Good morning. Today's scripture comes from Psalm 98. Sing to the Lord a new song, for he has done marvelous things.

His right hand and his holy arm have worked salvation for him. The Lord has made his salvation known and revealed his righteousness to the nations. He has remembered his love and his faithfulness to Israel.

All the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our God. Shout for joy to the Lord, all the earth. Burst into jubilant song with music.

[23:07] Make music to the Lord with the harp and the sound of singing, with trumpets and the blast of the ram's horn. Shout for joy before the Lord, the King.

Let the sea resound and everything in it, the world and all who live in it. Let the rivers clap their hands. Let the mountains sing together for joy. Let them sing before the Lord, for he comes to judge the earth.

He will judge the world in righteousness and the peoples with equity. This is the word of our Lord. What can wash away my sin?

What can make me whole again? Amazing grace. Amen.

We could even just end it right there. What a sweet sound that is. All this summer we're talking about worship and the different aspects of worship and why they're important, why we do certain things.

[24:20] And today we're talking about music, music and singing and why do we do music and singing and worship and why it's important. And sometimes people will say, why do we do all that singing stuff?

And it's not really. I mean, isn't it enough to tell me if we hear scripture, we hear a message. Maybe we'll say prayer, but let's just call it a day, right? I don't want to do any of that singing stuff. But it's important. It's actually very important to God that we sing.

And there are verses throughout the entire scripture that tell us to sing. There are examples throughout scripture that tell us to sing. I just want to share some of those with you. Even just starting with our scripture today, which is from Psalm 98.

And the psalms are songs. So in the Bible itself is a book of songs. There's a song book in there. It's kind of expected that we sing. But beyond that, from the very beginning, God created music and harmonies.

And in Genesis 421, we read about the very first musician, Jubal, who was the father of all who play the harp and flute. As the Israelites passed safely over the Red Sea, Moses afterwards broke out with the rest of the congregation of people there and sang songs about the deliverance of God.

[25:35] And then afterwards, Miriam took up with all the other women and they're singing and they're dancing and they're praising. Deborah sang after the victory of Sisera. David played the harp and he sang songs and he wrote many of the psalms that are in our songbook in the Bible.

Jesus sang a hymn with the disciples at the Last Supper. And every time he would have been to the synagogue or the temple, he would have sang with the others. Paul and Silas sang a hymn of praise while they were in jail.

We read about angels singing of heavenly choirs. And in Revelation, there are many songs. And it is said that every creature will be singing praises to the Lord our God who is worthy to be praised.

The Bible has over 400 references to singing and 50 direct commands to sing. Now there are some of you who say, yeah, but I don't sing.

Or trust me, you don't want to hear me sing. And I've heard that a lot. You know, as a believer, once you become a believer, you're automatically a singer. You have joined the heavenly choir.

[26:43] You have joined the choir of people called to sing praises to God. And do you ever hear a child sing? And they can sing and they can belt it out. And it doesn't matter what they sound like.

You know, when you're a parent or any adult looking at a child, they've got the cute factor. When God is our heavenly parent, you've got the cute factor.

It doesn't matter what anyone else thinks or says. In the scripture today, it says, make a joyful noise to the Lord. It doesn't matter what you sound like. It's more a question of the sincerity of your heart.

What is actually moving you to raise your voice? God is not expecting you to be a perfect singer. God is expecting you to have a heart that wants to praise in voice, in song.

And so Wesley, John Wesley, who is the founder of the United Methodist denomination, actually decided that singing was so important, we ought to have directions for it. So if you open up your hymnal at some point, there's a whole list of directions.

[27:47] They're lengthy, but I wanted to pick out just a couple for you to read. But yeah, there's directions for how to do this. Sing all. See that you join with the congregation as frequently as you can.

Let not a slight degree of weakness or weariness hinder you. If it is a cross to you, take it up and you will find blessing. Sing lustily and with good courage. Beware of singing as if you were half dead or half asleep.

But lift up your voice with strength. Be no more afraid of your voice now, no more ashamed of its being heard than when you sung the songs of Satan. Sing modestly.

Do not bawl as if to be heard above or distinct from the rest of the congregation. That you may not destroy the harmony, but strive to unite your voices together so as to make one clear melodious sound.

And above all, sing spiritually. Have an eye to God in every word you sing. Aim at pleasing God more than yourself or any other creature.

[28:52] So that's how we're supposed to sing. So why are we supposed to sing? Well, singing actually helps us to remember God's word. Singing actually helps us to remember lots of things.

We use songs and melodies to help us remember things. When we're children, you know, A, B, C, D. How many of us actually, every time we're trying to look something up in the alphabet, we still end up singing the song in our head?

C, D, E, D. Yeah. It helps us to remember the order of things. It helps us to remember words. It helps us to remember what we're talking about. And kids learn through song.

We learn through song. The kids actually, I love the song John 3.16 because they're singing, they're dancing. John 3.16 says that God so loved the world. And they're singing one of the key scriptures.

John 3.16. And they know it by heart because they're moving, they're dancing, and they're singing. It's to music. And they can recite it any time we ask them. For myself, fruit of the spirit, every time we try to figure out what the fruit of the spirit are, I have to sing the song.

[29:54] Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Now, if you're asking what the fruit of the spirit are, and I say it, in my mind, I'm still going, love, joy, peace, patience, kindness.

I can say it, but music helps us to remember it. So the songs actually help us to remember God's word, help us to learn God's word. That's why a lot of these songs were written.

But the old hymns have wonderful, deep theology. And the whole reason they were written in the first place was to try and teach the people what Christianity was.

And so we have all these really deep theological hymns, and then we have contemporary praise songs that reflect our relationship with God, and it's all melded together to help us to really remember who God is, what Christianity is, what our faith is, and helps us to keep on track.

And it helps us to respond to God's grace. Because when we're responding with grace, it's through the music and the lyrics. So you have the lyrics, and he could say, you know, amazing grace, how sweet the sound.

But if I say, amazing grace, how sweet the sound, it has more power. The music speaks to our souls as well. That's why people get so excited when there are concerts and things, because the music does something to us, and we get moved by the sound of the music, which actually amplifies the lyrics, the tone, the pitch, the tempo.

It drives home the meaning. You can have something extended or lifted up or repeated in a song, and it just makes what you're saying to God even that more amplified.

And in doing so, it brings joy. It brings joy. How can you not feel joyful? Joy to the world, the Lord is come.

I mean, you just got to smile. It's a joy. How can you? It's a wonderful song. Joy to the world, the Lord. And when you're singing, it can bring out the joy in you as you celebrate with other people.

Oh, victory in Jesus, my Savior forever. And as we're singing these songs with a joy in our heart, it also helps us to remember other experiences we've had with music.

[32:17] Victory in Jesus, for instance. Every time I sing that song, I'm not only singing praises to God, but I remember a dear friend of mine that passed away years ago, Jim Jameson.

And he loved that song. And so every time I sing that song, I'm singing it with him. And the body of believers all joined together, and we're singing this song together. You know, when my grandmother was passing away, and she was in the hospital, one of her favorite songs was Sanctuary.

And so as we're in the hospital, I'm singing to her, Lord, prepare me to be a sanctuary. And as she's laying there with her eyes closed, she just holds my hand.

And it just brings back those memories. And so not only memories of God, it's memories of God's people. Memories of times together shared. Memories of when we've been at funerals or celebrations together.

All sorts of memories. And it speaks to our soul. And there's a shared story with that. And it demonstrates our unity. So songs actually bring us together.

You know, when you're singing, like at the sports stadiums, let's go Buffalo. And you know, everybody starts moving. It's like, let's go Buffalo. Next thing you know, everybody's singing, let's go Buffalo.

And everybody's on the same wavelength. It's like, get the results together. We're singing happy birthday. Everybody's got it on the same page, doing the same thing. And it shows our unity. When we sing together, we're singing the same song.

It says, we're in agreement. This is what we think. This is what we say. This is what we do. This is what we believe. Now, in the scripture today, it says, let the sea war and everything in it, the world and all those who live in it.

And in Colossians 3.16, it says, let the message of Christ dwell among you richly as you teach and admonish one another with the wisdom through psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit, singing to God with gratitude in your hearts.

We sing as one body of believers together, singing to one another, singing with one another, lifting up God.

[34:30] It's one of the great things about this particular church. You know, they say that Sunday morning is one of the most segregated times in our country. All these areas, everything is segregated based on people's likes.

We've got, you know, so people who like this kind of music go here. People who like this kind of music go here, and everybody is divided up based on, for the moment, worship styles, music styles.

And at a time when we're gathering together as a body of believers to celebrate God, we're dividing ourselves out based on our own preferences. And I really commend this church who's decided to say, no, I want the body of Christ to be together.

And we're going to meld all this together. We're going to say, I want all kinds of music all put together so that all the people can worship together.

And we're not going to say that you people who like that stuff go over here, you people who like that stuff go over here. We do it together. It's a really actual gift.

[35:34] To the point where the younger people, when you start talking, the older people will say, you know, the traditional songs, the old hymns. And the younger people will say, what are you talking about?

They're songs. A song is a song is a song is a song. They're all just songs. And in this scripture, it's talking about singing new songs to the Lord. And it's really hard.

I know it's hard to learn new songs, but we have to have new songs. There are new songs. If we didn't do new songs, we'd be doing Gregorian chants. Or actually, Gregorian chants were there past that.

Who knows what we would be doing? You know, whatever they did in the original Bible, singing-wise. So you have to add new songs all the time. I mean, one of the classic songs in our hymnal is Here I Am, Lord.

And everyone thinks it's a great old hymn because it's in the red books. But it was written in the 80s. By the time it made it in the book, it was probably like late 80s, 90s, which means it would have been a new song for many of us.

[36:36] It's a new song. And I know it's hard to sing new songs, but we need to learn new songs as we grow and as things change. I know it's hard, so I just wanted to share with you some letters because sometimes people will be a little upset about learning new songs.

So here are some letters that were received about new songs. Letter number one, please, no more new hymns. What's wrong with the inspiring hymns with which we grew up?

When I go to church, it is to worship God, not to be distracted with learning a new hymn. Last Sunday's was particularly unnerving.

While the text was good, the tune was quite unsingable and the harmonies were quite discordant. Letter number two, was it the organist's idea or yours to make our peaceful worship service shattered by that new hymn last Sunday?

The music was sacrilegious, something one would expect to hear in a den of iniquity, not a church. Don't even expect me to sing it next time.

[37:45] The first letter was written in 1890 referring to what a friend we have in Jesus. And the second letter was written in 1846 about I love to tell the story.

Right? Songs are new all the time. They're new to somebody. So we're singing a new song. And if you don't like the song, you know, it is absolutely impossible to pick out songs that absolutely everyone in this congregation would like all the time.

There are many songs out there. There are many songs that some of you love, and I don't. And vice versa. But, you know, we're in this. Again, we've made a decision as a congregation to keep the body of believers together.

So if you say, well, I don't like that song, I'm going to say, so? Okay. I'm sorry. But that's just the way it is. There's a lot of songs that we don't like.

But you know what? We sing them anyways. Because there are people in this congregation, people in your church family who love that song. And who want to be surrounded by the voices of the heavenly choir lifting up that song in praise.

[38:54] And so whether you like the song or not, you sing it to support your family. That's how we show love for one another, isn't it? We lift it up and we sing even if we don't like it because the words are there.

It's like you're singing a prayer then. I'm singing this song because I know someone loves it. God, may they preach it. Whatever it takes. But we want to make sure that we're lifting each other up.

The thing is, when we're saying, you know, I don't like this, you have to remember, worship is not about us. It's not about you. It's not about me. It's not about any of us.

It's about God. And we have a real struggle in America. A real struggle that's come up. Well, it's been a while. But we are so blessed.

We have so much. That we kind of think of God as sort of an extra. We think of God as nothing special necessarily.

[40:01] It really struck me when we were on our way home from the mission trip and we stopped at Darien Lake and we're doing all the roller coasters. And I love roller coasters. I'm like, woo-wee! And, I mean, some of them are painful.

I don't know what's up with that. But they were fun. But as I'm walking around, God kept telling me, saying to me, you know, what does it take to get your attention now? What does it take?

The next roller coaster was bigger and better and bigger and better and bigger and better. And we all have to feel the need to go, wee! Before we can experience God.

Before we're willing to sing praises to God. Before we give God what God deserves. See, in America, we have a flatline society.

And in general, God created each and every one of us equal, made in his image. And it is a wonderful thing that we treat one another with respect and dignity and we are all equal.

[41:00] We're equal in God's eyes. But the problem is, because we're so used to everything being flatlined, we've got to make God on the same level. God is not on the same level.

God is God! Almighty, powerful. God is the creator of the universe. And if you think of the creator of the universe who actually knows you personally, it changes things.

But we kind of think of it as like this extra little, you know, why does God want me to sing a song? I mean, it's just, you know, it's just God, you know. I'm saved, so it's okay.

God! Wow! We've lost the awe, the reverence, the respect of God who inspires us to sing praises.

Because we just can't comprehend that we should be singing praises. I give you credit, you all do. You do. And it's a powerful thing when you lift up your voices together.

[42:07] You see, the thing is, worshipping is not about us. It's about God. And so, in Ephesians 5, 18 through 20, it says, Do not get drunk on wine.

Different sermon. Which leads to debauchery. Instead, be filled with the Spirit, speaking to one another. So together, as a congregation, with psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit, sing and make music from your heart to the Lord, always giving thanks to God the Father for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

So we come to worship for God. And we may experience God as a byproduct of that. But that's not our intent.

And people say, well, I wasn't getting anything out of it. It's like, what were you giving to it? The point is that what you're getting out of it, the point is what you're giving to it. The point is you coming in and giving to God.

Because for the folks that would say, well, let's just hear a sermon. And frankly, right now, you're passive. You're sitting and you're listening. And hopefully God is inspiring you in some way.

You know, God will speak to your heart. But it's still passive. Worship is an action. Worship is something that I give, something that I do. And we need to do that together.

And our intent needs to be focused on God. And through that, we may experience God. But if we come in with our intent on us and what I'm going to get out of it, the likelihood of experiencing God goes greatly down.

Now, a lot of us come in, we're kind of closed off. Our minds distracted. I mean, you know, you can be singing a song and you already know it. And so next thing you know, you've sung songs to God.

But really, you just put together your to-do list. You've got shopping handled. We focus on the words. You know, body. And you've got your body. And, you know, you can sing with your hands down.

That's absolutely fine. You can make yourself even more expressive and raise your arms. You are no more spiritual if you raise your arms. But I'm telling you that it is a powerful feeling when you do that because it makes you vulnerable.

[44:24] But that or that kind of closed off bodily. It's making you closed off to the possibilities.

You know, what is this saying? And our spirit can be closed off. When we sing songs, we want to be strengthened spiritually.

And it's, first of all, remembering that it's not about us. It's about us giving to God. But also, there are times when we're just not feeling joyful. Life can be really hard.

And we come into worship. And, man, I just, I've done it myself. You know, I'm, it's like life is really knocking me down. And I am just feeling so down.

When you sing praises to God, it lifts you up. There's actually a whole section of psalms called Psalms of Lament that start off with, God, life is really hard.

[45:29] I'm not liking this at all. Are you even here? What's going on? But each and every one of those psalms of lament, it raises it up to joy. And so we start with that.

There are songs in our repertoire that do that for us. The song, I will sing. Lord, you seem so far away. A million miles or more.

It seems today. But at the end of it, it says, I will sing. I will praise. Even in my darkest hour. Through the sorrow and the pain.

For it is well when peace like a river attendeth my way. When sorrows like sea billows roll. Whatever my lot, thou hast taught me to say.

It is well. It is well with my soul. And it lifts us up. And it lifts our spirits. And so we sing in spite of the way we're feeling.

[46:29] Because through singing, we will grow spiritually. And God will heal that brokenness. Come thou fount of every blessing. To my heart to sing thy grace.

And that's what's happening. Our hearts are being tuned. When we come in and we're not really in a place where we're feeling joyful and filled with the spirit and filled with grace. We need to tune our hearts to God's grace.

Jesus on the cross. And he said, my God, my God. Why have you forsaken me? But that's actually a song. Which means it's a song.

He was quoting a song. And when it says, Jesus cried out, that actually can be translated, raised his voice. If you can imagine Jesus on a cross.

And instead of just saying, my God, my God, why have you forsaken me? He sings. And just like we know the rest of the song, those surrounding him also know the rest of the song.

[47:31] And the rest of the song is that I will sing praises with the congregation. For God is good. I tried actually to think of what could possibly be the melody to a song.

My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? And each and every time I tried to sing it, it made me cry. But just knowing that it brings you to joy at the end is meaningful and powerful.

It swells you to joy. So Psalm 98 for today says, sing to the Lord a new song. For he has done marvelous things. His right hand and his holy arm have worked salvation for him.

The Lord has made his salvation known and revealed his righteousness to the nations. He has remembered his love and his faithfulness to Israel. All the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of God.

If we're coming into worship and our mind is all distracted, which is what happens. There's so much going on. Focus on the words. And focus on what the words mean.

[48:38] Let it go into your soul as you have the music that supports it. So you can focus on God. Body, if you're feeling like this, I encourage you to at least do this.

And imitation is the greatest form of praise. So we gather together in worship to remember who God is. We're here for God and not us. And praise God for the salvation that God gives us.

Because worship is not a spectator sport. Worship is a holy drama. And God is our audience. And we together actively as one body of believers express our gratitude for, as it says, God has done marvelous things.

And we sing a new song. Not only new as in style or just new to us, but our newness. Our newness is we were made new through God's saving spirit.
