The word is near you. It is in your mouth and in your heart. That is the message concerning faith that we proclaim. If you declare with your mouth, Jesus is Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved.

For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved. As scripture says, anyone who believes in Him will never be put to shame.

For there is no difference between Jew and Gentile. The same Lord is Lord of all and richly blesses all who call on Him.

[22:34] For everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved. How then can they call on the one they have not believed in?

And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them? And how can anyone preach unless they are sent?

As it is written, how beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news. This is the word of our Lord. Thanks be to God. These are great shirts.

It was a wonderful mission trip. So this morning, we're going to be talking about this passage that is from the book of Romans. And when Paul was writing this letter, it was a letter sent to the churches.

Now the churches in Rome were lots of little house churches. And this letter was sent out and it wasn't a letter sent out to the leader of the church, the pastor of the church, the head honcho of the church, the one in charge.

[23:45] Instead, this was a letter talking to all the believers in the church. So it's a message for all of us. And the passage ends, how then can they call on the one they have not believed in?

And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them? And how can anyone preach unless they are sent?

As it is written, how beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news. So it's a call to all believers to bring the good news of God's salvation to others.

because it's God's desire that none should perish, but everyone, everyone to come to repentance, for everyone to be in right relationship with him, for everyone to gain eternal salvation.

And so Paul will often use Old Testament stories to try and illustrate this. And so we decided for this series that we would do the same thing.

[24:49] And so we have the scriptures, searching through the scriptures to figure out which Old Testament story would illustrate this. There's a story that contains a vine.

It's a vine that grew up and provided shade, but it's dead now. I got a dead vine. Anybody know what that's from? What story is that from? Jonah.

Yes, Jonah. Jonah. Thank you. So Jonah is a prophet. Jonah could be told is the greatest evangelist ever.

Jonah heard from God and he was told that he was supposed to go to Nineveh and give God's message.

Now Nineveh, Nineveh was a huge city, but it was Gentiles, it was pagans, it was packed full of evil, and it was violent. And Jonah hated them.

[25:52] And so Jonah gets this message from God and says, you know what? I know you want me to go there, but I'm not doing that. I don't want to talk to them. And so he actually makes the defiant decision to disobey and decides to go in the complete opposite direction.

> Nineveh is this way and he says, you know what? I'm going to Tarshish. That's that way. And so we have to wonder what was going on in Jonah's heart that he would choose to disobey God and go in the opposite direction, avoiding sharing God's message with the Ninevites.

Well, what prevents us from sharing God's message with others? What are the things that are holding us back from that? I mean, one of the things is they say we're not supposed to talk about sex, politics, and religion.

Okay. Well, sex, yeah, that's awkward and inappropriate. Yeah, don't do that. And religion in today's climate, probably a good idea to avoid that. Yeah. And religion, honestly, yeah, don't talk about religion because religion is often the form, the function, the structure, and it's often a head thing and you end up in debates about heady things.

Instead of talking about religion, talk about relationship because it's relationships that changes things. It's relationship with God, relationship that changed your life.

[27:16] That's what we talk about. And it's one of the things we talk about when we're prepping for the mission trip. It's one of the key things we talk about. We're going on a mission trip. What does that mean? That means that we are going there to bring good news.

That means we are going there to share God's love. That means that we are going there to be people of Christ in the midst of whatever situation we're placed in.

Now, that means that God's love is primary. primary. And when people ask you why you're doing this, which inevitably happens, these kids are working their tails off.

They really, they work hard, hard, hard. When they're asked, why are you doing this? Have an answer. What is your answer?

What is the reason you're doing this? Dig down deep. What has God done in you that calls you to do this thing? You've got to have an answer. Beyond because it's fun.

[28:17] Because I'll learn some construction skills. Because it'll look great on my resume. Because I wanted a week away from my parents. Whatever it may be. What is the reason? We don't do this for any of those reasons.

Now, all of those things are true. You will have fun. You'll be away from your parents. You will learn construction skills. It'll look great on your resume. But that's not why we do it. If we're coming in for that reason, we're going in with the wrong heart just like Jonah didn't have the right heart.

We come bringing God's message. So when Jonah was running away from the task of sharing God's message with the Ninevites, he comes to a boat. He's going to board this boat.

And he actually tells the sailors that he's running away from God. Now, what kind of impression would that make on someone? I mean, I'm thinking, I have no idea what they could have possibly thought of this man who is saying this.

And on the boat, they're sailing along and Jonah goes down and he goes to sleep because he just doesn't care. He's checking out. And God sends this huge storm.

[29:21] This huge storm. And it's getting really, really violent. Really, really bad. And the sailors are freaking out. And so they're like, something's going on. This is not normal.

This is not right. And so they go and they wake up Jonah and they said, get up and call on your God. Maybe he will take notice of us so that we will not perish. And then, as it continued on, the storm is getting greater and greater.

And they cast lots. They all came to the conclusion, Jonah's the one that is responsible for this. And so they asked him, what did you do? What should we do?

This is crazy. We're all going to die. And Jonah answered, I'm a Hebrew Hebrew. And I worship the Lord, the God of heaven, who made the sea and the dry land. So what he said was, basically, I worship like God, the creator, like the big God, the only God, the huge God.

And they're like, whoa, what did you do? And now they're freaking out even more because this is big, big, big, big. And the storm is getting big, big, big, big. And they're getting more and more panicky, more and more in distress.

[30:30] And finally, Jonah said, pick me up, throw me into the sea. When that happens, God will make it stop. I didn't want to do that.

They're like, we're going to kill you. You're going to die. We don't want to do that. And so they actually, actually called out to the Lord. These sailors called out to the Lord.

And they said, please, Lord, do not let us die for taking this man's life. Do not hold us accountable for killing this man, an innocent man. Lord, you have done as you pleased. And they then threw Jonah overboard to what they presumed would be his death.

And as soon as Jonah fell into the sea, the storm stopped. And the sailors saw God.

Wow. And they responded. They responded to the greatness of God. And it said that they were greatly feared the Lord. They offered a sacrifice to God and they made vows to him.

[31:39] So God moved even in Jonah's disobedience, even in Jonah's weaknesses because God is so good. And the story says that now the Lord provided a huge fish to swallow Jonah.

I thought that was funny. I was like, I'm sure Jonah was not thinking that God should provide something like a huge fish. You know, how about another boat? Something like that. You know, maybe a little plot of dry land. God provided.

No, God provided what he thought Jonah needed. Jonah needed a little lesson. And so God provided a huge fish that went up and swallowed him whole.

And now Jonah is stuck in the belly of the whale. Imagine being stuck, claustrophobic, smelly, disgusting, dark.

We get that sometimes in our lives, don't we? We get to a place where we too are in the belly of the whale. Whether from circumstances outside of us or circumstances that we've created, we end up in the belly of a whale.

[32:48] And it's in those times of distress that we cry out, we call out to God. We call out to God and Jonah did just that.

In his distress, he called out to God. And part of what he said in his prayer there, it says, in my distress, I called to the Lord and he answered me, what I have vowed, I will make good.

I will say, salvation comes from the Lord. And as soon as he acknowledged that salvation comes from the Lord, this fish, it says they vomited him on the shore.

So he's like, not only have the belly of the whale, but now he's covered in fish vomit. Gross. But you know, when you get out of the belly of the whale, you may be rescued by God, but there's going to be a mess that you've made that you're going to have to clean up.

And you're in distress and you've made a choice and you're going to live into what God is now calling you to do. So in Jonah's distress, he called out to the Lord and he witnessed the love of God.

[33:55] He witnessed his power, his mercy, and his grace. On the mission trip, we too experienced God's power, mercy, and grace.

We had other work as well on another site, but we had primarily two different sites. The first one was Sandy and Larry and you heard a little bit about that last week.

And Larry had had several strokes and in January he had lost his eyesight. He had become blind due to diabetes. He's very, very sick.

And they literally have no money. They had a car that was sitting out in their yard and they had to sell it so that they could pay their utilities. Their grass started growing.

I was told it got up to like the yay high when the neighbor finally said, something's not right here. We've got to go check on him. And he went and found them and he was moved to start working to help them in some ways and start working on groups to come.

[34:54] So, we come as part of that. We come to start working there. And Sandy, at one point, I'm in the house working on the windows and such and she comes over and she's got tears in her eyes and she says to me, I couldn't do it.

All of this. My husband, this house, I couldn't do it. I had no idea what to do. I knew I couldn't do it and I cried out to God and I said, Lord, help me, please.

I can't do this alone. Send me someone. And then she looked right at me and she pointed her finger and says, and God sent me you. It's like, oh, yeah.

God did. God sent me. God sent everyone on that team. God sent us all and she kept going around telling other people the same thing. God sent me you.

God sent me you. God did. God did send us there. And she had tears of joy. We were sent with a divine appointment.

[36:03] And then we had a second divine appointment. The other house was Michelle's house and Michelle, her husband, had passed away about a year and a half beforehand of cancer. And she also had MS. And her husband, kept trying to, when he was alive, he kept trying to fix the house, but he would get, like, would you say 50%? Yeah.

Yeah. 50. And nothing was finished. But in the process of all that too, she also gave up hope. And so, the very, very basic things that needed to be done to keep a household up, I mean, think very basic things that you needed to do to keep a household going, she couldn't bring herself to do.

And the house was in trouble. The house was a mess in not only construction, but in, it was, needed a lot of tending to.

And our kids ministered her to a way where they could help her without her feeling any shame. Help her with love and a hand up.

[37:17] And when we do these mission trips, we actually, we have lunchtime, we do devotions and prayer and we invite the people we're serving to come and join us. And I was told that they invited Michelle to join and she did join, but the very first day she was kind of like, just very quietly, carefully sharing a little bit about her experience with religion.

But that was about it. Very careful. And as the week went on, as these kids, they worked so hard, as they loved on her like crazy, by the end of the week, Michelle led the prayer.

Transforming lives with the love of Christ. See, we believed in our hearts, carrying the faith of Jesus Christ and we declared with our mouth and with our deeds, with our whole being, that Jesus is Lord.

So what does it mean that Jesus is Lord? That's the process of sanctification. It continues the moment you accept Jesus Christ as your Savior and throughout the whole rest of your life.

God is God and we are not. and we humbly submit to God's authority, following, serving. We submit to the will of God and we grow in our likeness of God.

[38:45] We grow in God's character. God's character. Now, Jonah knew God's character and was content with experiencing that for himself.

But he didn't have the heart God had for others. So, when Jonah finally decided to obey God and he went to the city of Nineveh, he gave the message with reluctant obedience.

And honestly, he was secretly excited for God to destroy the city. He was excited for that. So we really wonder about his heart.

And he went out and he proclaimed, 40 more days and Nineveh will be overthrown. And he said that to everyone waiting. Oh, he's going to get squished.

But the word overthrown, God was playing a little game with him. The word overthrown can mean physical destruction. It's used for Sodom and Gomorrah. But it is also often used to mean to turn around or transform.

[39:52] And so basically what he was saying is 40 more days and Nineveh will either turn or be overturned. So in Romans, Paul is quoting Deuteronomy and he says, but what does it say?

The word is near you. It's in your mouth and in your heart. That is the message concerning faith that we proclaim. And he's actually quoting Deuteronomy. And it goes on to say, so you may obey it.

See, I said before you today, life and prosperity, death and destruction. For I command you today to love the Lord your God, to walk in obedience to him and to keep his commands, decrees and laws and then you will live and increase and the Lord your God will bless you.

I have set before you life and death, blessings and cursings. Now choose life. And in spite of Jonah's reluctance, in spite of Jonah's heart, the Holy Spirit gave that same message to the people of Nineveh because the king himself was convicted.

And the king himself said, everyone, everyone, call out, call out urgently to God. Give up our evil ways. Give up the violence.

[41:15] And they all put on sackcloths and they all fell in the dust in humility and they all called a fast, a fast from food, a fast from water, from even the animals. They said, this is serious and they fell in humility, submitting themselves to God.

They repented. They believed. They called upon the Lord. And in Jonah 3.10, it says, when God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil ways, he relented.

He had compassion. He actually repented. He turned and did not bring on them the destruction he had threatened. So, thousands of lives were changed.

And for Jonah, as a prophet, that's the greatest transformation ever. God's kingdom come. Isn't that what we pray all the time? God's kingdom come. And on the mission trip, God was moving too.

God's kingdom coming in powerful ways, in ways we were not expecting. So, the one day, we take the kids all out for ice cream and they're all in line and, you know, I'm the last one in the line because I'm paying for it, yeah?

[42:29] And as the kids are in line, the one woman just looked at me at one point and she goes, are you from Aldersgate? Which was the camp we were staying in. And I said, yeah. And she said, oh, okay. That was it.

I was like, all right, whatever. And then they come and they're ordering all this ice cream and at the very end, I come up and the cashier said, that'll be \$70 and some change. And the woman that had asked about Aldersgate came by and she says, no, it's \$40.

What? We both kind of looked at her like, what? And she said, it's \$40. And I said, are you sure? And she came over and she said something like, the way these kids are serving and you've got kids here wearing shirts that say, Jesus loves me?

Yeah. And I was like, yeah. Yeah. It was great. It was like, we are making an impact, transformation for the world.

And at Sandy's house, there was this neighbor named Paul who had been working with the teams to help the family and such. And he was around a lot while we were working. And the one day, it was one of the last days, we were all really tired.

[43:39] We were really sweaty and gross. And yeah, there were manure trucks across the street the whole week. It was, yeah, we were sweaty and we were gross. And we all just wanted to shower and we go to hold hands because we would hold hands and pray at the beginning of every day and at the end of every day.

And the people that we're ministering to are invited to join us in that and Paul joined us as well. And Pastor Tom gave this idle thread of no one showers until someone prays. And so we're all sitting there waiting for who's going to say the prayer and Paul, Paul the neighbor said, I'll pray.

And he did and he said a blessing over us all. It was amazing. And something happened on this trip that has never, ever happened before.

Friday night, we always say we're going to work late because we will not leave these projects undone. We were going to work until it's done no matter what. We've always, always accomplished that. But Friday night came, this was a huge, huge house.

And we were trying to put siding on it and it became real clear that we were not going to finish. And we called it. Guys, we just can't. There's no possible way that we can finish this.

[44:49] And so we go back to the camp and the kids start asking, can we go back? Now, Saturday's supposed to be our fun day. Saturday's the day that we hang out at the camp. We go swimming. We play volleyball. We do a lot of nothing. We relax and recover from all this, right? And the kids are like, please, we want to go back. We want to go back. So we're talking about it. You know, the adults are saying, okay, well, I guess we could take eight, maybe ten, and they'd have to actually volunteer.

We don't want to force anyone to do this. and it'll take maybe two hours-ish. Okay, two or three hours. All right. So I finally said, okay, with those conditions.

And like that, ten, we want to go. And they went and they worked their tails off. Two hours went. Three hours went.

At three hours, I was trying to contact them and say, hey, guys, you're going to have to, you know, wrap it up and such. And I got through to Joshua, actually, and he's like, no, we're working.

[45:54] It's all good. It's all good. I was like, ah! So, seven hours. Seven hours. And I am just, yeah, I'm thinking, these kids are going to be in such a bad mood.

They're going to be so upset. Oh, my goodness. Seven hours. I can't believe we put them through this. And I'm waiting. And I'm watching them as they're getting out of the car, coming back after they had accomplished this, all of them grinning from ear to ear.

All of them filled with joy. All of them excited that they accomplished this. All of them excited because they had one more chance to give Sandy and Larry a hug. All of them proud in what they were able to accomplish through Christ.

And as they're all walking out, and I'm like, you know, that they've all got this wonderful attitude. I receive a phone call from Paul. And Paul says to me, I've got to say, I've never encountered anybody like your group.

I've never seen it before. I've never encountered it. This is the most blessed thing I've experienced. He said, you were such a blessing not only to them but to me. And I just wanted to thank you.

[47:11] Transforming lives because we cared. transforming lives because we reached out with the love of Christ. And so, we share the good news of Christ because it's within us.

And through that we bring transformation to others. And every time a life is transformed by the power and grace of God it's a reason to celebrate. It's a reason to celebrate. And yet Jonah complains to God with anger that everybody's transformed.

What? And then he says to God, yeah, I knew that you are a gracious and compassionate God slow to anger abounding in love a God who relents from sending calamity.

And then he even says that's why I went the opposite way. That's why I went to Tarshish. That's why I didn't want to come here because I knew you'd do something loving.

What? What kind of guy is this? Seriously? And so God taught him a lesson. So Jonah actually went outside of the city and he sat down waiting.

[48:21] He's like, maybe now that God's had a talking to God will change his mind and actually squash the city anyways. And he's waiting and watching. And God provides this big vine to come up and provide shade for his head.

And then at night time God also sent a worm. a worm that came and ate up that vine and destroyed it. Killed the vine.

And Jonah gets all upset because he doesn't have the vine to keep him in the shade. I mean, when I read Jonah I think of a child having a temper tantrum. I mean, it's like, I just imagine stomping your feet and the drama and it's like, oh God, I'm so, I mean, he literally says, I'm just so upset I want to die.

It's like, over a vine? Really? Really? And so God said to Jonah, is it right for you to be angry about the plant? And then he said, you have been concerned about this plant though you did not tend it or make it grow.

It sprang up overnight and it died overnight. And should I not have concern for the great city of Nineveh in which there are more than a hundred and twenty thousand people who cannot tell their right hand from their left and also many animals.

[49:39] Jonah, do you even care? Do you even care? Jonah had the gift of knowing God and yet because of his own prejudices, his own concerns, his own wants, and perhaps even his own fears, he was willing to allow thousands of people to stay in their sin and brokenness.

So Jonah needed to bring the message from God and we too need to bring the message from God, the good news of Jesus Christ.

Paul wrote, for it is with your heart that you believe and are justified. So we receive divine righteousness by faith, the forgiveness of sins through Jesus Christ, a gift given by God where we no longer receive the just penalty for our sin, but we are restored into right relationship with God.

We become God's children. It's a time of repentance, it's the time of beginning of a new life in Christ. It is good news. And so how are we bringing this good news to others?

Well our church says Christ is at the center of all we do. We already talked about how Christ is at the center of the mission trip. Christ was also at the center of VBS. We had easily 250 children plus 40 or 50 teenagers plus swarms and swarms of adults helping with this program.

[51:05] But Christ is the center. So will they have fun? Yes. Will they make lots of crafts? Yes. Will they make more friends? Yes. Those are all great things but that's a byproduct.

The whole point is Christ. Christ. In us. And so we think about to the fish fry. Christ.

How is Christ the center of that? Christ. It is. Christ is the center of the fish fry and we cook fish as byproduct. Everything we do Christ is at the center.

But now here's the thing. How does that translate outside of the church into our own lives? So just imagine if you came to your job prepared ahead of time, prayed up ahead of time knowing that your entire reason for going to your job is because you are carrying the light of Christ.

Christ. You are bringing the good news to your workplace. And the fact that you'll actually do some work and you'll actually get a paycheck, that's just the byproduct. How does that change things?

[52:11] What happens if that's your attitude as you're encountering all of your neighbors? When you're going shopping? Or when you're at home? You know, the people that get the most abuse are the people we love the most.

And what happens if we say the most primary, the most important thing that I ever do is to be the light of Christ within my family? And so when I go down to make breakfast, when I'm doing the laundry, when I'm handling all the children and I'm paying the bills and I'm doing all the chores, whenever I'm doing all this stuff, what happens if instead we say that's just the extra stuff but our primary thing in all of it is I am carrying the light of Christ.

I am witnessing to who God is through me. It's a game changer. No more than that, it's a life changer. It's transformation.

We bring the good news. And so I actually have a homework assignment for you or a challenge, however you want to look at it. And the first thing is if someone were to ask you, why do you go to church?

What do you believe in? Can you tell them? What is it that you would say? How would you describe the gospel message? Can you say it?

[53:33] And if you can't, let us know because it's part of the church's job to make sure you know this. But then I also want to ask you to work on your faith story. Just like with the teenagers, people come and if they see that you are changed somehow, you are set apart because you have Christ within you, that means that God has changed you in some way.

That means that you have encountered God in some way. So what is your faith story? That you can say to them, this is why. Can you say it? And everybody has a story.

You know, I was steeped in sin and then God. I was going in this direction and then God. I was raised my whole life in church and I never knew God until. So it was the lead up.

It was the moments, moment or moments, the moments and the continuing moments of how you experience God, how you are being transformed through God. Come up with your faith story so you also have something to tell because that's going to transform lives.

And for those who are willing and able, we'd love to hear it. We'd love to say it. It's encouraging. It's encouraging to others in the faith. We could make a video of you giving your testimony. You could write it down.

[54:44] We could use it as a blog. We could, through your testimonies, God could move mountains and people's lives could be transformed. It says when we give our testimony, Paul wrote about it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved.

And so to profess your faith is to acknowledge faith in Christ and to have a covenant with Christ. Christ. So it's more than just signing on the dotted line.

It's actually having a total life commitment. And so through that commitment, we have eternal life now and into eternity. God has given us such a gift.

And the scripture says anyone who believes in him will never be put to shame. So when we acknowledge that Jesus died on the cross for our sin, we are confessing our faith and our need for Jesus as a Savior.

And so I'd like you to pray a prayer of confession along with me. And this was actually the prayer that the children at VBS prayed. Won't you pray with me? God, I love you.

[55:51] God, I love you. I am thankful for Jesus who died on a cross and rose from the dead. For me, you love me.

You have given me hope in your power for new life in this life and in eternity forever and ever.

Amen. 1 Peter 3 15 says, in your hearts, revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have.

So why do we have hope? Hear the good news. Christ died for us while we were yet sinners. And this proves God's love for you and for me.
