[19:59] Give us your wisdom. Lead us in your direction. Make your voice strong and open our ears to receive you and know which way you are leading us.

Set us on the right path. Lord, we thank you and we trust you for all things. And we will praise your name in all times.

For you are good and you are mighty and you are loving and we trust in you. This day and every day. Amen. Now let's hear from the word of the Lord.

Good morning. This is Luke chapter 1 verses 26 through 38. In the sixth month of Elizabeth's pregnancy, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David.

The virgin's name was Mary. The angel went to her and said, Greetings you who are highly favored. The Lord is with you. Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be.

[21:21] But the angel said to her, Do not be afraid, Mary. You have found favor with God. You will conceive and give birth to a son. You are to call him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High.

The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David. He will reign over Jacob's descendants forever. His kingdom will never end. How will this be, Mary asked the angel, since I am a virgin?

The angel answered, The Holy Spirit will come on you and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the Holy One to be born will be called the Son of God. Even Elizabeth, your relative, is going to have a child in her old age, and she who is said to be unable to conceive in her sixth month.

For no word from God will ever fail. I am the Lord's servant, Mary answered. May your word to me be fulfilled. Then the angel left her. This is the word of the Lord.

Thanks to be God. All I want for Christmas is my two fronties, my two fronties.

You know, I've been going to the dentist. I get more worried that that song is going to be true. What do you want for Christmas? What gift are you looking for? We've got gifts over here by the tree.

What kind of gift do you want? Does it come in a big bag like this one? Or maybe in a little tiny package. Some people say the best things come in little boxes.

This is actually our Good Samaritan effort to help the people who might not get gifts this year, our children. So there are tags out there. And if you'd like to help someone for Christmas, I think there's still some left.

So this is the last week. We'd appreciate you helping with that. You know, the truth of the matter is we all like gifts. It's nice to open something up. It's nice to have a smile on your face, especially when it's one of those, you know, just perfect gifts that was chosen for you.

Christmas is about what God gives to us. He gives us his love, which gives us confidence and hope and peace and purpose and joy and value. In the book of 1 Corinthians, it says faith, hope, and love.

[23:31] But the greatest of these is love. So this morning and through this series we've been looking at, I want to talk about how we experience God's love in our lives and how we then learn to love one another.

Because God wants to have a love affair with you. God chose Mary before Mary chose God. And God chose you.

You know, God chose you before you were even born. God knew you before you were even born. In the book of Jeremiah it says, Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you.

Before you were born, I set you apart and appointed you as a prophet to the nations. Before you even came into existence in this world, God chose to be in love with you.

God came to Mary. In the form of an angel who said, God is with you. God is with you.

[24 : 36] And because of that, you are highly favored. Now actually, in this little verse, there's two Greek words. One is chiero and the other is chierto.

Chierto. I don't know. I'm not Greek. You know, something like that. Chiero simply means rejoice. Marry. Be glad. Be like amazingly, overwhelmingly glad.

Because God has chosen you. It says that she's highly favored. But actually, the word means highly graced. Highly graced by God.

The love of God is amazing. When we experience the living God, it transforms our entire way of thinking. In fact, I don't know how you really get through this life as a Christian without the experience of the living God in your life.

Because it's so truly amazing. In Ephesians chapter 1, Paul talks about it and says, Praise be to God and the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing in Christ.

[25:49] For he chose us. For he chose us in him. Before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight. God chose us.

Before he created any of this, he chose you. And decided that he was going to be in love with you. As a holy and blameless part of his creation.

The gifts of God are amazing. Take away our sin and our guilt. Offer us eternal life. Peace and goodness and hope and purpose and joy. And especially his presence in the Holy Spirit.

It's the most wonderful time of the year. We love that song, don't we? Kind of lifts us up. Why is this the most wonderful time of the year?

Because it's at this time of the year, especially that we remember, that Jesus is Emmanuel. He's with us. We don't come to worship some dead deity.

[26:51] We come to experience the living God. Amen? And that's a powerful experience. And what God calls us to is a love that in the Bible, he uses the Greek word agape, which means a love that goes both ways.

A relationship. An experience of love with God. God chooses us. The amazing thing is that the God of the universe wants to be in relationship with us.

It's like when my wife took an interest in me. People say, why did I get married so young? Because I did get married young. I was 19. And I said, because when someone that incredible decides they're interested in you, you don't pass for somebody else.

It doesn't work that way. Hello? I knew I was going several grades above my station. God has chosen us.

And that's even more incredible. Jesus was willing to give up who he was for us. It says in here that Jesus is called the Savior.

[28:04] What does it mean that he's a Savior? It means that he saved us from our brokenness. Saved us from our corruption. Saved us from our pain and our hopelessness.

In the book of Romans chapter 5, it says, God demonstrated his own love for us in this. While we were still sinners, Christ died for us. God didn't go to the cross for us because we were so good.

God didn't choose us because we somehow were wonderful people. It says Mary was troubled by this greeting as we might. Highly graced. Highly favored.

How do you get to that status? We don't get to that status. God gives that to us. He was willing to die to his right to have only perfect creations.

So that he could be in relationship. Be in love with us. We're highly favored. Highly graced. A choice of God. The problem is, is some people see that as a one-way relationship.

[29:13] God loves us. We do whatever. God gives us great gifts. We just say, give me some more. And the unfortunate part is, is one-way relationships, they lead to abuse.

If one party is giving of themselves completely and sacrificially and loving the other person completely, and the other party is only loving themselves, we end up with a relationship that is hurtful, painful, abusive.

And the truth is, is some people actually want to have an abusive relationship with God. Real love. Agape love requires both parties to be in love.

That's true with God, even. That we need to love God as much as he loved us. The greatest commandment of all is to what? Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength.

God asks us to love in return. I want a hippopotamus for Christmas. Only hippopotamus will do. Can you imagine that? Just imagine you wake up in the morning, there's a hippopotamus in your living room.

[30:28] What would you even do with such a thing? And I can't even imagine the mess it would make. In many, many ways, on many, many levels, which we're not even going to go into. Why would you want a hippopotamus?

Well, because I want it. You see, this is the way we become. We become a culture that's about, what do I get out of this relationship?

God offers his grace. And in the Christian faith, we say it's free. It's a gift that God has given to us, which is true, because we can't take it. We can't seize it.

We can't earn it. We can't buy it. It's only something that we receive because God is gracious enough to give it. But it comes with an expectation.

It comes with some sort of price. But the price in and of itself is a blessing. I make the coffee in our house.

You know, I don't know how many of you make coffee, but I make the coffee, because without the coffee, we don't go. That's kind of the way our world works. I admit I am addicted. All right? I need this stuff to wake up in the morning.

So I set the coffee maker at night, and I make the coffee, and I set the timer, which I love the timer, because I'm old enough to remember the time there was no timer. There's nothing worse than getting up in the morning and having to make the coffee.

Every once in a while, my wife will get up, and she gets up far before me to go to work with the military, and she will let me know on a little note, you forgot to set the timer on the coffee.

Every really rare circumstance, it will say, you forgot to add the water or even make the coffee. That happens, too.

I don't make the coffee because my wife forces me to. It's not like she somehow said, if I don't make the coffee, our marriage is over or something like that. I make the coffee because I can imagine what it feels like to get up in the morning, and have a great cup of coffee.

You know, that's why we give gifts at Christmas. Believe it or not, we give the gifts so that we can see somebody go, this is perfect. You know, when I have the opportunity to have a cup of coffee in the morning with my wife, sometimes she'll say, coffee doesn't taste right this morning.

I go, oh. At other times, she'll go, boy, the coffee's really good this morning. I'm like, do you know what I'm saying? The truth is, is that we do this, and there is a cost to relationships.

We give of ourselves, but we give of ourselves in such a way that we also have that gift returned to us. The Bible says it's better to give than to receive.

Mary was offered a gift. As she said in her own song, she will be the most blessed woman of all history because of what she does here. Is there any woman that has ever existed on the face of the earth that's more famous than Mary, the mother of Jesus?

Jesus, the Holy Spirit will come on you and make you pregnant. What? Can you imagine this?

[33:55] A young woman, and she's sitting there. She's engaged to be married. She lives in a kind of remote little village called Nazareth, and an angel says to her she's going to get pregnant by God.

Right about there, I'd be going, wait a minute. What's this going to mean? How's Joseph going to receive this news?

Will the people in the village rejoice that God made me pregnant, or will they say that I was, you know, not faithful to Joe? Which they did say, by the way.

There was a cost. She had to give birth to the baby in a barn. How many of you women would like to give birth to your child in a barn and have your midwives be shepherds?

I don't think so. I don't think so. But it says that Mary actually treasured these things up in her heart.

[34:58] It wasn't always easy. Her husband died young. And even more, her son died. A difficult death on a cross, and she was there to watch.

Mary, did you know that your baby boy was going to go through all of this? The problem is, is that we oftentimes believe that what we want is a relationship that's one way.

Give me all the bennies, God. Be my magic genie in heaven that will fix all my problems and give me everything good. If you're a real God.

Mary is asked to prove her love. Respond to grace. By living into the purpose that God had defined for her before she was even born.

Because God has a specific purpose for each of us. Before we even take our first breath. Remember that passage from Jeremiah?

[36:09] Jeremiah, before I formed you in the womb, I knew you. Before you were born, I set you apart. And created something absolutely amazing for you to do.

Each and every one of us gifted with something totally incredible that God is hoping we will do. Our response to love.

Now she did say to Mary, or the angel did say to Mary, Mary, he's going to be a king. He's going to reign forever. He's going to be a savior. It's going to be amazing.

That's kind of a promise I'd love to hear from my child. You know what I'm talking about? What a wonderful, amazing thing. God's grace. But it comes with an expectation that we will decide to live into what God wants us to live into.

God took the first step, offered us grace. But the grace comes with an expectation that we'll take the second step and return it by living into the purpose God made us for.

[37:17] It says in verse 37, God's word will happen. It cannot fail. It's not a question of whether God will succeed in the purpose for your life.

It's a question of whether we will accept that purpose. Did you know that if you do what God made you to do, you cannot fail? Now, the truth is, is our problem is we don't look at what God thinks.

We look at what the world calls success or failure. We look at whether we've accumulated a stash of money or whether we have a nice house or whether we have a lot of friends or we're popular or we do the things that we can see that have an impact.

God is offering us something more incredible. To live into a purpose that will make our very soul sing as Mary sang before God.

An incredible purpose. And in doing that, we return our gift to God. Because love is a two-way street. God offers us grace.

[38:20] And yes, it's his free gift to give to us. But he gives it with an expectation that we will love him in return. And we don't just love him, heart, soul, mind, and strength.

We also love our neighbor as ourself. Because you see, by this loving relationship with God, we learn how to love one another.

We're reading a lot of disturbing stories these days. In the newspapers and on TVs about people who have been living with an abusive lifestyle.

Now, folks worry that maybe they're the ones who have made a mistake or misjudged or misspoke. And we all do that. That happens even to the best of people.

But there's a big difference between that and people that live in a predatory way towards other folks to hurt them and harm them and cause them pain.

[39:19] And the reason for that is because we're developing a culture that says, It's all about my satisfaction and my pleasure.

As if somehow this was ever right. It's never right to be in an abusive, predatory relationship with someone else. Not just with the things we read about or see on TV.

But in any situation. Relationships, just like our relationship with God, are two-way streets. Not one-way street. It's not a call for you to love and for the other to not love.

Or for you to take and the other to love completely. That leads to abuse. And we've lived into a culture that somehow seems to think that that's okay.

That's not the love that God wants us to have with each other. Now, years ago, there were two favorite scriptures for almost every wedding I did. I would say at least nine out of ten weddings came with one of these two scriptures.

[40:29] The first was 1 Corinthians 13 and the second was Ephesians chapter 5 where it says, Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ. Wives, submit yourselves to your own husbands as you do the Lord.

Husbands, love your wives just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her. That's an interesting scripture, isn't it? We don't get that request for that much anymore.

We really don't. And the truth of the matter is, it's one of the most beautiful passages in the Bible because what does it say? We're supposed to love each other. We're supposed to submit to each other.

We're supposed to care about each other and be concerned about each other and love each other the way God would love us. We're supposed to give of ourselves.

Knowing that the other person is doing the same thing. It's a wonderful passage, but nowadays we say, I'm not submitting. No way somebody's going to tell me what to do.

[41:30] I'm not going to become less in any way. And I know my husband's not going to be telling me what to do. Well, it goes the other way too, right? This is submit to each other.

Because imagine if your primary concern is how can you make life better for the person that you love.

I've got to tell you the truth. I make coffee, usually at night. All right? It's one of the last things I often do. And sometimes I'm like, you know, doing this kind of thing.

But I know that my wife appreciates having that cup of coffee in the morning. There's probably only one thing I dread in the morning more than making coffee. You know what it is? Walking out to the newspaper place.

Across the street. Why? Why is it across the street, right? You know, like, ah, is there a car cover? Ah, ah, ah, ah, ah, ah, ah.

You know what I do? I actually do this little thing where on the way back this time of year I say, one less day of winter, one less day of winter. It gets me through.

I can't stand getting the newspaper in the morning. But now that my wife gets up quite a bit before me, she has coffee. And sitting in my chair is the newspaper.

This is great. You see, that's what it's about. How do we help each other? Genesis says that what we need in life is a suitable helpmate. Someone to walk through life with us.

This isn't just about spouses. This is also about friends, about family, about parents and children. About the people we go to church with, the folks we work with, the people in our lives where we can love as God taught us to love.

Which is a two-way street, not built on what can I get out of the relationship, which leads to abuse. But how can I make the other person have a better life?

[43:41] And in doing so, we lift them up. And you know what happens when you lift other people up? They tend to want to pull you up, too.

Build a life. Knowing that there's someone out there that knows you completely, and you can trust them to love you anyways.

That's what love is. We have lots of relationships like that in our world. Here's some. And I, I will always love you.

I, I will always love you. I, I, hope love treats you kind.

And I hope you have all you've dreamed of. I, I, and I wish it's joy and happiness.

[44:56] But of all this, I wish you loved. Love. And I, I, will always love you.

I, I, will always love you. I, will always love you.

I was going to sing that for you. Yeah, and a few people say I shouldn't do that. You see, there's relationships we're born into.

And there's relationships that come across in our lives and form. But all of them have the same thing in common. Even the ones we're born into, we have to choose.

We have to choose to accept and receive. God chose Mary. Just like God has chosen you. And has a special plan for your life.

[46:11] And a special joy intended for you if you accept and receive and experience that God into your heart. But Mary had to make a choice.

She could have said, Nah, no thanks God. I got a husband. I, I really don't need this right now. It's not convenient for me. I don't think it would go very well.

I don't think so. Or she could even have just simply said, like probably most of us would, Could you give me a couple of months and I'll get back to you? It's kind of a pretty big decision.

Can I let you know, God, in a couple months, what I think, after I talk to some folks and get some other opinions on this? Probably what we would have said, right? Mary said, I'm the handmaiden of the Lord.

Let it be to me as you have said. Wow. Is that who we are? Are we what God wants us to he?

[47:14] It's not always easy. We see that. It's not even always fun. But it's an amazing experience that God offers to you. I can tell you sometimes, when you do what God wants, we do question whether it was worth it.

I was preaching the same sermon last night. I was tired. So I started complaining. So we do it when we're tired, isn't it? Well, it's what I do. Maybe you don't. I don't know.

Maybe you're just really good people. I don't know. Probably better than me. But I have to tell you, the opportunity to do what God wants is an amazing thing.

To be in people's lives. I was sharing with one family about visiting their mother. It was such a delight. Another opportunity to go visit someone in the hospital who's struggling with an illness.

Listen, have you ever been in a hospital room alone for day after day? Another family who just needed someone to talk to. Yesterday, we gave Nona over to the Lord and let their family walk through the valley of shadow of death, and they weren't alone.

[48:29] That's what I do for God. And you say, well, I'm not a pastor. No. No. But all of you do all those things and can do all those things and other things.

Maybe it's a gift you buy for a little child that you don't even know, but the amazing experience of having them light up on Christmas morning because they received a gift from someone they've never met.

God gives us amazing opportunities if we love. And I know that love makes us vulnerable.
