpose Envy Envy Even the man in verse 8 Who had so much And was wealthy But was alone Just one That's what the word Alone means Right All you have is one Alone One is the loneliest number To be alone It causes people to feel That somehow they're broken And so While yes We need to figure out Ways that we can work Towards equity

And yes We need to look for ways In which we can take People who are Who are feeling Oppressed or hopeless And helpless And try to help them out And lift them up We also Need to embrace One another Because that Is going to lead To a lot more Value And meaning And purpose And contentment Than any accomplishment We might have Verse 4 It says This is Meaningless A chasing After The wind A vapor An empty air That's what meaningless That's what the original word meant A vapor An empty air In verse 11 It says If two lie down together They'll keep warm But how can one keep warm Alone We know what that means But have you ever thought about it We give off heat We all do In the church here

We have to have air conditioners When we get too many people in here Because it gets too hot Not from the sun From each other Because we generate 98 degree temperatures Think about that On a 70 degree day We love it It's comfortable But when it gets up to 98 None of us are happy That's how much heat We all produce But what happens If we produce that by ourselves It just goes into the air It's meaningless It has no value No purpose But if we generate it With each other We can warm each other And warm each other's souls And each other's heart Because loving our neighbor Is as Jesus taught us Is about being sacrificial It says in the writings of Paul Consider Consider other people To be more important Than yourself Jesus was sacrificial In his love He gave of himself And taught us To do the same Remember King David King David had a friend His name was Jonathan Jonathan was the crown prince

Of Israel He was King Saul's son He was designed And designated To inherit the throne
Of the whole country David in the meantime Had been anointed By the prophet To
become king Over Israel Jonathan and David Were friends David didn't want Jonathan's
throne And Jonathan didn't care If David got his Hear that Jonathan didn't care If his friend
Got the throne That was his By right How many of us Could live that way?

I don't care Doesn't matter What I have is yours And what you have is mine My wife and I Have that relationship I don't own something She doesn't own She doesn't own something I don't own We share it together Do we do that with People around us?

Do we do that with Our closest friends? Do we do that with Our family? Or do we say It's mine It's mine And we build On envy Instead of appreciation And love What would happen If we loved first?

Loved first Solomon Points to many Meaningless things And then he tells us What's meaningful Remember that From chapter 3 I know that There is nothing Better for people Than to be happy And do good While they live That each of them May eat and drink And find satisfaction In all their toil This is a gift of God But he goes on He says I know that Everything God does Will endure forever Nothing can be added to it And nothing taken from it God does it So that people Will fear him Now We struggle with that Word fear Don't we?

We struggle With that word fear And I understand it We don't like To be afraid Why do certain people Make us feel fear? Why are there Certain people Whether it be The uniform they wear Whether it be The way they dress Maybe the way they talk Or where they come from The color of their skin Why do we feel fear?

But that word In that passage Doesn't mean the fear We're thinking of What it really [62:00] means Is it means respect Or to hold God God in awe God is awesome God is amazing So the people Will think that God is awesome God is amazing And yet God So loved the world That he gave his only son Sacrificed him For us Who are broken We don't mean To be a lot of times Just like All these people Who didn't mean To do wrong Even the people Who are rioting I'm sure If they were standing In front of the shop owners Of the people Who put their life work Into this little business And realizing They were destroying A life They probably Wouldn't have done it

> We don't mean To do these broken things We don't mean To push someone But we do Because We're broken But God Gives us the answer To how We can be Repaired The purpose of life Is to love God Connect Deeply With God I was watching Television the other day And it was interesting Because a Lieutenant governor I think it was from Texas And I'm not sure Was down there And he's literally Preaching a sermon He's saying The whole problem With all of this Is that people Don't have God In their hearts If they got the love Of God In their hearts We wouldn't have Half these problems I think that's True I think that's true In this passage In verse 4 And I never really Saw it this way Before Until I looked Closer at the At the actual Meaning of the words

> It says This too Is meaningless A chasing After the wind What the original Words say Is that This too Is vacuous It's a vapor Chasing after The ruha Of God Some of you Have heard me Use that word Before The ruha Of God Now the word Ruha In Hebrew Means The wind But it can also Mean the spirit Or the breath Chasing after The spirit Of God Chasing after The breath Of God Wow That means Something different Doesn't it That everything We do In life Everything We envy About each other Everything We think We're striving For that matters So much Doesn't mean Anything Compared to If we can Catch The breath Of God The spirit The Holy Spirit The power Of God Everything else Is empty Air

Compared To the breath Of life Of God The purpose Of life Is connecting To God That amazing Awesome God On a deeper Level Imagine How deep We could go If we would Love God With all our Heart Heart When we talk In our church About loving God With our Heart Soul Mind And strength We say Our heart To love God With all Our heart Means To love God With our Relationships With other People What if All our Heart Was based On love What if We began With love In our heart What if We began With the Spirit Of God To A God speeches and that's what people call them and that's what they call him but his actual title was the reverend dr martin luther king ir because he wasn't giving speeches he was giving sermons he wasn't bringing people to a political point he was bringing people to the power of the living god and that's why he preached we are not going to be violent with one another we're going to show love i heard one of the police officers say we don't have a problem with the protest when the preachers are here so long as the preachers are here there's no violence it only starts when the preachers leave fascinating even people that aren't feeling that connection to god see god is awesome psalm 68 says to us god is a father to the fatherless a defender of widows that's god in his holy dwelling god sets the lonely and families he leads out the prisoners with singing but the rebellious live in a sun-scorched land god wants us to be a part of a family a family that's the purpose of the reason we have friendships why we have families why we have a church it's so that we can belong to someone somewhere i had a friend who's been living in the south who came up north and they were walking by our porch i was sitting on the front porch and they said hello to me they said we need to get together we'll socially distance they suggested their their uh little porch of course their little porch is only about two feet two three feet wide i said how about ours it's 10 12 feet wide you can sit in that chair and be socially distanced from me we want to get together we want to be with friends because that's what's going to make my house a home if all it is is a grand palace i've made for other people to walk by and go wow it's so amazing i've accomplished nothing just vacuous vapor but if we make it a place of love then we've accomplished everything and that's true with our homes with our families with our friends with our neighbors with the people we don't even know we don't know with our church i've had other people stop by to talk to me i don't know who they are people just want to talk to me because i'm sitting on the front porch evidently when i sit on the front porch i'm telling everybody my heart is open i'm here to talk to you and visit with you if i want to get something done i got to go somewhere else because this is a place i come to be with other people and it's true it's true it's good to have family it's good to have a tribe it's good to have a church

a home away from home and i miss all of you i really do i don't like preaching to a camera I'm not enjoying this i said to someone earlier today i said you know for 35 years i preached to real people and now i'm preaching to a camera i this is the way i want things to be but it's the way it is it's not the worship i miss because we are worshiping i miss gathering at the table with you but what i really miss is i miss the people i really do i miss seeing you i miss talking to you i miss that we would touch hands we'd say a few words we'd smile at each other and somehow that little moment we'd share together i don't know about you but for me it transformed my day and invariably i'd leave this place with a smile on my face and even more a smile on my heart but i was reading an article about a fellow in the newspaper who actually traveled from here to west virginia because he wanted to go to church and he said he had to wait outside he had to he had to register to go to church the day before and so when he got to the church his name had to be on the list or he couldn't come in and then they had to wear a mask they couldn't sing they couldn't do all the things that everybody does you can't talk to anybody you can't hug anybody there's no shaking hands and you got to wait your turn going out now i just want you to picture that that you're standing out in front of the church waiting your turn to come into the church and you hear somebody you know as a friend and love and care about and i've gone to church with for years and and they're they're one or two six foot spaces behind you and you hear somebody say to him i'm sorry but we're full you can't come in we've reached our quota you'll have to try again next week that's not church people wonder why haven't we just opened up the doors because you want us to be back to what we were and right now because we love each other and we don't want to endanger each other we're not comfortable doing that i'm not comfortable with putting 300 people in this room and finding out that one of them really was sick and infected 30 or 40 people and somebody we love dies and i don't think anybody would come here intentionally to do that but if you haven't picked it up yet there's a lot of things we do wrong and we don't do it intentionally so we have to act first with love everything else is a meaningless vapor it's pentecost it's a time of year when we focus on the holy spirit of god the power of the church is not that we always agree we don't i can tell you right now i've heard people say that at their dinner table they have one person arguing this way and the other purple purpose person arguing that way we don't even agree in our families i know we don't all agree i know especially when we start to see brokenness and pain and hurt and struggle like we're seeing right now and and we're seeing people's lives crushed and falling apart i know it's hard to agree the power in this church has not been that we always agree not that we're a uniform one body that all thinks exactly the same there's only one thing we feel the same about and that is we deeply want to breathe the holy spirit of god let god come into our hearts and into our lives and when we love the god in our hearts and see it in each other then all this meaningless stuff becomes a vapor that disappears

and we can learn to love each other in spite of each other in spite of our failings in spite of who we are because we let god come into our lives and change us god is welcome here just meaning this building he's welcome here and when god is welcome here then the god in you and the god in me will always agree love your neighbor as yourself and in doing so you will love god and experience the ruha the holy spirit the fire of god of god There's nothing worth more that will ever come close

Step into the gap And be a voice That tries to be part of the solution We do that by loving with all of our heart When we talk about loving God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength Our heart love is when we love each other What we do for the people around us So look around you Maybe what you can do is something very local Maybe you can mow a neighbor's lawn Or maybe you can write a note to someone Maybe you can make a phone call Or maybe you can be involved in a much deeper and much greater way And you can be a leading voice that will bring change Renewal and strength God calls us To be the people who step in to the brokenness Step into the gap To bring healing Because we, of all people Lead with love We lead with love We look for the best in others

So that we can try to lift that up And make that what we're going to be And what we're going to do Unfortunately Even people who lead with love Will often fail In my sermon I said I haven't had time for my family Who sits down and says I don't want to take time with my family Well, of course I've taken time with my family But I want to spend more There's places in our lives where we look and we say I failed to be the person I intended to be I failed to be the person God called me to be And the good news is this That God accepts us even in our brokenness And he calls us to accept each other Even when we fail And we fail So let's take our brokenness before God In a prayer of confession, shall we?

Dear God in heaven I have sinned Sometimes by what I do on purpose And sometimes because I failed to do what's right Without even realizing it Forgive me, Lord Transform me Transform me Open my mind And open my heart To love To love others As you have loved me Bless us, Lord Help us to turn away from sin Change our lives In Jesus name we pray Amen Jesus said If that we earnestly repent And desire to change and do what's right And if we confess that we're broken and need his grace That he will forgive us

Which means today he has taken you and made you perfect again Wherever you failed Wherever you didn't live up to what the expectation was That maybe even you had for yourself God says It's okay You're perfect again It's time to start our lives Living into the love that God wants us to live for one another And to begin by allowing God to love ourselves So that we can love others In the name of Jesus Christ your sins are forgiven Glory to God Amen Glory to God Amen And now Lord pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here Pour it into our hearts and transform us and change us Help us to experience your Holy Spirit and the power The breath of God the Ruha Help us to be a transforming change For this world around us Help us to be a blessing Lord

That we might be the strength of God For the world That we might be the hands the feet The actions of the living God In this struggling world That we might bring peace and hope And grace and especially love That we might bring you To the world Be with us this day and always as we offer our prayers In the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit Amen And now as Jesus taught his disciples to pray Let us join together in saying Our Father who art in heaven Hallowed be thy name Thy kingdom come Thy will be done On earth as it is in heaven Give us this day our daily bread And forgive us our trespasses As we forgive those who trespass against us And lead us not into temptation But deliver us from evil For thine is the kingdom And the power And the glory forever and ever

Amen Blessed be the time that binds Our hearts in Christian love The fellowship of kindred minds Is like to that above Before our Father's throne Before our Father's throne We pour our ardent prayers Our fears, our hopes, our aims, our won Our comforts and our cares

We share each other's woes Our mutual burdens bear And often more each other blows A sympathizing tea When we asunder part When we asunder part It gives us inward pain But we shall still be joined in heart And hope to meet again Some people think the mark of Christianity is that people somehow live a perfect life The mark of Christianity is that we know we're not perfect We know we fail And we know that the only way we can be made perfect is through the grace of Jesus Christ
