This is, what is it? A bib. How many of you wear a bib? You used to. Why did you wear a bib? So you didn't know how to eat, and so it spilled everywhere.

It made lots of messes, and so you wore a bib to kind of keep yourself all clean, right? Do you ever make a mess now? Yeah? Even though you don't wear a bib?

What's up with that? Why don't you wear a bib all the time? Because we're not babies anymore. So after a while, we learn how to be not quite so messy, right?

And so what happens when we do make a mess then? We clean it up. So if our clothes get all dirty because we spilled something on ourselves, we wash our clothes, right?

Yeah, the same thing happens with God. When we make a mess in our lives by doing something that we shouldn't, how many of us have ever done something we shouldn't? Yeah. And it's messy.

It's not a good thing. And that means that we need to get clean. And so you know what? We go to God and we say, will you wash me clean? And do you think God forgives us and does that for us?

[19:33] That we would seek You with our whole hearts, and look to You for wisdom. Not to the things of this world, not to the things that the culture, the society would tell us are the right things to do, and the right ways to be.

not to a culture that would tell us that those things that are wrong are right, and expect us to believe it and live by it.

But Lord, we pray that You would teach us Your ways. That You would be our source of knowing what is true and what is right, what we are to believe.

Lord, guide us by Your Holy Spirit, knowing how we should be in this world. Help us to be a shining example of Your great love and glory.

Help us, Lord, as Your church, to be the witness for Christ that You have called us to be, wherever it is that we go.

[20:49] Lord, help us to open our hearts to You so that You can transform us. Lord, if there is anything in us that is not the way that You would have us to be, show it to us and transform us so that we can be more like Jesus.

That's our heart's desire, Lord. We hear it in Your Word. We sing it in songs of praise. Lord, if there is anything in your heart, we agree to it in prayer.

When we make our confession, when we speak forth what we believe in the creeds, when we call ourselves Christ followers, help us, Lord, to truly be that, not merely to claim it, but to actually live the life of faith that You have called us to.

[22:38] In Jesus' name we pray. Amen. Shall we hear from the Word of the Lord? Good morning.

Our scripture reading this morning is from the book of Colossians, chapter 1, verses 19 through 23. For God was pleased to have all His fullness dwell in Christ and through Him to reconcile Himself all things.

Whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through His blood shed on the cross. Once you were alienated from God and were enemies in your minds because of your evil behavior.

But now He has reconciled you by Christ's physical body through death to present you holy in His sight without blemish and free from accusation. If you continue in your faith, established and firm, and do not move from the hope held out in the gospel.

This is the gospel that you heard, and that has been proclaimed to every creature under heaven, and of which I, Paul, have become a servant. This is the word of the Lord.

[24:09] So, we have peanuts here. Christ is the answer. What's the question? As Christians, Christ is the answer.

And we're in the middle of this sermon series about questions. If you could ask God one question, what would it be? And we collected a bunch of these questions, and the one that I'll be addressing today that came up quite frequently was, how do I know if I'm forgiven?

Or how do I know that I'm saved? How do I know? And on the one hand, the answer is really quite simple, almost so simple that people don't really accept it.

And yet, at the same time, it's huge. It's all of eternity. It's all of Scripture. Everything in Scripture points to it. So, you know, you start Googling, what does Scripture say about salvation?

And where do you even start? I mean, it's just, that's what it's about. And so, when I'm trying to figure out how to do this, I thought I'd start at the beginning, at the very, very beginning.

[25:23] God created humanity in God's image. And we were in relationship with God. And then with sin, when sin entered in, we became alienated.

Just as it's said in the Scripture, we became alienated from God as our sin turned our back on God and we went in the opposite direction. And there was a separation, a big chasm in between us and God.

And God longed for us to be in relationship, but that sin kept us, by our choosing to be turned away, kept us apart. It says in the Scripture today, once you were alienated from God and were enemies in your minds because of your evil behavior, that's what sin does.

Sin makes us an enemy in our minds. It changes our hearts in evil ways so that we are no longer in relationship with God. We're supposed to be talking about an Old Testament character.

And for this week, I thought we'd talk about King Manasseh. King Manasseh was the son of King Hezekiah. When we did the kings with the youth, the way it would work is we'd have good king, bad king, good king, bad king.

[26:38] And every time there was a good king, all of Israel would be good. Then all of a sudden we'd have a bad king and all of Israel would be bad. And the youth were like, well, don't they get it by now?

I mean, really, good king, bad king. And I said, well, that's kind of the point. It's the same way in our own lives that we keep going back and forth and back and forth until we choose to really stay in that same direction.

And so we'd have King Manasseh who was raised by Hezekiah. Hezekiah was a good king. He changed Israel back to worshiping God and everything was going swell.

And when he died, he left Manasseh in charge. And Manasseh was 12 years old. How many think that leaving a 12-year-old in charge of the country is a good idea?

No, it didn't go well. In fact, Manasseh, the name itself means forgetting. And Manasseh chose to forget everything his father had taught him about God.

[27:38] In fact, Manasseh became evil in his heart. And he did such horrible, evil things. He set up altars in the temple and statues in the temple and brought the country to be worshiping foreign gods so much so that he was worshiping gods that required sacrifice of innocent blood and he even sacrificed his own children.

It says that Jerusalem was filled with the blood of innocent people and that it had gotten so bad that the people had been so depraved at that point that they were worse than the Canaanites that had been driven out before they arrived.

It was bad. And God sent them, sent Manasseh and the entire country, prophets, saying, God's not cool with this. You better change.

This is not good. God says, turn around. Stop it, stop it. And Manasseh, of course, didn't listen because he had a hardened heart because all that sin makes our heart hard. And Manasseh kept it up and kept it up and he even went and killed all of the prophets.

In fact, Jewish rabbinic tradition says that he killed Isaiah in a really gruesome way that I will not share. It was bad, really bad.

[28:56] And God finally had had enough. And he took the Assyrian army and they went down and they captured King Manasseh. And they bound him in chains and they put a hook through his nose and through his lips and they dragged him off to prison through the hook in his nose.

That's where his sin led him. And he sat in prison, humiliated, a broken man. You see, our sin causes us to become broken.

It causes us to be separate from God. It causes us to have a hardened heart. And God will allow us to keep going that way, keep going farther and farther away until we finally get the gist that we're broken and we are sinners in need of God's grace.

God will let us make a mess out of our lives if we choose to do that. But the entire time, God is sending provenient grace. And provenient grace is the grace that God sends ahead because God loves us so much.

And so God is constantly reaching out for us, reaching out to us, saying, come, come to me, draw close to me. I love you. I want to be in relationship with you.

[30:12] Please turn around and be with me. I want this again. I want to be in relationship. But then we have to actually make a choice.

See, Jesus was sent into the world as our Savior, as God incarnate, God with us, as a perfect picture of who God is.

You want to know who God is? Read about Jesus. It'll show you exactly who God is, what God's character is. And God then, as Jesus the Christ, was on a cross, and his blood was shed as he took on all the sins of the world, sacrificing for us, dying a horrible, humiliating death on a cross for us.

And it is a perfect, holy, and very real picture of what our sin does to God each and every time.

When Jesus was resurrected, he still had holes in his hands. Our sin causes pain. And when Jesus was resurrected, he showed us, there is hope.

[31:28] There is new life. Come to me. And I will give you new life. But you know, we have to actually respond. God is offering this free gift.

We have the free gift of provenient grace with God saying, come to me. And then God is offering the free gift of justification where we get to be cleansed and stand before God as a new creature, holy in his sight, in relationship again with God.

But we actually have to make that choice. We have to, first of all, recognize we're a sinner. That we are messed up and we need God's grace.

And then we have to actually turn to God for that so that our sin, which is keeping us separate, and we instead turn around. It's called repenting and we move closer.

And it's right at that point when we decide to choose, to change with a sincere, repentant heart, longing for God, and we turn around, that's when justification happens.

[32:38] That's when we experience justifying grace. That's when we're forgiven. That's when we're saved. That's when it happens. In verse 19 through 20, for God was pleased to have all his fullness, the completion, the fulfillment, dwell in Christ and through Christ to reconcile, to bring back into relationship all of us to God by making peace through Jesus' blood shed on the cross.

but we all have dirty laundry. How many of us have laundry to do? We were talking about all these different advice things and laundry was my topic.

I don't like doing laundry. God bless my husband who when going to, working full-time and going to school full-time, he said he'd take over laundry. Yes. So we have laundry, piles and piles of laundry and just like we have sin in our lives, we have dirty laundry.

As we wear things, we spill things. Even just being human, you know, what happens if we continue to wear our clothes every single day, even if we don't spill anything on it, is it going to have to be washed after a while?

Just being human after a while, it's going to stink. It's going to be bad. And so we end up having to do laundry and so how do we know when we have to do laundry?

[34:11] Well, there's a couple different ways we do that. First of all, we could end up saying that it stinks. I'm catching a scent and it's not a good one.

Okay? Same thing with our lives. If we're looking at our lives and it's stinky, we need God. if we end up looking and there's a huge pile and there's a huge pile and it's growing and it's growing and it's growing and it's all dirty, messed up.

We got to look at our lives and say, I better take care of that. It's piling up. Or if we come to our closet and we say, you know what? I got nothing to wear.

There's nothing left of me. We got to come to God. And so we get clean and we use some detergent, kind of like the blood of Jesus Christ washing us clean and we learn how to do this thing of living in Christ so that we know that we're not going to put this white stuff with that red stuff because what's going to happen?

It's going to be pink. Yeah. And when we end up spilling stuff all over ourselves because we're no longer wearing bibs, what do we do? We got to address that stain.

[35:30] What happens when you get a stain? How do you have to clean it? Yeah, you got to work on it and you know what? You got to do it as soon as possible. As soon as you know that you made a mess, you clean it up as soon as possible.

Otherwise, that stain gets stuck in there and it becomes harder and harder and harder to get rid of. The same thing with our lives. When we make a stain in our life, we got to work on it.

Soon as we recognize it, as soon as the Holy Spirit draws our attention to it and says, you know what? This part, you got to work on that. That's when we got to go and start working on the stains in our lives.

And so we can all wear clean clothes of righteousness. So the steps of grace are provenient grace where we confess and we repent and we cooperate with that so that we experience justifying grace and some scriptures.

I mean, there's a thousand scriptures about this, but I wanted to share a couple. Romans 10, 9 through 10 says, if you declare with your mouth Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved.

[36:35] For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified and is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved. And the classic one, John 3, 16 and 17, for God so loved the world that he gave his one and only son that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.

For God did not send his son into the world to condemn the world but to save the world through him. So then how do we know?

I mean, really, if you really get down to what the question is, the question is more like, how do I know it worked? I mean, I said the words. I said the little prayer.

I walked down the aisle. How do I know it worked? The answer is in verse 23. We are reconciled and free from accusation and then there's this scary, scary word.

If. If. See, what was the condition of our heart when we did that? Were we ready to change?

[37:52] Were we really ready to turn around? If. We continue in our faith. If we remain established and firm.

If we do not move from the hope held out in the gospel. If. See, there's another part of grace. Once we experience the justifying grace, there's a sanctifying grace that we participate in as we are filled with the Holy Spirit and we walk closer and closer to God.

And we should be going closer and closer and closer to God. It's not a thing where we do it because we have to. It's because we want to.

See, the great love that we experience when we turn, if we do this with a sincere heart, is the love that draws us closer. It's the love that draws us desiring God, desiring to be in love.

And so, how do we do that? Jesus said that the two top commandments, love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength and love your neighbor as yourself.

[39:15] Now, I don't know if any of you picked up this thing when you came in. There's a thing talking about, you know, where you are in your faith journey. But the thing is, when you're looking at this, we have to put it in perspective.

You can do all these things all day long, but you know what? You doing this does not buy you salvation. We do not do this because we are going to earn our salvation.

That's works righteousness and that's not a thing. Okay? Because that means that we're in control and God owes us and that's not a thing. But we do this because we love God.

We do this as an expression of our love of God. And so, I suppose it was about 10 years ago, I don't know if you've ever noticed the pattern in the church of the sermon series.

Every fall, we do a sermon series about commitment. Saying, you know, hey, time to get back into it. You went through summer. Come on, guys. Get back into it.

[40:16] Make a deeper commitment. Draw closer to God every fall. And it was about 10 years ago that we actually did it through a survey. And we had everybody mark down with the HSMS, Heart, Soul, Mind, Strength, where they were on the chart.

You know, were they a seeker? Were they a follower? Were they, you know, where are you? And when we looked at the surveys, a really huge number said, I am at the very lowest level.

Very lowest level. And my first impression of that was, cool. That means we're doing our job. That means that we are out there in the world and inviting people in and we have people in our midst that God is reaching with provenient grace and they're drawing closer.

Cool. But then I was heartbroken to see that the next question, and so, what are you gonna do?

How are you gonna move? How are you gonna draw closer to God? Now that you see where you are, what are you gonna do? and they said, nothing.

[41:26] Nothing. Heartbreaking. Because what that means is that there's no desire. There's no love.

Because you know, if you're in a relationship, if you're in a relationship, you desire to draw closer. You desire to draw more and more in love. You desire to do something for them and with them and you want to be there.

You want to draw close. And far too many people said, nothing. And so we have to check our hearts, you know.

Galatians 5, 1 through 7 says, it is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Freedom. We're free to do, make this choice. Stand firm then.

You who are trying to be justified by the law have been alienated alienated from Christ. You've fallen away from grace. Meaning if you're trying to earn your salvation so that you can do all these things so that you somehow by God, you've fallen away from grace.

[42:28] But the only thing that counts, again, Galatians 5, the only thing that counts is faith expressing itself through love.

love. And so our response to the justifying grace is that we are filled with love and it draws us closer and closer in love with God, in love with God's people.

We should desire. And so we have to check our hearts. King Manasseh is sitting in prison and he's humiliated and he actually comes to recognize that he is a sinner and needs grace.

And if you have one of the Bibles with the Apocrypha in it, in 1 Ezra 9, there's actually a prayer of Manasseh written. But King Manasseh confesses his sin and recognizes he does not deserve to be forgiven in any way, shape, or form.

He does not deserve it at all. But he ends his entire prayer by saying, in me, you'll show how kind you are. Although I'm not worthy, you'll save me according to your great mercy.

[43:35] I will praise you continuously all the day of my life. And then he went and he was actually restored back to being a king.

And when he was restored, he didn't just say, okay, that's it, I'm done. All right, I got back what I wanted. He made decisions and he changed and he took down all of the false idols.

He changed and put the temple back in order and he started working on changing the country back around to worshiping God and only God. He changed. See, the question is, if you look back at your life, would you say you're different?

Would you say that the love of Jesus Christ has changed you? It should. I mean, it's not saying that we're perfect. Lord knows no one's perfect.

In fact, if anyone says they're perfect, they're sinning by pride and they're back at the beginning. Okay, so we're not perfect. We are forgiven and that forgiveness draws us closer and as we draw closer, we become more and more in the likeness of Christ.

[44:45] Are we different? If people were to look at our lives, would they say, I know that God dwells in them by how they live? Jesus said in Matthew 7, 6, by their fruits, you'll know them.

So, how are your fruits? Can we see the love of God in it? So, James 2 says, what good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone claims to have faith but has no deeds, can such faith save them?

In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead. But someone will say, you have faith and I have deeds.

Show me your faith without deeds and I will show you my faith by my deeds. You believe there is one God? Good. But even the demons believe that and they shudder.

It's not an intellectual exercise to believe in God. It's a life-changing exercise. And so, far too often when we're doing our dirty laundry and we have all this dirty laundry piling up, people want cheap grace.

[45:58] Cheap grace meaning I want to be forgiven and I don't want to do anything about it. I actually had a girl in college and she, her parents went away for a long time, like a month or something, and they never taught her how to do laundry.

And they made the mistake of giving her a credit card. And so, instead of doing laundry, every time she had dirty clothes, she went out and bought more. And so, a couple times a week she was going to the store and buying new underwear and buying new socks and buying new stuff.

And in the meantime, dirty laundry is piling up and piling up and piling up. And that's far too often the case with Christians and their grace.

They want it to be cheap grace. They want to look good on the outside. You know, I'm not going to deal with any of that stuff. I'm going to let it pile up. And I'm going to look like I have clean clothes on because I do.

You know, I'm just going to try and rotate it out. But the reality is that our lives, in our lives, we got a big, messy, stinky pile of clothes that is just growing and growing and growing.

[47:07] At some point, we have to deal with it. But too often, we say we love God and we don't. There's a Peanuts cartoon that I think shows this. Dear sweetheart, I think of you day and night and night and day.

You are more precious to me than anything in the world. Supper time. Oh, there it goes. Just throw it all away. Yeah, I love God so much.

Well, unless there's something better going on. We do that a lot, actually. You know, what do we do? How do we know? What keeps us from doing it?

Well, typically, I've found that the thing that keeps us from actually continuing in our faith journey is that we also create idols just like King Manasseh did.

And our biggest idol is our self. Our self. And we are shallow. We think that it's all about me instead of all about God. The other reason, sometimes, we just feel unworthy and we're not accepting God's love or promise.

[48:15] Or perhaps, we're just feeling too guilty and we don't want to believe in the power of the Holy Spirit and accept the power of the Holy Spirit to change us. So I thought I'd share my story and I'll try to do it quickly.

See, my grandparents lived in West Virginia and they were in the hills of West Virginia, like Appalachia, West Virginia.

They had a mountain in their backyard and when you get there, you'd drive these curvy mountain roads with a mountain on this side and a cliff on the other side and I swear no guardrail. Room for one and a half cars.

Absolutely terrifying. I got sick every time we went there. And it was a different world. When I, my grandparents were Southern Baptists and they're right across the creek there was a church there and when I would go there, everything was about God.

Everything. I mean, it was, they had a Jesus mindset. They thought about God. They talked about God. Even when we, the occasional conversation about a soap opera or cute boys came up, it was still kind of centered around God.

[49:21] God was there. And as a little girl, I remember going there and I don't know if it was a planned thing or, or if it's just that they had a lot of revivals but I swear every single time I was there there was a revival going on.

And it was fire and brimstone which should have probably scared the pants off of me but I was drawn to God. And at seven years old I said, I want God. This is cool.

I want God. And my grandmother was thrilled. I wanted to be baptized and my grandmother said, yeah, that's great. And my father said, you know, she's only seven. I, I just think she should wait until she figures it out.

Now every time I would go and we'd visit at, at my grandparents down there, we would visit with my cousins, my cousins Jeannie and Joni and we would actually do Bible time together.

I mean, our fun time was creating forts and doing Bible clubs. I mean, this was what we did. It was a different world. You know, when I would come home, my mother would drop me off at Sunday school but God was just kind of like apart.

[50:23] In fact, in my own mind, I think I believed that God was living in West Virginia because that's when I experienced God. And so, throughout the years, we would do all this stuff with God and at 13 years old, I finally was baptized along with my cousin Joni.

And life goes on and a few years later, I get a phone call from home and my cousin Joni had been in a car wreck.

It had been raining, curvy roads, she lost control and she was in the hospital. And my first thought was, yeah, but she's a Christian so of course she's going to be okay.

I'll say my little prayer. God's going to do what I want because God owes me because I'm a Christian. Right? God does everything we ask for, right? What we want.

And I didn't really think much about it. I just assumed she'd be okay. And she wasn't. She died. 18 years old, she died.

[51:35] And so, because I had a very shallow faith and I wasn't deeply rooted and firmly established, I turned my back on God.

So, get it. God, this wasn't fair, this wasn't right. And I walked away from my faith. And I continued in a shallow journey where I kept feeling God nudging me with his provenient grace but I was just so shallow I wasn't understanding.

So, I was also feeling very alone because as I distanced myself from God, I felt that God didn't love me. That Joni died because God didn't love me.

It's a very selfish, shallow response but it's where I was. But I didn't feel loved by God at all. And I felt guilty.

Incredibly guilty because I had known that my cousin had been driving erratically as a teenager. And although I had talked to her about it, I never did tell her parents.

[52:53] And so, I carried the guilt of her death with me forever. And so, years go on and I'm making some really bad choices. I am not living the way God would want me to live at all.

But God's still working on me and when I finally got engaged to be married, I come home and I'm looking for a church. Now, truth be told, I'm still a real shallow, shallow Christian if that.

Because the only reason I was looking for a church is because I wanted the picture-perfect wedding. Because, you know, if you're going to get married, you've got to have a pastor, right? That's the way the pictures look. And so, I went to church and I found God again.

God touched my heart and I got to the point where I attended every single week and I would go to Bible study and that was my pick-me-up and I delved into Scripture and I went from having a shallow faith to a deep faith.

I went from being guilty to forgiven. I went from being alone to feeling embraced and I went from being shallow to going deep and I was fed.

[54:02] Heart, soul, mind, strength, fed. And as we become more and more fed, as I became more and more fed, you recognize that you are enough, that God loves you just as you are and I was able then to take my ministry and begin to feed.

I know my story is a lot different than most in all the details but I have a suspicion that people have experienced things much like it.

I mean, maybe you've never accepted grace in your heart and I pray that you will stop a hardened heart, open your heart up to God and maybe you're thinking that I'm just too guilty and I couldn't possibly be forgiven but there's no sin that's unforgivable come to God and experience forgiveness and maybe you're feeling alone and distant but I tell you God is there and reaching out to you and if you're feeling distance it's you who moved.

Turn around. Go closer. Grow closer. And maybe you're just recognizing boy, I've been having a really shallow faith and I've been thinking that God is all about me and I pray that you will open up your heart and be filled with God's love and draw closer to God because you love him.

In John 6 Jesus declared I am the bread of life and whoever comes to me will never go hungry. Whoever believes in me will never be thirsty. Whoever comes to me I will never drive away for my father's will is that everyone who looks to the son and believes in him shall have eternal life.
