[21:25] In Jesus' name we pray. Amen. Shall we hear from the word of the Lord? Good morning. Our reading this morning is from John 5, verses 1 through 15.

Some time later, Jesus went up to Jerusalem for a feast of the Jews. Now, there is in Jerusalem near the Sheep Gate a pool, which in Aramaic is called Bethesda, and which is surrounded by five covered colonnades.

Here, a great number of disabled people used to lie. The blind, the lame, the paralyzed.

One who had been there had been an invalid for 38 years. When Jesus saw him lying there and learned that he had been in this condition for a long time, he asked him, Do you want to get well?

Sir, the invalid replied, I am no one to help me into the pool when the water is stirred. While I am trying to get in, someone else goes down ahead of me.

[22:53] Then Jesus said to him, Get up, pick up your mat, and walk. At once the man was cured.

He picked up his mat and walked. The day on which this took place was a Sabbath, and so the Jews said to the man who had been healed, It is the Sabbath.

The law forbids you to carry a mat. But he replied, The man who made me well said to me, Pick up your mat and walk. So they asked him, Who was this fellow who told you to pick it up and walk?

The man who was healed had no idea who it was, for Jesus had slipped away into the crowd that was there. Later, Jesus found him at the temple and said to him, See, you are well again.

Stop sinning or something worse may happen to you. The man went away and told the Jews that it was Jesus who had made him well. This is the word of the Lord.

[24:03] Thank you, Julene. And we're talking about miracle living for the next few weeks. And we begin miracle living by understanding the ancient confession, Jesus Christ is Lord and Savior.

We're going to talk about that this morning. As we look at this passage where Jesus went to a festival. Anybody go to a festival this summer? I mean, I don't know how you can live in western New York and not go to a festival. They're like everywhere, right?

So picture Jesus is going to a festival, you know? They're going to have a good time. He sees the pool of water. Hey, cannonball time, right? Then he sees all these people, broken people.

People who can't walk, can't see. Struggling people. What a depressing experience. I mean, when you go to celebrate and you find broken people, it's hard to celebrate.

And when you're feeling broken, it's hard to be around people who are celebrating. Sometimes we struggle with the joys and the sadnesses when they mix together.

[25:15] A number of years ago, there was a movie called Forrest Gump. Some of you have seen it. And in the movie, Forrest rescues a bunch of people in the war. And so they give him the Medal of Honor and they put him on TV. And as he's walking around New York City afterwards, he actually runs into his former commander, Lieutenant Dan, who was one of the guys who he rescued.

Lieutenant Dan had been injured in the war. And so you'd think this would be a great reunion. But Lieutenant Dan sees him and says, really, dude, they gave you the Medal of Honor? Seriously? They gave you the Medal of Honor.

And so Forrest and Lieutenant Dan wander around New York City. Dan said he was living in a hotel. And because he didn't have no legs, he spent most of his time exercising his arms.

Everybody is talking at me. Hang on, hang on. I don't care what they're saying. What do you do here, New York, Lieutenant Dan?

I'm living off the government too. People stop him. Hey, hey, hey! Are you flying? I'm walking here. Ah, get out!

[26:26] Come on, come on, come on. Have you found Jesus yet, Dump? I didn't know I was supposed to be looking for him, so... That's all these cripples down at the VA.

That's all they ever talk about. Jesus this and Jesus that. Have I found Jesus?

They even had a priest come and talk to me. He said, God is listening, but I have to help myself. Now, if I accept Jesus into my heart, I'll get to walk beside him in the kingdom of heaven.

Did you hear what I said? Walk beside him in the kingdom of heaven. I'm going to heaven, Lieutenant Dan.

Huh? Huh? Huh? There's a guy you want to hang around with, isn't it? Real life of the party kind of a guy.

[27:38] Jesus is walking around in a festival. Everybody's having a wonderful time, and he comes across this guy who's been handicapped, it says, for 38 years.

Unable to walk. Every day he comes to this place where they say, if you go in the pool, when the water's stirred, you'll be healed. Now, I have to imagine somebody was healed along the line, so they had hope.

38 years. Day after day after day. 38 years coming, and nothing happens. It's hard when we feel broken.

Most of you know I grew up in a household with a person who had a handicap. That's what we called it back then. Now, I think we're supposed to say physically challenged. I'm not sure. The truth of the matter is, I grew up with one of those wheelchairs because my mother got polio at the age of 24 before I was born.

What you may not know is that when I met my wife, she said, there's something I need to tell you about my father. He's handicapped. My father-in-law was driving a bread truck for work, and those doors that slide back and forth, he kind of got rocking, and his leg got taken off.

[29:01] So he went through life without a leg, and oddly enough, my wife and I met, and we understood each other. We understood that doors had to be a certain width.

We understood that you had to keep things out of the way. We understood you don't put marbles anywhere, and you pick up the acorns when you see them because when you only have one foot, you better not roll on something on the ground.

So Jesus comes up to this guy. In verse 6, he says to him, do you want to get well? I just watched the picture. I've been there 38 years.

You know, unable to walk. And some guy says, do you want to get well? Are you kidding? Seriously, dude, did you just ask me that? Do I want to get well? You know, look, I sit here day after day.

I try to get down in the water. Somebody else gets there before me. They get healed. I don't get healed. I see the miracles, but I don't experience them. And you come to me and ask me, do I want to get well?

[30:05] What do you think? You think I like being sick? You think I like being broken? You think I like hurting? Being poor?

No work? Problems for my family, my children? But Jesus asked him. He asked us the same question, you know.

Do you want to be well? Well, so Jesus reaches down and heals him. Because Jesus Christ is our Savior.

He makes the man walk. Because God can do more than we can do. What's impossible with people, it says in the scripture, is possible with God.

He heals him. And when I say he heals him, the guy hasn't walked for 38 years. Now, if you know anything about bodies, even if you have good, healthy legs, if you don't use them for 38 years, they don't work.

[31:05] They'd be like rubber. I saw a movie clip on this once where they had Jesus reaching down to basically pick him up. No, the dude must have felt the strength going through his legs, and he stood up, picked up his mat, and walked away.

Immediately it was healed. No PT, no prosthesis, no crutches, just healed. It's a miracle. A man come to me Thursday night at our Thursday night dinner, and I say, so how you doing today?

He says, this is a terrible day. He says, I've been in such horrific pain all day. I've got this problem with my nerves in my back. And they say that I could get surgery, but it only helped me for two or three months, so I don't see the point.

So I just try to put up with the pain. He says, do you believe in praying for healing? Do I believe in praying for healing?

Of course I believe in praying for healing. Do I believe miracles happen? Do I believe that people can be physically healed? Absolutely I believe it. I have seen it.

[32:11] I've seen people that they say are going to die. We had a little baby once. My wife and I went to pray for her, and the doctors all said she'll never live. She graduated high school a few years ago. I've seen people who have brain damage have it healed.

I've seen people see their hearts healed, their hands healed, their eyesight. I've seen people cured of diseases that they were told they'd never be cured of. We don't just do these prayers up here for show or to make you feel good.

We do them because we believe it works. I believe in miracles. They don't always happen, but I believe in them. So I pray with this man.

that his pain would go away. Because I believe that Jesus Christ is our Savior. I believe that Jesus can do things that are amazing.

I believe that the God that made something out of nothing can make something out of us. Amen? Some people don't think of God as a Savior. They only think of God as our Lord.

You know, he's got rules. He's got order and structure. He's there to keep us in line. And if we obey the rules, then things will be okay. And if we don't, we'll get whacked.

No healing, no hope, no forgiveness, no joy. God of religion. Religion is not a bad thing, you know. It's like the fence you put around your backyard.

You put a fence around your backyard because you've got a little kid that you don't want them to run out in the street, right? Now the truth is, you don't have to keep them out of the front yard. You just got to keep them out of the street, right? You put up the fence to keep them from getting anywhere near getting squished, right?

It's the same, I'm sorry, that's a phrase I learned from my daughter when she was a little girl. She said to me, she came in one day and she said, Daddy, when somebody gets squished out in the street, can we look inside and see Jesus?

I think that's cute. Anyway, sorry about that. You put the fence up to keep your child safe. But the real danger is not the front yard, it's the streets.

[34:21] See, religion is the same way. We make these rules to keep us from getting to what's really bad, what's really hurtful. But the rules are made for us, not to hurt us, but to help us.

Jesus said, the Sabbath is made for people, not people for the Sabbath. These people come up to the guy and go, dude, why are you carrying your mat? Fair enough question, it's a Sabbath, you're not supposed to work.

He says, well, because, you know, this guy healed me and told me to pick up my mat. Now, what should they be saying? Really? You were 38 years unable to walk and you were healed? Praise the Lord!

I was like, dude, that's wrong. That's bad. Seriously, can you imagine it? That's bad. See, because we put the fence up to keep us safe and then we think the fence is there to keep people out and somehow be a barrier to God's grace which is just for us.

So the religious people got all up in his face. I'm more concerned about Jesus breaking this little tiny law which isn't even in the Bible, by the way. It just says, remember the Sabbath, keep it holy and don't work.

[35:26] And you know why? Because, honestly, if you don't have one day a week you're supposed to remember Jesus, you'll forget him. You're so busy. And if you don't take one day to stop working, some of you people work yourself into the ground.

It's for you. It's for you. But they don't get that. So they make rules to contain the power of God.

When my mother was younger, she'd do weird things. I remember one time she rode a bicycle. That's kind of hard when you only got one leg that works, right?

But she did it. Another time she skied down the mountainside. She used to go bowling all the time. My father-in-law would go golfing or swimming or things like that. Now you know what they'd say today.

If they found out that was happening, we can't have you doing that. You know how much liability there'd be having somebody who's handicapped like that going down the mountain. You're not allowed on those ski slopes. Right? We got rules against this kind of stuff.

[36:27] Got to keep people in line. Religion is good. We don't worship religion. We worship Jesus Christ who is our Savior. Sometimes we misunderstand what God's all about.

There's a verse in 1 Corinthians chapter 6 that drives lots of Christians nuts. It says, everything is permissible for me. That just makes the rule people go crazy. What does that mean? It can't really mean that.

It can't possibly mean that you could do anything. Anything you've ever done wrong, God can forgive. The rules are not to contain you.

They're to help you. Drives people nuts. No. There's got to be black and white. There has to be cause and effect. Now you want to know what's really frustrating about this story is that this guy never once said he believed in Jesus.

Never once said he believed in God. Never once said he had faith or anything. Jesus says, if you want to be well, he says, it's not fair because I don't get through the water. It's not my fault. I'm not. Well, never once says I believe Lord or anything and Jesus says, okay, get up and walk.

[37:34] Really? Really? We got faithful people going to church every single day and doing everything they can to work for God. They don't get any miracle. This poor guy just laid on the ground and just, don't go ahead. Get healed. The Bible says God causes the rain to fall and the sun to shine and the good and the bad and the like because God is merciful.

God is loving beyond what we can imagine. God is a savior. God is good and all the time. We need Jesus to be our savior but we also need him to be our Lord and some people don't want a Lord.

They just want the savior part. You know? They want the one that can do all the cool stuff. Which is greater? Superman or Jesus? If they had a contest, which one would win?

Right? You know? I mean, we do this kind of stuff. Like we'll set it up. It's religion against science. Like they're competing. They're both aiming for the truth. You know? We're on the same team. So are Superman and Jesus by the way in case you were wondering.

But we want a super God. We want a magic genie God. It says in here that Jesus disappeared into the crowd. Not my Jesus.

[38:45] What is your image of Jesus? He's probably about six foot three. Right? Got long blonde flowing hair. Blue eyes. He kind of warped out from Scandinavia somehow into the Middle East.

Right? Big strong guy. He'd stand out in a crowd. He's got that gaze. And besides, there's that little halo floating around his head. Right? That's what Jesus looks like, isn't it? He can't just be some guy who looks like anybody else in the Middle East with, you know, dark hair, dark eyes, and just sort of probably about this tall.

slipped into the crowd. Man, you're messing with my Jesus. You can't do that. We want Santa Claus Jesus.

Chief Grace. Not a Lord. Not someone who's got an expectation from us, but someone who will just give us all the bennies and not ask for anything in return. If you were healed like this guy, I mean, literally, you couldn't walk for 38 years and somebody made it all of a sudden.

My knee has kind of given me trouble lately. Man, if somebody made my knee better, I'd be like, thank you. I'd want to go and talk to them and figure out how they did it. What do I need to know? Right? Not to mention, I'd be following around Jesus just in case it wore off, right?

[39:58] So he could do it again. Right? Because what happens if this is only a temporary thing? I need another fix. I'd be on this guy like, glue. He's like, whatever.

Yeah. They even pay attention to Jesus. He doesn't even know what he looks like or where he went or what he's about. Jesus finally finds him. Right? In verse 14, he goes up to him and he says, you've been made well.

Now stop sinning or something else will happen to you. Whoa, Jesus, a little rough, a little harsh here, dude. That's the way to greet me. You're not supposed to tell me not to sin. You're not supposed to get messing in my life.

What are you doing getting up in my face? Sin, you see, leads to brokenness. God has the rules on purpose because we need to have these kind of things to keep us safe.

God didn't make the rules to hurt us. He made the rules to guide us and help us and keep us from getting into brokenness. We don't like it when God messes with our lives, when he interferes with who we are, when you're in the wrong place with the wrong people making the wrong decisions, doing the wrong things, and God says to repent or turn around, change your ways, we say, I don't think so.

[41:10] Then we wonder why everything goes wrong. 1 Corinthians 6 says, all things are permissible, but not everything is beneficial. Everything is permissible for me, but I won't be mastered by anything.

Don't you like the greatness over here, by the way, you guys? Living in the dark all this time. I ain't got nice. Right? Rejective. Everything is permissible, but that doesn't mean everything is good.

Just because God can forgive you a sin doesn't mean you should go out and start doing it because it leads to brokenness. But we don't want to hear that stuff from God.

We don't want a Lord. We want a super Jesus, a savior Jesus, a genie Jesus, and we resent when God messes with our lives. So you know what this guy did? You know how he showed his gratitude to Jesus?

He blew him in to the guys who wanted to arrest him, the guys who wanted to kill him. He knew they were after Jesus, so what did they say? He said, I can tell you where the guy is. Seriously, he blew him in.

[42:13] Unbelievable. We follow God so that we can do what God wants us to do in our lives? Do we only see God as our personal genie who gives us whatever we want like Christian gimme pigs?

I had a pastor I was listening to one time. He's got a large church somewhere and he talked about how he was going on vacation and he wanted to go to this church and hear this preacher preach. We read his books and heard all kinds of things about him.

So when he got to town, he found out that the preacher wasn't going to be in church that morning. So instead, Sunday morning, he went to the gym. He said it was a better use of his time. Seriously, a better use of his time.

You see, that's because we think coming to church is about us. We think it's about hearing a good sermon, getting a message that inspires or helps us. It's about the beautiful music.

It's about, I'm going to tell you the truth, the music can be awful. The sermon can put you to sleep. You can go out of here feeling like nothing really special happened and if you came here to worship God, you did what you're supposed to do.

[43:19] Amen? Amen? Not that that's what we're trying to do, but that's what it's supposed to be. We come.

You know who the audience is in church? It's God. Not you. We're all here to worship him. Jesus Christ is our Lord and our Savior.

The part of the problem is is what we want from God isn't always what we need. Do you want to be made well? That's a hard question, isn't it?

Well doesn't mean everything's going to be perfect. Well doesn't mean that you're going to get it the way you want it. Well means that your life will be made what it needs to be made. My father-in-law lost his leg in a truck accident.

And actually, the way I hear the story, he was bleeding out. He had lost so much blood that the doctors told his wife, he's not going to make it. He's going to die. So my mother-in-law went in to him, this young woman in her 20s, grabbed ahold of him by the collar and said, you're not dying on me.

[44:34] Leave me with this little baby. You live. I think he scared her more, she scared him more than death. And he left. I remember him telling me that in those dark days, he thought he was going to spend his life sitting on a street corner in New York City selling pencils in a cup.

But he went back to Coward and he got himself a good job. Not only did he make a good living, a lot better than he would have driving a bread truck, but he became an example.

Not simply because he overcame this handicap, but because he became a person people wanted to follow, wanted to listen to, wanted to learn from. Dare I say it, his handicap made him a better man.

God gives us what we need, not always what we want. Being made well is a lot more than physical health.

The problem with Lieutenant Dan that you saw on that clip was not that he was in a wheelchair. It was that this man was depressing. He is broken. He's hurting. He's all beat up in his mind, in his heart.

[45:50] He has no passion. He's just, done. Jesus finds this man and says, you're well.

Don't sin anymore. Don't go back into the brokenness. Don't go back into the destruction and the pain. You're well. Bethesda means house of mercy.

The fascinating thing is we want these miracles from Jesus so that my knee won't hurt anymore. The greatest miracle occurs every single week when God does a blessing through us.

We pray to God. We confess our brokenness. Then the pastor says, in the name of Jesus Christ, your sins are forgiven. Then you say, I don't know if you know, but that's when you forgive my sins.

I don't know if you're broken. Okay? Because I know how broken I am. And you fix me. You fix me. Through the grace of God, we become well.

[46:58] Do we want to live into that? Or do we want to live into brokenness? Are we going to let that really take heart and be well again and live in miracle living or go back into a world of pain?

This man can walk, but he's still broken. He's not whole. He has bitterness and resentment and depression and anger. And those hold us a lot more than any physical handicap that we might have.

Too many people want half of Jesus. They want a Lord with all the rules and structure. Or they want a miracle worker who will fix everything but expect nothing of us.

Jesus wants us to have a complete God. Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength. With everything you are.

And miracle living begins. The joy of the Lord is my strength. It was fascinating because I was going to show that first clip and leave this one out.

We get our priorities right. We have a complete Jesus, Lord and Savior. Back when my mother was younger and I was a little boy that sometimes talked about my mother being crippled.

My father-in-law was a cripple. They never got their legs back. They weren't able to use them. She ended up not even being able to use the crutches anymore and had to stay in a wheelchair at the end of her life.

You see, crippled people are people that are broken. My mother lived a full life. In fact, I was born after her. My wife was born after her father.

In fact, I wouldn't have that woman if he didn't keep going. You see? Being made well is not getting our bodies healed. It's getting our life restored.

There's people out here who aren't broken at all physically but you're handicapped. You're crippled. You're messed up. You need to turn away from that brokenness. Repent and let God make you well.

I know he can do it because God made something out of nothing. He made people out of dirt. If he can do that, he can fix you and me and make us something to do.
